ORDER:

The Chairperson and Managing Trustee, Tagore Educational Trust, Chennai has requested the Government to grant permission to start four years B.Pharm course with an annual intake of 60 students in the name and style as “Tagore College of Pharmacy, Chennai” from the academic year 2019-2020.

2. In the Government letter fourth read above, the Director of Medical Education was requested to conduct an inspection in the premises of the Trust for considering their request. Accordingly, the Director of Medical Education has constituted an inspection team to verify, as to whether the proposed College of Pharmacy has fulfilled the conditions prescribed by the Government in the Government Orders first to third read above and the Pharmacy Council of India, New Delhi.

3. The Director of Medical Education has constituted an inspection team to verify, whether the proposed College of Pharmacy fulfills the conditions prescribed by the Government and the Pharmacy Council of India, New Delhi. The Director of Medical Education has submitted the proposal with the Inspection Report / Project Report along with his specific recommendation to the Government and requested to issue necessary orders.

4. In his letter fifth read above, the Director of Medical Education has submitted the proposal in which he has stated that the inspection team has conducted an inspection at the premises and submitted their report by stating that the said institution has fulfilled all the norms prescribed by the Government as well as by the Pharmacy Council of India. Hence, the Director of Medical Education has recommended to permit the Chairperson and Managing Trustee, Tagore Educational Trust, Chennai to start four years B.Pharmacy course with an annual intake of 60 students in the name and style as "Tagore College of Pharmacy, Chennai" from the academic year 2019-2020.

5. The Government have examined the case in detail in the light of the Inspection Report and the recommendations of the Director of Medical Education and grant permission to the Chairperson and Managing Trustee, Tagore Educational Trust, Chennai to start four years B.Pharmacy course with an annual intake of 60 (sixty) students in the name and style as "Tagore College of Pharmacy in S.F. No.165/5A, Vandalur-Kelambakkam Road, Rathinamangalam, Chennai from the academic year 2019-2020. subject to the following conditions:-

- a) Admission of students shall be made as per the rules fixed by the Government from time to time;
- b) Tuition fees including special fees should be collected from the students at the same rates as prescribed by the Government from time to time. The Management should also give separate undertaking stating that NO CAPITATION FEE or any other fund in the name of building fund, etc. will be collected from the students who seek admission in the said pharmacy college.
- c) The Trust should obtain recognition / affiliation from the Pharmacy Council of India and the Tamil Nadu Dr. M.G.R. Medical University respectively before admitting the students;
- d) The Government have the right to utilize the Endowment fund created by the Trust in meeting the justifiable payment to students that may arise due to non compliance of rules and regulations of the Government by the Trust like winding up of course without valid reasons, etc;
- e) The Institution so permitted to conduct the course will be allowed to shift / change the study centres only after completion of three years from the date of actual commencement of the course by the first batch of students, after getting orders of Government on re-inspection of the centres.
- f) The Trust should obtain Clearance Certificate from the State Pollution Control Board before admitting the students.
- g) The Trust should obtain the building completion certificate from the competent authority for the proposed Pharmacy College and submit to the Government before admitting the students.

6. The Director of Medical Education is directed to take necessary further action accordingly.
