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### ORDER:

Government of India have issued Guidelines for the implementation of a new scheme of Kishori Shakti Yojana Scheme in 295 projects covering 23 Districts as detailed below:-

- i. to improve the nutritional and health status of girls in the age group of 11-18 years;
- ii. to provide the required literacy and numeracy skills through the non-formal stream of education to stimulate a desire for more social exposure and knowledge and to help them improve their decision making capabilities;
- iii. to train and equip the adolescent girls to improve/upgrade home-based and vocational skills;
- iv. to promote awareness of health, hygiene, nutrition, family welfare, home management and child care and to take all measure so as to facilitate their marrying only after attaining the age of 18 years and if possible, even later;

- v. to gain a better understanding of their environment related social issues and the impact on their lives; and
- vi. to encourage adolescent girls to initiate various activities to be productive and useful members of the society.

The Government of India have approved the unit cost of ₹1,10,000 per block/project per annum to implement the Kishori Shakti Yojana Scheme.

2. In the Government Order 1<sup>st</sup> read above, Government have accorded sanction of ₹160.60 lakh for implementing Kishori Sakthi Yojana scheme in 146 Projects covering 10 Districts, as approved by Government of India for conducting Vocational Training to the Adolescent girls in the age group of 11-18 years and Orientation Camps to 11-15 years school dropouts and out of school going girls for the year 2015-2016.

3. In the letter 2<sup>nd</sup> read above, Government of India have released a sum of ₹96.36 lakh as 1<sup>st</sup> instalment of grants-in-aid for the implementation of Kishori Shakti Yojana Scheme during the year 2016-2017 which has been credited into Government account on 05.12.2016 and also stated as follows:-

Kishori Shakti Yojana is Centrally Sponsored Scheme in which the Centre and States/UTs both have contributions. The cost sharing ratio for the scheme has been revised to 60:40 between the centre and the State. The funds are being released to States on the basis of new cost sharing and subject to the following conditions:-

The grant-in-aid is subject to the condition that when the scheme is closed or abandoned, the proceeds from the disposal of assets built out of the whole or a portion of the grant sanctioned will be shared between the Central and State Government in proportion with their respective shares in the capital cost to assets.

- a) The amount of grant will have to be utilized for all the components under the schemes as per the schematic norms;
- b) the States shall also be required to contribute adequate amount for implementation of the Kishori Shakti Yojana.

4. In the letter 3<sup>rd</sup> read above, the Director, Integrated Child Development Services Scheme has sent proposal to accord sanction for a sum of ₹1,59,50,000 @ ₹1,10,000 per project towards the implementation of Kishori Shakti Yojana Scheme in 145 Projects covering 12 districts in accordance with release of Government of India in the sharing pattern of 60:40 between Government of India and State for the year 2016-2017 as detailed below:-

5. After careful examination, Government issues the following orders:-

- i. To accord sanction for a sum of ₹1,59,50,000 (One crore fifty nine lakh and fifty thousand only) for imparting Vocational Training programme through NGOs / Reputed Institutions etc. at District level by inviting Tenders as per Tamil Nadu Tender Transparency Act 1998, Rules, 2000 and / or through the institutes approved by Tamilnadu Skill Development Corporation and to implement the Training Programme through the District Programme Officers / Child Development Project Officers in 145 Projects covering 12 districts viz., Ariyalur, Dharmapuri, Dindigul, Erode, Kancheepuram, Karur, Krishnagiri, Nagapattinam, Namakkal, Thanjavur, Tiruppur and Tiruvarur depending on their training requirements in the districts. Vocational Training will be district specific / area specific and to encourage Adolescent girls to get placements in the nearby places.
- ii. To permit the District Programme Officer /Child Development Project Officer concerned for providing Training kits / mela / IEC activities as per Government of India guidelines to the beneficiaries, if any, balance is left due to effective negotiations.
- iii. To permit the Director, Integrated Child Development Services Scheme to authorize the District Programme Officers / Child Development Project Officers concerned to draw and settle the amount @ ₹1,10,000 per project for 145 Projects in 12 Districts.
- iv. The Pay and Accounts Officer/Treasury Officer concerned may be advised to honour the bill as and when presented by the District Programme Officers / Child Development Project Officers, if it is otherwise found in order.
- v. The Director, Integrated Child Development Services Scheme is requested to send Utilization Certificate in time.

6. The expenditure sanctioned in para 5(i) above shall be debited under the following Head of Account:-

"2236 – Nutrition – 02 - Distribution of Nutritious Food and Beverages - 101 - Special Nutrition Programmes – Schemes in the Twelfth Five year Plan - III" Centrally Sponsored– SI – Kishori Shakti Yojana - 72 Training " (D.P.C. No.2236 02 101 SI 7201)
