ORDER:

In the letter first read above, MD, CEMCOT informed that four Common Effluent Treatment Plants (CETPs) under CEMCOT have come up with proposals to expand /

upgrade/ introduce ne	technology. The	he details are	as under:

In this regard, he requested the Government to contribute at least 15% (Rs.38.71 crores) of the total project cost (Rs.258.10 crores) as had been done earlier to help the industry to tide over the costs.

- 2. Accordingly, in the G.O. second read above, administrative sanction was accorded for a sum of Rs.38.71 crores, being 15% of the total project cost of Rs.258.10 crores as State Government's contribution to CEMCOT to expand/ upgrade/ introduce new technology in the four CETPs mentioned in para 1 above and the Managing Director, CEMCOT was requested to send proposal for release funds, after release of corresponding funds (70% of the project cost) from the Government of India.
- 3. As per the details furnished by CEMCOT, the project costs of the 4 ZLD projects of CEMCOT approved by DPIIT, the Government of India's contribution and State Government's contribution are as follows:-

4. After release of corresponding funds by Government of India, based on the request of CEMCOT, in the G.O. third to eleventh read above, orders have been issued sanctioning the State Government's contribution of first, second and third installments to all four CETP projects as follows:-

- 5. In the letter thirteenth read above, the Technical Director, CEMCOT has stated that the DPIIT, Ministry of Commerce and Industry, Government of India has released Rs.1,40,83,280/- as $1^{\rm st}$ part of $4^{\rm th}$ Installment share to the PERTEC CETP. Therefore, he has requested the Government to release its matching proportionate share of Rs.30,17,846/- to the PERTEC CETP, as CEMCOT has to approach Government of India for release of $2^{\rm nd}$ part of fourth installment.
- 6. Accordingly, the Government, after careful examination, sanction the State Government's contribution of Rs.30,17,846/- (Rupees Thirty Lakh Seventeen Thousand Eight Hundred and Forty Six only) to CEMCOT towards $1^{\rm st}$ part of $4^{\rm th}$ Installment for PERTEC CETP.
- 7. The expenditure sanctioned in paragraph 6 above shall be debited to the following head of account:-
 - "2852 Industries 08 Consumer Industries 204. Leather Schemes shared between State and Centre- UA. Assistance to CEMCOT for setting up of Infrastructure for Environmental Management 309. Grants-in Aid 02. Grants for creation of Capital Assets"
 IFHRMS: (DPC 2852 08 204- UA-30902).
- 8. Necessary additional funds of Rs.30,17,846/- will be provided in RE/FMA 2022-2023 to meet the expenditure sanctioned in para 6 above. However, this expenditure shall be brought for the notice of the Legislature by Specific Inclusion in the Supplementary Estimate 2022-2023. Pending provision of such funds, the Industries Commissioner and Director of Industries and Commerce is authorized to draw and disburse the amount sanctioned in para 6 above. The Industries Commissioner and Director of Industries and Commerce is also directed to include this

item of expenditure while sending the budget proposal for RE/FMA 2022-2023 and also send necessary draft explanatory note for inclusion of this expenditure in the Supplementary Estimate 2022-2023 to Government in Finance (Ind/BG.I) Department at the appropriate time without fail.
