Police – Hon'ble Chief Minister's Announcement during the Budget session on 13.09.2021 – Formation of Marina Beach Life Guard Unit in Chennai – Orders - Issued.

ORDER:-

The Hon'ble Chief Minister has made the announcement in the Floor of assembly on 13.09.2021as below:

"மெரினா கடற்கரையில் பொதுமக்கள் நீரில் மூழ்கி இறக்கும் நிகழ்வுகளைத் தடுக்க சென்னை காவல்துறையில் மெரினா கடற்கரை உயிர்காப்பு பிரிவு (Marina beach Life Guard Unit) ஆரம்பிக்கப்படும். கடலோர காவல்படை ஆய்வாளர் தலைமையில் இயங்கும் இப்பிரிவில் கடலோர குழுமம் மற்றும் தீயணைப்புத்துறை மீட்பு வீரர்களுடன் ஒப்பந்த அடிப்படையில் 12 மீனவர்கள் பணி அமர்த்தப்படுவார்கள்".

2. The Director General of Police/Head of Police Force, Tamil Nadu, Chennai-4 has accordingly sent a proposal for formation of the Marina Beach Life Guard Unit incorporating the existing Rescue Station, and to sanction the following:

(a) Manpower:

The following additional strength is required for formation of a Life Guard Unit under Coastal Security Group:

* The strength may be re-deployed from the existing units.

(b) Tamil Nadu Special Police personnel:

One company of Tamil Nadu Special Police personnel with a minimum strength of 100 Tamil Nadu Special Police personnel may be allotted to Coastal Security Group especially for deployment at Marina Beach under the control of Marina Marine Police Station, Station House Officer to regulate the tourist crowd entering in sea for taking bath / swimming to prevent drowning incidents. This company would be called '**Life Guard Company**' under the operational control of Additional Director General of Police, Coastal Security Group, Chennai and would not be rotated monthly as they would be imparted special training in life saving skills. The rotation of company would defeat the very purpose of deployment.

(c) Recruitment of Life Guards from Fishermen village for rescue duties:

As per the announcement, 8 Life Guards from the fishermen villages having Life Saving skills would be recruited on contract basis at a daily wage of Rs.612/- per day as per the revised rates of wages ordered by the District Collector, Chennai for the year 2021-2022 vide Proceedings of the District Collector, Chennai District in RoC.No.C2/16317/2021, dated 14.07.2021. Accordingly each Life Guards will get Rs.18,360/- per month and the total cost of hiring 8 Life Guards is worked out to Rs.2,20,320/- per month as detailed below:

* Note: The wages would be revised as and when, these are revised by Collector, Chennai.

(d) Mobility:

To ensure the safety of the tourist for quick response to prevent any drowning incidents, the following vehicles may be procured and supplied to Coastal Security Group for deployment at Marina Beach.

(e) Deployment of Boats in Sea:

2 numbers of HDPE Boats, 5 Nos. of Jet Skies supplied under SWADESH DARSHAN Scheme through Tamil Nadu Tourism Development Corporation with Fast Interceptor Boats would be deployed in front of Marina Beach for patrolling near the shore to attend any urgent distressed calls & there is no fresh financial implication in this regard.

(f) CCTV cameras and Watch Towers:

Under the SWADESH DARSHAN Scheme, Tamil Nadu Tourism Development Corporation has allotted 75 CCTV Cameras and 5 Watch Towers to cover the entire stretch of Marina Beach to watch the movement of tourist gathering in Marina Beach. The project of erection work of CCTV cameras in Marine Beach is under process and erection of watch tower at 5 places is yet to be commenced. The Director, Tamil Nadu Tourism Development Corporation has been addressed to complete the project at the earliest. Hence, here also there is no fresh financial implication in this regard.

(g) Communication Equipments:

There is an imperative need of providing communication equipments such as Walkie Talkie (with spare battery pack), Portable Public Address System are required to be provided to the Police personnel deployed in All Terrain Vehicles, Watch Towers and to the rescue teams proposed at 5 points.

(h) Special Equipments:

Marine-Grade Binoculars are required to be provided to the Police personnel deployed in Watch Towers.

(j) **Ambulance Vehicles with Medical team:**

2 numbers of Ambulance (108) with team may be provided near Anna Square and Light House for attending First Aid activities whenever persons are rescued from sea water etc. The ambulance may be equipped with Automated External Defibrillators facility. The Director, Health Department may be directed to provide two Ambulance teams by redeployment. There is no fresh financial implication in this regard.

(k) **Fire and Rescue Team:**

The existing Rescue station sanctioned in G.O.(Ms) No.648, Home (Pol-XVII) Department, dated 15.11.2019 can be included in this unit.

3. The Director General of Police / Head of Police Force has also suggested that the Marina Beach Life Guard Unit may be formed with the following strength:-

This unit may be attached with the Triplicane (also known as Marina) Marine Police Station under the supervision of Inspector of Police, Coastal Security Group, Headquarters, Chennai. The overall administrative and functioning control of Marine Life Guard Unit would be with the Additional Director General of Police, Coastal Security Group, Chennai.

5. The Director General of Police/Head of Police Force has, therefore requested the Government to issue necessary orders for formation of Marina Beach Life Guard Unit.

6. The Government after careful examination, have decided to accept the proposal of the Director General of Police and accord administrative sanction for a sum of Rs.2,60,31,638 (i.e. Recurring expenditure Rs.2,14,57,888/- + Non-Recurring Expenditure Rs.45,73,750/-) for formation of Marina Beach Life Guard Unit with additional strength of 26 Post (i.e. Sub-Inspector - 02, Head Constables-08, Gr-II Police Constables-16) by way of redeployment as detailed in Annexure to this order and Government also accord financial sanction for a sum of Rs.1,60,79,008/- (Rupees one crore sixty lakh seventy nine thousand and eight only) (i.e. Recurring Expenditure Rs.1,43,05,258/- + Non-Recurring Expenditure Rs.17,73,750/-)

7. The expenditure sanctioned in para 6 above shall be debited under the following head of account.

8. The unit shall be attached with the Triplicane (also known as Marina) Marine Police Station under the supervision of Inspector of Police, Coastal Security Group, Headquarters, Chennai. The overall administrative and functioning control of Marine Life Guard Unit would be with the Additional Director General of Police, Coastal Security Group, Chennai. The Director General of Police is directed to send necessary proposal to Government for finances towards purchase of vehicles after completion of purchase procedure. The Director General of Police is also directed that

necessary purchase procedure be followed for purchase of equipment and kits and vehicles.

9. The expenditure sanctioned in para-6 above shall constitute an item of "**New Instrument of Service**" and the approval of the Legislature shall be obtained in due course of time by an inclusion in the Supplementary Estimates 2022-2023. Pending approval of the Legislature, the expenditure may be initially met by drawl of an advance from the Contingency Fund. The Director General of Police, Chennai is requested to calculate the actual amount required for the period up to next supplementary Estimates and apply for sanction of the same as advance from the Contingency Fund to Finance (BG-I) Department directly in Form "A" appended to the Contingency Fund Rules, 1963 along with a copy of this order. Orders for sanction of an advance from the Contingency Fund will be issued from Finance (BG-I) Department. The Director General of Police, Chennai shall also send necessary draft explanatory notes for inclusion of this expenditure in the Supplementary Estimates for the year 2022-2023, to Finance (BG-I/Home-I) Department without fail.
