ORDER:

The Hon'ble Minister for Health and Family Welfare Department has announced on 14.6.2018 on the floor of Assembly that Eight Staff Nurses will be provided to the Hemoglobinopathy ward in the five Government Medical College Hospitals at a cost of Rs.16 lakh.

- 2. In Government Order first read above, Government have issued necessary orders for implementation of the program "Prevention of Hemoglobinopathies" in 30 blocks of Tamil Nadu. Through this program, unmarried adolescent children above the age of 14 are screened for sickle cell anemia/thalassemia trait in Government /Government aided schools and in Anganwadi centres.
- 3. The Mission Director, National Health Mission has stated that the programme has been implemented in 4 districts as a pilot project and the proportion of children with Hemoglobinopathies trait is found to be around 9 - 12%(Source : monthly reports) Estimated Prevalance of inherited bleeding disorders like Hemophilia A & B, etc., in India is 0.9 /1,00,000 population. (Source: India Journal of Medical Research). Since case detection of such inherited blood disorders is required and requirement of a comprehensive day care centre to treat children already on treatment is essential, Government of India has issued certain guidelines on the issue. Based on the guidelines and reviews by expert teams, it is decided to establish 5 Day Care centres at regional zones to benefit such children requiring frequent blood transfusions due to Thalassemia or Hemophilia and also to establish centres to provide Chelation therapy for hemoglobinopathies. Hemoglobinopathies & Hemophilia are transfusion dependent /clotting factor dependent diseases, resulting in stress and psychological problems not only to the child but to the whole family. Management of thalassemia, Sickle Cell Disease patients and Hemophiliac patients through a Day Care Facility is convenient, economical and provides a supportive environment friendly area for

children with a chronic illness. It helps in better compliance and efficient monitoring of patients.

DAY CARE CENTRE OBJECTIVES

- (i) Day care centre will provide transfusion facility / ward with 10 beds, where transfusion services on daily basis will take place in shifts to accommodate more patients including night shift for working or school going patients.
- (ii) Day care centre in the DEIC /Pediatric Department will have exclusive management protocols for transfusion therapy, transfusion reactions and chelation therapy
- (iii) Trained Pediatrician/Hematologist with nursing staff for treating complications, conducting regular transfusions, monitoring of growth and development and maintenance of records, during the period of blood transfusions with low staff turnover to provide continuity of care will be made available.
- (iv)Exclusive Laboratory Diagnostic kits for conduction of regular tests(serum ferritin, viral markers) for evaluation and monitoring purposes and Provision of Drugs like oral iron chelator drugs
- (v) Day care centre will have recreational facilities to keep children engaged during transfusion / other treatment.
- 4. The Mission Director, National Health Mission has further stated that it has been proposed to establish Comprehensive Day care Treatment centres for Hemoglobinopathies & Hemophilias in the following 5 Government Medical College Hospitals:-
 - 1. Institute of Child Health and Hospital for Children, Government Madras Medical College Hospital, Egmore, Chennai 8 (Nodal Centre)
 - 2. Government Dharmapuri Medical College Hospital, Dharmapuri
 - 3. Government Rajaji Madurai Medical College Hospital, Madurai
 - 4. Government Theni Medical College Hospital, Theni
 - 5. Government Mohan Kumaramangalam Medical College Hospital, Salem

These facilities will be a 6 to 10 bedded day care centre to ensure adequate management and to serve as a baseline of minimum monitoring that is needed for care of these children & to prevent frequent school absenteeism among these children.

 - e) Government Mohan Kumaramangalam Medical College Hospital, Salem

- viii. The Mission Director, State Health Society is permitted to rationalize the placement of Staff Nurses based on the case load.

ix. The Mission Director, State Health Society is permitted to allow concerned Head of Department / Deans of Government Medical College Hospitals to place the services of 5 Hospital workers (MPHW) through Outsourcing mode as per National Health Mission norms as follows:

- x. The Mission Director, National Health Mission is requested to ensure that the contractual agreement between the Outsourcing Agency and State Health Society denies the opportunities of the employees to claim any right for absorption. The Outsourcing Agency will also be held responsible for future litigation.
- 10. The expenditure sanctioned in para 9 (vi) above shall constitute an item of "New Instrument of Service" and the approval of Legislature will be obtained in due course. Pending approval of the Legislature, the expenditure may be initially met by drawal of an advance from the Contingency Fund. The Director of Medical Education is directed to calculate the actual amount required for the period upto next Supplementary Estimates and apply for sanction of the same as advance from the Contingency Fund to Finance (BG.I) Department directly in Form A appended to the Tamil Nadu Contingency Fund Rules 1963 along with a copy of this order. Orders for sanction of an advance from the Contingency Fund will be issued from Finance (BG.I) Department. The Director of Medical Education is requested to send necessary explanatory notes to include the above expenditure in the Supplementary Estimates for the year 2018 19 to Finance (BG-I) Department at the appropriate time without fail.
