Government e-Marketplace (GeM) – Price comparison for
high value procurement– Instructions – Regarding.

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In the Government order cited, orders have been issued for adopting the on-line Government e-Marketplace (GeM) of Government of India, alongwith its terms and conditions as specified from time to time, as an optional mode of procurement of goods and services by all procurement entities in Government departments and other organizations recognised and supported by the Government.

2. The Government of India has now reported that the GeM has become a robust market place with about 40,000 registered users, more than 31,000 products and 17 services. It has been able to bring the prices of goods and services down by about 15-20% on an average; in some cases,

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the prices have been reduced by even 50% of the prices discounted through traditional markets such as tendering and rate contract. For the low value procurements GeM has been adopted as an optional mode of procurement. The services of GeM can be utilized to ascertain right price and for price comparison of the tendered goods and services in cases of high value procurements in respect of goods and services being offered to public under GeM.

3. I am therefore to request you to compare prices of articles in Government e-Marketplace (GeM), for ascertaining lowest price in while evaluating open tenders for high value procurement of goods and services.
