

COVID -19 – Permission to the Director of Medical Education to engage Medical Officers, Lab Technician and Multi Purpose Health Workers on outsourcing basis to the Government Medical Institutions in Tamil Nadu for a period of three months – Granted – Orders – Issued.

## ORDER:

The Mission Director, National Health Mission in his letter first read above has stated that, the Director of Medical Education has informed that more number of COVID-19 patients are being admitted in the Government Medical College Hospitals due to increasing suspected cases and requested to sanction certain additional human resources to meet the increased test load in the Government medical College hospitals. Considering the request made by the Director of Medical Education, the Mission Director, National Health Mission has approved the following posts for 38 COVID-19 centres on outsourcing basis for a period of three months by following the codal procedures.

The Mission Director has further informed that, the sanctioned amount will be released to Director of Medical Education only after placing the additional human resources as per actual need and submission of payment claim with due verification of attendance of the engaged staff by the Director of Medical Education every month before 3<sup>rd</sup> of the month for 3 months. The payment claimed by Director of Medical Education will be released by National Health Mission in two working dates every month from the receipt of the claim.

2. The Director of Medical Education in his letter 2<sup>nd</sup> read above has informed that, the above information has been communicated to all the 38 COVID centres to engage the additional human resources sanctioned by the National Health Mission as per norms on contract basis. Now, it is ascertained that many of the Doctors are reluctant to take up this appointment in the COVID-19 Pandemic situation due to very low pay offered to them and hence in the approved COVID centres the Medical Officers post could not be filled up

through outsourcing as the consolidated pay is very meager. Further, the Lab Technician and Multi Purpose Health Worker posts also could not be filled up by the Institutions due to very low consolidated pay. In view of the circumstances explained above, the Director of Medical Education has requested the Government to enhance the present consolidated pay of Medical Officers from Rs.40,000/- to Rs.60,000/- per month / person, Lab Technician from Rs.10,000/- to Rs.12,000/- per month / person and Multi Purpose Health worker from 6000/- to Rs.12,000/- so as to fill up the above post through the outsourcing.

3. The Director of Medical Education has requested to fix the pay for the post of Lab Technician and Multi Purpose Health Worker as Rs.12,000/-. During the discussion held on 3.6.2020 under the chairmanship of the Hon'ble Minister for Health and Family Welfare, it has been decided to fix the pay for the post of Lab Technician (on outsourcing basis) as 15,000/-, since the pay for the outsourcing Multi Purpose Health Workers was fixed as 12,000/-. Hence, the expenditure involved in this proposal is as detailed below:

- 4. Out of the overall expenditure involved in this proposal, the Mission Director, National Health Mission has accepted to release an amount of Rs. 11,28,90,000/- only. The remaining amount of Rs. 6,75,15,000/- will have to be met from the State Fund.
- 5. The Government after careful consideration have decided to accept the proposal of the Director of Medical Education and issue orders on the following:
  - i. The Director of Medical Education is permitted to engage the following human resources for 38 COVID-19 centres in the Government Medical Institutions through outsourcing for a period of three months (from the date of filling up of the post) as per the rules and regulations in force.

ii. The Mission Director, National Health Mission is requested to release the required amount to Director of Medical Education, subject to maximum of the total amount of Rs.11,28,90,000/-(for 3 months), after due verification of attendance of the engaged staff by the Director of Medical Education every month before 3<sup>rd</sup> of the month for Three months.

- iii. The Director of Medical Education is directed to release the fund to the concerned institutions within two working dates every month from the receipt of the claim.
- iv. Balance amount of Rs.6,75,15,000/- (Rupees Six crore seventy five lakh and fifteen thousand only) will be released from State Fund.
- 6. The expenditure sanctioned in para 5 above, shall be debited to the following head of account:-

2210 Medical and Public Health – 01 Urban Health Services – Allopathy – 110 Hospitals and Dispensaries – State's Expenditure – AW Improvements to Teaching Hospitals 333 – Payments for Professional and Special Services 04-Contract Payment.

- 7. Necessary funds of Rs.6,75,15,000/- will be provided in RE/FMA 2020-21, pending provision of such funds in RE/FMA 2020-21, the Director of Medical Education is authorized to draw and disburse the amount sanctioned in para 5 above. However, this expenditure shall be brought to the notice of the legislature by Specific Inclusion in the Supplementary Estimates 2020-21. The Director of Medical Education is also requested to include this expenditure while sending the budget proposals for RE/FMA 2020-21 and draft explanatory notes for Supplementary Estimates 2020-21 to Government in Finance (BG-I) Department without fail and on appropriate time.
- 8. This order issues with the concurrence of Finance Department vide its U.O.No.187/JS(MA)/Health-II/2020 , dated: 9.6.2020 and ASL No.130 (One Hundred Thirty).
