ORDER:

The Trustee, UIT Educational Trust, Peelamedu, Coimbatore District has requested the Government to grant permission to start two years D.Pharm course in the name and style as "United College of Pharmacy, Periyanaickenpalayam, Coimbatore District" with an annual intake of 60 seats.

2. In Government letter fourth read above, the Director of Medical Education was requested to conduct an inspection on the premises of the Trust for considering their request. Accordingly, the Director of Medical Education has constituted an inspection team to verify as to whether the proposed pharmacy college has fulfilled the conditions prescribed by the

Government in the Government Orders first to third read above and as per the norms of the Pharmacy Council of India, New Delhi.

- 3. In his letter fifth read above, the Director of Medical Education has submitted the proposal stating that the said institution has fulfilled the norms prescribed by the Government as well as by the Pharmacy Council of India, New Delhi and recommended to grant permission to the Trustee, UIT Educational Trust, Peelamedu, Coimbatore District to start two years D.Pharm course in the name and style as "United College of Pharmacy, Periyanaickenpalayam, Coimbatore District" with an annual intake of 60 seats from the academic year 2020-2021.
- 4. The Government examined the case in detail in the light of the Inspection Report and the recommendation of the Director of Medical Education and grant permission to the Trustee, UIT Educational Trust, Peelamedu, Coimbatore District to start two years D.Pharmacy course with an annual intake of 60 (sixty) students in the name and style as "United College of Pharmacy" in S.F.No. 829, No.2, Gudalur Town Panchayat, Peiyanaickenpalayam, Coimbatore District 641 020 from the academic year 2020-2021, subject to the following conditions:-
 - Admission of students shall be made as per the rules fixed by the Government from time to time;
 - b) Tuition fees including special fees should be collected from the students at the same rates as prescribed by the Government from time to time. The Management should also give separate undertaking stating that NO CAPITATION FEE or any other fund in the name of building fund, etc. will be collected from the students who seek admission in the said pharmacy college.
 - c) The Government have the right to utilize the Endowment fund created by the Trust in meeting the justifiable payment to students that may arise due to non compliance of rules and regulations of the Government by the Trust like winding up of course without valid reasons, etc;
 - d) The Institute so permitted to conduct the course will be allowed to shift / change the study centres only after completion of three years from the date of actual commencement of the course by the first batch of students, after getting orders of Government on re-inspection of the centres.

- The Trust should obtain clearance certificate for Tamil Nadu Pollution Control, Coimbatore before admitting the students. e)
- The Trust should obtain Building Completion Certificate from f) the competent authority.
- The Trust should obtain building plan approval from the Directorate of Town and Country and Planning (DTCP) for g) the proposed pharmacy institution and submit to the Government before admitting the students.
- 5. The Director of Medical Education is directed to take necessary further action accordingly.
