ORDER:-

In G.O. first read above the Government among other things directed the Dean, Rajiv Gandhi Government General Hospital, Chennai attached to the Madras Medical College to allocate a sum of Rs.25.00 lakh (Rupees Twenty Five Lakh only) from out of the incentive funds available under the Chief Minister's Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme (CMCHIS) available with the Rajiv Gandhi Government General Hospital, Chennai attached to the Madras Medical College for the purpose of registration, establishment of the society and to provide infrastructure communication and related facilities, till the receipt of funding from the Government of India and also allocate sufficient space for the society.

2. The Dean, Government General Hospital, Chennai-3, in her 2nd read above letter has stated that meeting out all the expenditure incurred for the specialized services for large volume of patients from the Chief Minister Comprehensive Health Scheme only and the funds generated through the CMCHIS is not sufficient for taking care of day to day services for the poor people coming to Government. General Hospital. Hence ,she has stated that she is not in a position to share the funds from CMCHIS for the setting up of the TRANSTAN as per G.O. first read above.

The Convenor, Cadaver Organ Transplant Programme who was requested to indicate the proportion from among the Government hospital to share the funds from among the hospitals doing the transplantation in proportion for "TRANSTAN" to provide infrastructure facilities to TRANSTAN till the receipt of funds from the Government of India as suggested by the Principal Secretary (Finance) during the First Executive Committee meeting of the "TRANSTAN" held on 16.04.2015 has stated two Hospitals, Rajiv Gandhi Government General Hospital and Stanley Hospital benefit from Cadaver Transplant Programme, hence sharing of funds by these two hospital in the proportion of 50% each to provide infrastructure facilities to TRANSTAN till the receipt of funds from the Government of India would be appropriate.
- 4. The Government after careful examination direct the Dean, Rajiv Gandhi Government General Hospital, Chennal and Stanley Hospital, Chennal to share the funds in the proportion of 50% each (Rs. 12.50 takh each) from out of the funds available under the Chief Minister's Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme (CMCHIS) available to provide infrastructure facilities to TRANSTAN till the receipt of funds from Government of India.
