ORDER:

During the Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Department Demand 2021-2022, the Hon'ble Minister for Agriculture and Farmers Welfare has made the following announcement on the Floor of the Assembly:-

- 2. The Vice Chancellor, Tamil Nadu Agricultural University in his letter read above has stated that presently, agriculture faces many challenges such as (i) low productivity (averaging to 60% of world

- average), (ii) decreasing profitability in farming, (iii) rising quality competitiveness under the pressure of globalization, (iv) poor linkage of farms with the market, (v) low knowledge of input agriculture, (vi) wide gap between lab and land experiments, (vii) low level of mechanization and value addition, (viii) Supply Chain Management and Product Lifecycle Management, (ix) lack of qualified manpower to address the new and emerging challenges and deliver solutions at grassroots level, (x) mounting threat to sustainability arising from depleting quality of natural resources, biotic and abiotic stresses and inefficient use of agro-inputs and (xi) poorly coordinated natural disaster management system.
- 3. In order to sustain, diversify and realize the potential of agriculture sectors, the Vice Chancellor, Tamil Nadu Agricultural University has stated that it is necessary to develop skilled human resources. Agricultural human resource development is a continuous process undertaken by Agricultural Universities. Agricultural Universities impart education in various disciplines of agriculture viz., Agriculture, Agricultural Engineering, Forestry, Horticulture, Veterinary and Animal Husbandry, Dairy Science, Food Technology, Fisheries Science, Agriculture Information Technology, Agri Business Management, etc. It imparts education at the level of diploma, degree, master's and doctoral level.
- 4. The Vice Chancellor, Tamil Nadu Agricultural University has also stated that in Tamil Nadu, agriculture is the most overriding sector in the economy of the State. Around 70 percent of the State's population is involved in agricultural activities as this is one of the major means of in Tamil Nadu. Tamil Nadu occupies 1.3 lakh square kilo metres with an overall area of around 63 lakh hectares for plantation. The primary responsibility of the Government of Tamil Nadu is to activate stability in the agricultural sector and also increase the sustainability in the agricultural production of the State. This is done with an objective to meet the demands putforth by the growing population in the food segment as well as the raw material demand in the agro-based industries. Agriculture in Tamil Nadu has executed a creditable performance over the years with the help of so many efficient farmers who are both responsive and receptive to the technological development introduced in the agricultural sector of Tamil Nadu.
- 5. To further strengthen the initiatives, it is proposed to establish an Agricultural College and Research Institute at Chettinad in Sivagangai District with the following objectives:-
 - Imparting Agricultural Education to the more aspiring students;
 - ii) Transferring of Agricultural Technologies in effective manner in Sivagangai District;

- iii) Facilitating access to professional education by underprivileged students; and
- iv) Providing affordable and quality agricultural education in an inexpensive manner.
 - 6. The justifications are as follows:-

The proposed Agricultural College will immensely help the aspiring students from the district of Sivagangai to gain agricultural education. The students will form a niche of agricultural graduates to transfer the agricultural technologies to the farming community of the District and the State. The agricultural graduates will help in sustaining the agricultural production, productivity and sustain the agriculture in a better way.

- 8. The Vice Chancellor, Tamil Nadu Agricultural University has further stated that as establishment of a full fledged Agricultural College and Research Institute requires about Rs.120.31 crore over a period of 2-3 years, a separate Detailed Project Report (DPR) will be sent after identifying the suitable land, obtaining Government Order for establishment of the college and based on the initial allotment of first year students for the academic year 2021 2022.
- 9. The Government, after careful examination on the proposal of the Vice Chancellor, Tamil Nadu Agricultural University hereby issues the following orders:-
 - (i) Administrative approval is accorded for "Establishment of new Agricultural College and Research Institute at Chettinad, Sivagangai District" from the academic year 2021 – 2022;

(ii) Financial sanction is accorded for initial payment for a sum of Rs. 2.00 crore (Rupees Two crore only) towards the infrastructure requirements for the new Agricultural College and Research Institute at Chettinad, Sivagangai District as per the following break up details:-

- (iv) The fund requirement for the 9 new posts created as indicated at item (iii) above shall be considered while sanctioning Grant to Tamil Nadu Agricultural University in the fourth quarter of Financial Year 2021-2022.
- 10. The Government also directs that sanction of Rs.671.38 lakh required for construction of building for new Agricultural College and Research Institute at Chettinad, Sivagangai District shall be examined separately after acquisition of land for the College and detailed estimates.

11. The expenditure sanctioned in para 9(ii) above shall be debited under the following head of account:-

2415-Agricultural Research and Education-01 Crop Husbandry – 120 Assistance to Other Institutions - State's Expenditure – AK Grants to Tamil Nadu Agricultural University to establish Agricultural/Horticultural Colleges and Research Institutions 309 Grants-in-Aid-03 Grants for Specific Schemes.

- 12. The Director of Agriculture is the Estimating, Reconciling and Controlling authority to the above new Head of Account. The Pay and Accounts Officer/Treasury Officers concerned is requested to open the above new Head of Account in their records.
- 13. The expenditure sanctioned in para 9(ii) above constitutes an item of "New Instrument of Service". The approval of the Legislature shall be obtained in due course. Pending approval of the Legislature, the expenditure may be initially met by drawal of an advance from the contingency fund. The Registrar, Tamil Nadu Agricultural University is directed to calculate the actual amount required for the period upto next Supplementary Estimates and apply for sanction of the same as advance from the Contingency Fund to Finance (BG-I) Department directly in Form "A" appended to the Tamil Nadu Contingency Rules 1963 along with a copy of this order. Orders for sanction of an advance from the Contingency Fund will be issued from Finance (BG-I) Department. The Registrar, Tamil Nadu Agricultural University is also requested to send necessary draft explanatory notes for inclusion of this expenditure in the Supplementary Estimate for the year 2021-2022 to Finance (BG-I/Agri) Department at an appropriate time without fail.
- 14. The Joint Director of Agriculture, Coimbatore is authorized to draw the amount sanctioned in para 9(ii) above and disburse the same to the Tamil Nadu Agricultural University, Coimbatore.
- 15. The Registrar, Tamil Nadu Agricultural University is directed to follow the existing Financial Procedures/ Government Orders while incurring the expenditure sanctioned in para 9(ii) above.
- 16. The Registrar, Tamil Nadu Agricultural University is also directed to take immediate action to identify the land required for the College and to send detailed proposal requesting sanction of funds along with Detailed Project Report / detailed estimates for construction of buildings to the new Agricultural College and Research Institute at Chettinad, Sivagangai District.

- 17. The Registrar, Tamil Nadu Agricultural University is further directed to include the fund requirement for the new 9 posts created vide para 9(iii) above in the proposal requesting for sanction of Grant to Tamil Nadu Agricultural University for the 4th quarter of financial year 2021-2022 as ordered in para 9(iv) above.
- 18) This order issues with the concurrence of Finance Department vide its C.No.224 JS(GKT)/Agri. &FW/2021, dated: 11.12.2021 and ASL No. 1140 (One thousand one hundred and forty)
