ORDER:-

The Government of India has granted a sum of Rs.533.44 lakh as Grants-in-Aid for upgradation of Regional Geriatric Centre, Madras Medical College / Rajiv Gandhi Government General Hospital, Chennai under National Programme for Health Care of the Elderly. Based on this, the Government of Tamil Nadu in its order first read above have accorded administrative and financial sanction for a sum of Rs.533.44 lakh as Grants-in-Aid to meet out the recurring and non-recurring expenditure for upgradation of Regional Geriatric Centre, Madras Medical College /

Rajiv Gandhi Government General Hospital, Chennai under the National Programme for Health Care of the Elderly are as detailed below:-

The above said total amount has to be sanctioned by the Government of India only, there is no State share is involved in this project. Further, the scheme is ongoing and therefore, as and when the Institution utilized the fund properly, the Government of India will release further more fund for continuing the scheme.

- 2. Accordingly, the Government of India had released a sum of Rs.300.00 Lakh to meet out the non-recurring expenditure and therefore, the Institution has constructed the building and procured the equipment through the Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation Limited at a cost of Rs.200.00 Lakh and Rs.50.00 Lakh, respectively.
- 3. The Director of Medical Education in her letter second read above has stated that the Government of India had released a sum of Rs.50.00 Lakh to meet out the recurring expenditure and the same has been credited into Government account on 04.02.2016. Prior to this, the Government of India had released the entire fund, i.e. Rs.366.87 Lakh, directly to the Institution.
- 4. Meanwhile, the Government of India in their letter fifth read above have conveyed the amount released to the tune of Rs.1.00 Crore to Government of Tamil Nadu for onward transfer to Regional Geriatric Centre, Madras Medical College and Rajiv Gandhi Government General Hospital, Chennai during the financial year 2015 2016 and 2016 2017 as detailed below:-

- 5. The Professor / Head of the Department, Department of Geriatric Medicine, Madras Medical College / Rajiv Gandhi Government General Hospital, Chennai in her letter sixth read above has stated that the Government of India had released a sum of Rs.100.00 Lakh to meet out the recurring expenditure and the same has been credited into Government account on 19.12.2016 and credited into State Government account on 09.01.2017 and she has also requested the Government to release the recurring fund of Rs.1.00 Crore released by the Government of India as Grants-in-Aid to the Regional Geriatric Centre, Madras Medical College / Rajiv Gandhi Government General Hospital, Chennai, so as to enable her to meet the recurring expenditure for paying the salary component to the candidates appointed under the National Programme for Health Care of the Elderly (NPHCE) during the Financial year 2015 2016 and 2016 2017.

The Government after careful examination of the proposal in detail and decided to accord sanction the amount of Rs.1.00 Crore released by the Government of India as the Scheme is implemented and sponsored by the Government of India as Grants-in-Aid to the Regional Geriatric Centre, Madras Medical College / Rajiv Gandhi Government General Hospital, Chennai for meeting the recurring expenditure towards the contractual pay and research activities under the National Programme for Health Care of the Elderly during the financial year 2015 2016 and 2016 2017.

- 8. The Director of Medical Education is Estimating, Reconciling and Controlling Authority for the new head of account at para 7 aove.
- 9. The Pay and Accounts Officers / Treasury Officers concerned are directed to open a new head of account.
- 10. Necessary additional funds Rs.1.00 crore will be provided in the Final Modified Appropriation 2018 2019. Pending provision of such funds in Final Modified Appropriation 2018 2019, the Director of Medical Education is authorized to draw and disburse the amount sanctioned in para 6 above. However, this expenditure shall be brought to the notice of the legislature by specific inclusion in the Supplementary Estimates 2018-2019. The Director of Medical Education is also requested to include this expenditure while sending the budget proposals for Final Modified Appropriation 2018 2019 and draft explanatory notes for Supplementary Estimates 2018 2019 to Government in Finance (BG-I/Health-II) Department, without fail.
