



ABSTRACT

Highways Department – Project Wing – Announcement made by the Hon'ble Chief Minister on 15.07.2019 during Budget Demand for Highways and Minor Ports Department – Administrative sanction for Land Acquisition for an amount of Rs.6.15 Crores along with change in Nomenclature of the work as “Formation of Bye-pass to Bodinayakanur Town from Anaikaraipatty Vilakku at Km 197/2 of NH-85 to B.Dharmathupatty at Km 27/10 of SH-100 (Km 0/0 – 3/8)” – Orders – Issued.

ORDER:

In Government Order first read above, among others, orders were issued according administrative sanction for preparation of Detailed Project Report for the work of “Formation of bye-pass to Bodinayakanur town from Anaikaraipatty Vilakku at Km 196/4 of NH-85 to B.Dharmathupatty at Km 27/10 of SH-100 (Km 0/0-5/0)” for an amount of Rs.20.00 Lakhs.

2) The Chief Engineer (Projects), Highways Department in his letter 2nd read above has stated that Bodinayakanur is the second largest town in Theni District. There are number of Textile mills, Rice Mills, Dairy and Food factory, spices Board and Weekly market etc., located in and around bodinayakanur town and the traffic intensity is increased day after day and the traffic is congested along the built up area of Bodinayakanur town which leads to enormous time delay for the vehicular traffic.

3) The Chief Engineer (Projects), Highways Department has further stated that Cochin – Munnar – Bodinayakanur – Theni – Madurai is an important National Highway NH-85 running through the bodinayakanur town covering many towns and villages. This road leads to Suruli Falls, Munnar, which are important tourist destinations in Western Ghats. Hindu pilgrimage centres such as Kuchanur, Veerapandi etc are also located here. Many Educational Institutions like Schools, Polytechnics, Arts and Government Engineering Colleges are located in bodinayakanur and hence the formation of Bye-pass to bodinayakanur town is very much essential to promote free flow of traffic. The Villages such as Bodinayakanur, Meenatchipuram, Melachokanathapuram, Anaikaraipatty, B.Dharmathupattu, Meenavalaku etc will be benefitted on construction of the above byepass.

4) The Chief Engineer (Projects), Highways Department has further stated that the alignment of the proposed bye-pass has been approved by the alignment committee on 18.09.2020. The approved Alignment for the Bye-pass starts at Akkaraipatty Vilaku (Km 197/2 of NH 85 - Madurai cochin Road), passes through Bodinayakanur, B.Meenatchipuram, Melachokkanathapuram villages and ends at Km 27/10 of SH100 (Palayam – Bodi Road) for a total length of 3.668 Km and has requested change in nomenclature as follows:

5) The Chief Engineer (Projects), Highways Department has further stated that ROW of 30.00 m width is proposed to be acquired for the above Bye-pass. The land acquisition for the Bye-pass falls on Bodinayakanur, Meenatchipuram, Melachokanathapuram Villages. The total extent of land required for the formation of above Bye-pass is 112731.22 Sq.m (Acquisition – 99145.52 Sq.m & Alienation – 13585.70 Sq.m). For this work, the LPS was prepared and submitted to DRO, Theni on 31.10.2020.

6) The Chief Engineer (Projects), Highways Department has further stated that necessary compensation for acquiring lands, structures, trees any other assets attached have to be paid for project affected person as per latest prevailing land acquisition rules and acts. Accordingly, the land acquisition estimate has now been prepared for an amount of Rs.6.15 Crores for payment towards compensation as per latest rules in force.

7) The Chief Engineer (Projects), Highways Department has therefore requested the orders of the Government to accord Administrative Sanction for Land Acquisition for an amount of Rs.6.15 Crores along with change in nomenclature as "Formation of Bye-pass to Bodinayakanur Town from Anaikaraipatty Vilakku at Km 197/2 of NH85 to B.Dharmathupatty at Km 27/10 of SH-100 (Km 0/0 – 3/8)".

8) The Government after careful examination accept the proposal of the Chief Engineer (Projects), Highways Department and accord administrative sanction for Land Acquisition for an amount of Rs. 6.15 Crores (Rupees Six Crore and Fifteen Lakhs Only) along with change in Nomenclature of the work as "Formation of Bye-pass to Bodinayakanur Town from Anaikaraipatty Vilakku at Km 197/2 of NH85 to B.Dharmathupatty at Km 27/10 of SH-100 (Km 0/0 – 3/8)".

9) The expenditure sanctioned in para 8 above shall be debited under the following head of account:-

“5054 – Capital Outlay on Roads and Bridges – 03.State Highways – 337.Road Works – State’s Expenditure – JO. Comprehensive Road Infrastructure Development Programme (CRIDP) – Formation of Bye-Passes – 464.Lands – 01.Lands – Voted”.

10) The Chief Engineer (Projects), Highways Department is authorized to incur the expenditure sanctioned in para 8 above.

11) The expenditure sanctioned in Para 8 above shall constitute an item of “New Instrument of Service” and approval of the Legislature will be obtained in due course. The Chief Engineer (Projects), Highways Department is also directed to send a draft explanatory notes for inclusion of the above expenditure in the Supplementary Estimates 2020-2021 to Finance (BG-I) Department without fail.
