ORDER:

The Hon'ble Minister for Agriculture- Farmers Welfare has made the following announcements during the Agriculture Budget Speech 2023-2024 and in Demand for Agriculture – Farmers Welfare Department:

Agriculture Budget Speech 2023-2024

"It is proposed to get Geographical Indication (GI) for another ten products viz., Krishnagiri Arasampatti Coconut, Krishnagiri Panneer Rose, Thanjavur Peravoorani Coconut, Mulanoor Kuttai Moringa, Sattur Cucumber, Thanjavur Veeramangudi Jaggery (Achu Vellam), Thoothukudi Vilathikulam Chilli, Cuddalore Kotimulai Brinjal, Madurai Sengarumbu and Sivagangai Karupukavuni Rice at an outlay of Rs.30 lakh in the ensuing year"

Demand Announcement:

"In 2023-24, an amount of Rs. 15 Lakh will be allocated for Getting Geographical Indication(GI) for 5 traditional agriculture products viz., Kanniyakumari Aandarkulam Kathiri, Virudhunagar Adhalaikkai, Tindivanam Panipayaru, Karur Sengal thuvarai, Javaadhumalai Samai".

2. In the letter read above, the Chief Executive Officer, Tamil Nadu State Agricultural Marketing Board, in his proposal, has stated the benefits of Geographical Indication Tagging and it's importance as follows:

Benefits of GI Tagging

(i) Enhances Economic Growth:

The protection of geographical indications leads to the overall economic prosperity of the manufacturers and producers. Furthermore, the marketing and promotion of the products with the GI tags enhance the secondary economic activities in that specific region, which in turn boosts the regional economic development. Last but not the least, the protection of geographical indications creates a positive image and reputation of the product in the minds of the consumers and rewards the producers with incentives and better Return on Investment (ROI).

(ii) Prevents unauthorized use of GI tags:

The registered holder of the GI tag has all the legal rights to prevent anyone who are not belonging to the GI region to use their GI tags. The owners can also initiate legal proceedings against the unauthorized user to save their reputation from being damaged.

(iii) Expands Business:

The prime purpose of registering a geographical indication is to seek protection for specific products produced in a particular geographical region, which further encourages and motivates the marketers to expand their business at a global level. Furthermore, the protection of geographical indications will boost export and helps the producers for better economic realization.

Importance of GI Tagging:

Though various Agricultural commodities are being produced in various parts of the world, the commodities produced in a particular place/ locations are unique in nature because of its taste and quality. GI Tagging is given for such unique products which are specific to an area / district. Marketing of commodities with such a GI Tag will increase its demand and export value.

Some of the commodities like "Panruti Jack" have gained geographical importance because of the area in which it is grown. There is a possibility to increase the export opportunities and income realization by the farmers through Geographical Indication tag.

3. The Chief Executive Officer, Tamil Nadu State Agricultural Marketing Board has also informed that agricultural products such as Eathamozhi Tall coconut, Virupakshi hill banana, Madurai Malli, Erode Turmeric, Kodaikanal Malai Poondu have already secured their GI tagging and now it is proposed to get Geographical Indication for the following 15 potential products of the State at a total financial outlay of Rs.45.00 lakh by utilizing the Market Development Fund of Tamil Nadu State Agricultural Marketing Board:

The Chief Executive Officer, Tamil Nadu State Agricultural Marketing Board has also informed that this Project will be implemented by Tamil Nadu State Agricultural Marketing Board in coordination with NABARD - Madurai Agri Business Incubation Forum (NABARD-MABIF) which provides incubation support to aspiring entrepreneurs and bridges the value chain gap between the FPOs and Start ups. Under the MSME Intellectual Property Facilitation Centre Scheme, NABARD- MABIF provides IP services and facilitates for getting GIs, Patents and Trademarks. MABIF acted as a facilitator for 10 Agriculture GIs all over Tamil Nadu and completed the filing under the project of Tamil Nadu State Agricultural marketing Board. The Deputy Director of Agriculture (Agri Business) of the respective districts will assist NABARD-MABIF in identifying Producer associations and collection of

documents. The Chief Executive Officer, Tamil Nadu State Agricultural Marketing Board will monitor the progress periodically.

Total fund required for getting Geographical Indication (GI) tagging for 15 potential products is Rs. 45 lakh (Rupees Fourty Five Lakh Only) @ Rs. 3 lakh/ product, which is proposed to be met out from Market Development Fund of Tamil Nadu State Agricultural Marketing Board.

6. The Chief Executive Officer, Tamil Nadu State Agricultural Marketing Board has therefore requested the Government to accord permission for getting Geographical Indications for the above mentioned 15 potential products at a total financial outlay of Rs.45.00 lakh by utilizing Market Development Fund of Tamil Nadu State Agricultural Marketing Board.

- 7. The Government after careful examination, accept the proposal of the Director of Agricultural Marketing and Agri Business / Chief Executive Officer, Tamil Nadu State Agricultural Marketing Board and hereby accord permission for getting Geographical Indications for the following 15 potential products at a total financial outlay of Rs.45.00 lakh (Rs.3,00,000/- per product) by utilizing Market Development Fund of Tamil Nadu State Agricultural Marketing Board:

- 9. The Chief Executive Officer, Tamil Nadu State Agricultural Marketing Board is authorized to implement the project in technical coordination with National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development-Madural Agri Business Incubation Forum (NABARD MABIF).

- 10. The Deputy Directors of Agriculture (Agri. Business) of the respective districts are directed to assist National Bank for Agriculture and Rural Development –Madural Agri Business Incubation Forum in identifying producer associations and collection of documents.
- 11. The Chief Executive Officer, Tamil Nadu State Agricultural Marketing Board is ordered to monitor the progress periodically so as to complete the project as per the activity schedule.
