National Health Mission - Establishment of ten Palliative Care Units in Kanchipuram Coimbatore, Villupuram, Vellore, Thanjavur, Erode, Trichy, Salem, Tirunelveli and Kanniyakumari Districts - Sanctioned – Orders – Issued.

ORDER:

The "Hon'ble Minister for Health, Government of Tamil Nadu has announced in the State Legislative Assembly that pain and Palliative Care units will be set up in 10 Districts."

2. In the Government Order first read above, the Government issued orders for establishment of Pain and Palliative Care Units in 10 Districts from the funds approved under National Health Mission.

3. Now, the Mission Director, State Health Society has stated that in continuation of the above, Government of India has approved establishment of Palliative Care units in 10 (Phase-II) Districts and for mobility support to provide Community based Palliative care services by trained Palliative care staff nurses at the Block level. In Phase-II 2017-18, it was proposed to establish rehabilitation wing in 10 more Districts comprising of Geriatric, Palliative, Stroke, NCD wing, with establishment of the Pain and Palliative care Units in the District Head Quarter's Hospitals in Kanchipuram, Coimbatore, Villupuram, Vellore, Thanjavur, Erode, Trichy, Salem, Tirunelveli and Kanniyakumari Districts. The details of recurring and non recurring expenditure approved in Record of Proceedings are as follows:

5. The Medical officer at the rate of one per district for 10 Districts, may be trained for the Palliative care from the existing cadre since the post of Medical Officer was not approved by the Govt. of India for the year 2017-18. The Mission Director, National Health Mission has stated that to roll out home based care services at 130 blocks in the Phase I districts, utilizing the identified staff nurses from the existing cadre strength with the incentive of Rs.250/- per day for mobility support. Rs 50.70 lakh has been approved for 6 months. The proposal for establishment of rehabilitation wing in 10 Districts comprising of Geriatric, Palliative, Stroke, Non Communicable Disease wing with establishment of the Pain and Palliative care units as approved in Record of Proceedings has been placed before 33rd Executive Committee meeting and it was approved.

6. The Mission Director, National Health Mission has requested Government Orders in this regard.

7. The Government after careful consideration have decided to accept the proposal of the Mission Director, State Health Society and accordingly issue following orders:-

- (i) The Mission Director, National Health Mission is permitted to establish Pain and Palliative Care unit in following 10 Districts in Phase –II under National Health Mission.

- (ii) Sanction is accorded for creation of 13 posts of staff nurses temporarily for a period of one year. The Director Medical and Rural Health Services is permitted to create the above 13 posts of Staff Nurse in the scale of pay in pay minimum posts of Rs. 36,000/- (Level-14 Rs.36,000-1,14,000/-) to the 10 Districts head Quarter's Hospital as detailed below:

- (iii) The Director of Medical and Rural Health Services is permitted to fill up the 13 Posts of Staff Nurse as per the existing procedure (i.e) from the list maintained by Director of Medical and Rural Health Services under the time scale of pay as per policy decisions of the State. Pay and allowances to the incumbents will be drawn through the Treasury.
- (iv) The Mission Director, National Health Mission is permitted to place the 27 posts of Staff Nurse on contract basis as per the National Health Mission norms through Medical Recruitment Board at cost of Rs.7700/- per month with an annual increment of Rs.500/- to the 10 Units as detailed below:-

They will be paid through National Health Mission, State Health Society Tamil Nadu.

- (v) The Mission Director, National Health Mission is permitted to place the 20 Posts of Palliative worker at the rate of 2 per unit through outsourcing through the concerned District Health Society. These staffs will be paid through National Health Mission / State Health Society Tamil Nadu.
- (vi) The Mission Director National Health Mission is requested to ensure that the contractual agreement between the outsourcing agency and State Health Society denies the opportunities of the employees to claim any right for absorption. The Outsourcing Agency must be held responsible for any future litigation.
- (vii) The Mission Director is permitted to roll out the Home based Palliative care services in 130 Blocks in Phase- I 10 districts and funds for incentive at the rate of Rs.250/day for mobility support be released to concerned Deputy Director of Health Service from the existing cadre of Staff nurse at the rate of one per block. This shall be incurred from the funds approved under National Health Mission.
- (viii) The Mission Director, National Health Mission is permitted to rationalize the placement of Human Resource to the concerned institution based on the case load.
- (ix) The Mission Director, National Health Mission is permitted to remit the contract salary released under National Health Mission for the regular

time scale of pay posts to the Government under the following Head of Account:-

0211-00- Family Welfare 800- Other Receipts-AN-Receipts under National Rural Health Mission (NRHM).

21-03-Receipts from Central Government –Health and Family Welfare (National Rural Health Mission Construction and Sterilization Programme)

The Salary for the Contractual Staffs shall be paid through the respective District Health Societies.

- (x) The Mission Director, National Health Mission is permitted to take up "Repair and Renovation works" in existing buildings in 10 institutions mentioned in para 7 (i) for establishment of Pain and Palliative Care Units at the rate of Rs. 15,00,000/- per institution, through Public Works Department. accordingly sanction is accorded for a sum of Rs. 1,50,00,000/- (Rupees one crore fifty lakh only) for the above purpose.

- (xi) The Mission Director, State Health Society Tamil Nadu is directed to remit the amount approved towards civil work under National Health Mission as per the existing procedure under the following Head of Account:-

- (xii) The Engineer in Chief and Chief Engineer (Building), Public Works Department, Chepauk, Chennai shall be permitted to issue order to the Executive Engineer of concerned Division for the drawal of funds.

9. The expenditure towards the salary of Posts sanctioned in para 7(ii) above shall constitute an item of 'New Instrument of Service' and the approval of Legislature will be obtained in due course. Pending approval of the Legislature, the expenditure will initially be met by an advance from the contingency fund and orders regarding which will be issued by the Finance (BG-I) Department. The Director of Medical and Rural Health Services, is directed to send application in the prescribed form along with the copy of this order to Finance (BG-I) Department for sanctioning the advance. The Director of Medical and Rural Health Services is also directed to send necessary note for inclusion of the expenditure in the supplementary estimate for 2018-2019 to obtain approval of the Legislative Assembly, to the Finance (BG-I) Department at the appropriate time.
