ORDER:

The Hon'ble Chief Minister on the Floor of the Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly has made an announcement under Rule 110 on 07.05.2022 as detailed below:-

"கிராமப்புறங்களில் நிலையங்கள், சுகாதார ஆரம்ப சுகாகார <u> ച്</u>ചതത്ത நிலையங்கள் இருப்பதைப்போல், நகர்ப்புறங்களில் இந்த மருத்துவ நகர்ப்புற மக்கள் அரசுப் பொது அமைய இருக்கின்றன. நிலையங்கள் கூட்டம் மருத்துவமனைகளில் நோக்கி வரும்போது மருத்துவமனையை மூழ்ாவ ஒருங்கிணைந்த தரமான இந்நிலையை அதிகமாகி வருகிறது. அருகிலேயே மக்களின் **இருப்பிடங்களுக்கு** சேவைகளை மருத்துவ வழங்கிடும் நோக்கில் இத்திட்டம் உருவாக்கப்பட்டுள்ளது.

முதற்கட்டமாக பெருநகர சென்னை மாநகராட்சி உள்ளிட்ட 21 மாநகராட்சி மற்றும் 63 நகராட்சி பகுதிகளில் 708 நகர்ப்புற மருத்துவ நிலையங்கள் புதியதாக ஏற்படுத்தப்படும். இந்த மருத்துவ நிலையங்களுக்கு 180 கோடியே 45 இலட்சம் ரூபாய் செலவில் சொந்தக் கட்டடங்கள் கட்டப்படும். இந்த 708 புதிய நகர்ப்புற மருத்துவ நிலையங்களிலும் காலை 8 மணி முதல் 11 மணி வரையும் மாலை 4 மணி முதல் 8 மணி வரையிலும் இரு வேளைகளிலும் புறநோயாளிகள் சேவைகள் செயல்படுத்தப்படும்.

இந்த மையங்களில் ஒரு மருத்துவர், ஒரு செவிலியர், ஒரு மருந்தாளுநர் மற்றும் உதவியாளர் ஆகிய பணியாளர்கள் நியமிக்கப்படுவார்கள். இந்தத் திட்டத்தின் மூலமாக தமிழ்நாட்டில் உள்ள அணைத்து நகர்ப்புற மருத்துவ நிலையங்களிலும் காலையும் மாலையும் ஏழை எளியோருக்கு இலவச மருத்துவ சேவைகள் கிடைப்பதை உறுதி செய்து 2030 ஆம் ஆண்டிற்குள் அணைவருக்கும் நல்வாழ்வு எனும் இலக்கிணை தமிழ்நாடு எட்டும்".

- 2. The Mission Director, National Health Mission in his letter 2nd read above has stated that, an amount of Rs.148.25 crore were released to Commissioner of Municipal Administration and Greater Chennai Corporation towards the Civil Works for Urban-Health and Wellness Centers (U-HWCs) by the Mission Director, National Health Mission vide his proceedings No.5814/P10/NHM/ 2021, dated: 22.11.2021. The location of the Urban-Health and Wellness Center is the single most important factor in determining the success of the scheme. Hence, while selecting the place for construction the following issues should be duly taken note of, based on the requirement of Public, especially poor and needy.
 - a) The location for establishing Urban-Health and Wellness Centers shall be closer in proximity to the habitats housing slum, vulnerable and middle-income population.
 - b) In urban localities the availability of land may be a challenge in some cases, where land is not available at a central location, it would be preferable to rent Government buildings / Tamil Nadu Urban Habitat constructed buildings / Urban Local Bodies buildings to accommodate the proposed Urban-Health and Wellness Centers within the habitation so that people access them easily.
 - c) The Urban-Health and Wellness Centers should not be constructed in areas away from habitation, just because land is available there.
 - d) Construction of Urban-Health and Wellness Centres by encroaching road and Public facilities should not be done.
 - e) The support of the Tamil Nadu Urban Habitat Development Board may be obtained for locating Health and Wellness Center inside/Near of their tenements.
 - 3. The Government, after detailed examination have issued orders on the following:-
 - The Committees comprising of the following members have constituted to inspect the places identified for the establishment of 708 Urban-Health and Wellness Centers in Greater Chennai Corporation, other corporations and municipalities duly taking account of the points mentioned at para 2 above.
