ORDER:-

The Hon'ble Chief Minister on the Floor of Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly while replying to the Demand for Police Department on 13.09.2021 has announced as follows:

“சமூகத்திலும் பொருளாதாரத்திலும் பின்தங்கிய சிறுவர் மற்றும் சிறுமியர் தவறான வழியிலும் எந்த குற்றச் செயலிலும் ஈடுபடாமல் இருக்க சிறுவர் சிறுமியர் மன்றம் ஏற்படுத்தப்பட்டு, இவை அவர்களை நல்வழிப்படுத்தவும், உரிய கல்வி உதவி அளிக்கவும் ரூபாய் 38.25 இலட்சம் செலவில் 51 சிறார் மன்றங்கள் (Boys and Girls Club) உருவாக்கப்படும்”.

2. Based on the announcement, the Director General of Police has forwarded the detailed proposal of the Commissioner of Police, Greater Chennai Police, in which he has stated that,

- The Police Boys Clubs were started in the year 2003 as per G.O.(Ms) No.578, Home (Pol.XIII) Department, dated 27.06.2003 in Tamil Nadu as a strategy for crime prevention and as a method of prevention of children becoming criminals. At present, there are 60 Police Boys and Girls Clubs functioning in Chennai City in areas where people live under poor economic conditions and slum in nature. The primary objective of the clubs is to engage the children in constructive activities like sports and literary works, so that the opportunities for them to come in contact

with the anti-social elements and criminals during the evening hours, when they are free, are reduced.

- The underlying logic of involving the children in sports is that by instinct children get attached to Police Boys and Girls Clubs as sports and reading facilities are provided to them. The activities of the clubs are facilitated by a Scout Master and a Care Taker and they are paid with an honorarium of Rs.2,500/- (Rupees two thousand and five hundred only) and Rs,1,500/- (Rupees one thousand and five hundred only) respectively per month.
- By considering the economic importance of North Chennai in terms of industries and trade activities, the Joint Commissioner of Police, North Zone, Greater Chennai Police, has requested to sanction 32 new Police Boys & Girls Clubs in places in North Zone, Greater Chennai Police and also requested to sanction a sum of Rs.24,00,000/- (Rupees twenty four lakhs only) additionally as recurring expenditure for paying remuneration, etc.
- The Commissioner of Police, Greater Chennai Police has informed that the Crime data reveal that many juvenile accused involved in commission of different crimes and there are many other adult criminals, who had developed criminal bent of mind during their childhood, as they come in contact with the criminal elements. As far as Chennai City is concerned, there are many slums or slum clearance housing boards or housing board settlements, which need the services of Police Boys & Girls Clubs, Considering the facts mentioned above and circumstances, after extensive analysis, 51 places have been identified for new Boys and Girls Clubs in Chennai City.

3. The Commissioner of Police, Greater Chennai Police has therefore requested to accord sanction for 51 new Police Boys & Girls Clubs in Chennai City (North Zone (32), West Zone (06), East Zone (02) and South Zone (11)) and financial sanction for a sum of Rs.38,25,000/- (Rupees thirty eight lakhs and twenty five thousand only) as recurring expenditure, as per G.O.Ms.No.147, Home (Pol. XIII) Department, dated 17.02.2012, to run new Boys & Girls Clubs in Chennai City.

4. The Director General of Police, Chennai has therefore requested administrative and financial sanction for formation of 51 new Police Boys & Girls Clubs in places in Chennai City (East, West, North and South Zones) and to sanction a sum of Rs.38,25,000/- additionally as recurring expenditure, based on the announcement of Hon'ble Chief Minister.

5. After careful examination, the Government have decided to accept the proposal of the Director General of Police. Accordingly, the Government hereby

accord sanction for creation of 51 new Police Boys and Girls Clubs in Chennai City (East, West, North and South Zones) as mentioned in Annexure-I to this order and sanction Rs.38,25,000/- (Rupees thirty eight lakhs and twenty five thousand only) as Recurring expenditure, as detailed in the Annexure-II to this order. The Government also accord additional sanction for a sum at Rs.15,93,750/- (Rupees Fifteen lakh ninety three thousand seven hundred and fifty only) for the year 2021-2022.

6. The expenditure sanctioned above shall be debited under the following Heads of Account:-

7. The expenditure sanctioned in Para 5 above shall constitute an item of "New Instrument of Service" and the approval of the Legislature shall be obtained in due course of time by an inclusion in the Supplementary Estimates 2021-2022. Pending approval of the Legislature, the expenditure may be initially met by drawal of an advance from the Contingency Fund. The Commissioner of Police, Chennai is directed to calculate the actual amount required for the period up to next Supplementary Estimates and apply for sanction of the same as advance from the Contingency Fund to Finance (BG.I) Department directly in Form 'A' appended to the Tamil Nadu Contingency Fund Rules, 1963 along with a copy of this order. Orders for sanction of an advance from the contingency Fund will be issued from Finance (BG.I) Department. The Commissioner of Police, Chennai shall also send necessary draft explanatory

notes for inclusion of this expenditure in the Supplementary Estimates for the year 2021-2022, without fail.

8. This order issues with the concurrence of Finance Department vide its U.O.No.50155/Home-I/2021, dated 17.11.2021 and Additional Sanction Ledger No.850 (Eight hundred and fifty)
