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ORDER: -

Government of India have launched a new scheme during the year 2010 -2011 called Rajiv Gandhi Scheme for Empowerment of Adolescent Girls –SABLA (RGSEAG) - to address the multi -dimensional problems of Adolescent Girls using the platform of Integrated Child Development Services Scheme. The target group of the scheme are the adolescent girls of ages between 11 and 18 years (both school going and out of school girls).

2. There are two components of the Rajiv Gandhi Scheme for Empowerment of Adolescent Girls — SABLA, are Nutrition Component and Non Nutrition Component.

The Item wise unit cost of the Non – nutrition component per year / project as provided in the Government of India guidelines are as follows:

- 3. As per Government of India guidelines, the activities to be provided under Non Supplementary Nutrition Services under Rajiv Gandhi Scheme for Empowerment of Adolescent Girls or SABLA Scheme are as follows:

 - ➡ Health check up once in three months, in collaboration with Auxiliary Nurse Mid
 Wife (ANM) and other functionaries, recording of height, W eight and Body Mass
 Index (BMI) of Adolescent Girls on Kishori Cards during Kishori Diwas.
 - Nutrition and Health Education (NHE) for all Adolescent Girls attending Anganwadi Centres.
 - Guidance on Family W elfare, Adolescent Reproductive and Sexual Health, Child Care Practices and Home Management.
 - ♣ Life Skills Education and Accessing Public Services through Department of Youth Affairs
 - Vocational Training (for girls aged 16 and above) through National Skill Development Programme (NSDP) of Ministry of Labour and Employment
- 4. In the letter 4 th read above Government of India has revalidated the unspent balance of Rs.264.10 lakh for Non -Nutrition Component released under Rajiv Gandhi Scheme for Empowerment of Adolescent Girls Scheme in 2011 -2012 for use in the

current financial year 2012 -2013 for the same purpose as per the existing guidelines of Rajiv Gandhi Scheme for Empowerment of Adolescent Girls.

5. The Principal Secretary/Special Commissioner, Integrated Child Development Services Scheme in her letter 5 the read above has sent proposal for implementing the Non-Nutrition Component under SABLA for the year 2012 -2013 and has requested to sanction of Rs.264.10 lakh for carrying out the following activities.

iv. Vocational Training:

Under SABLA, Adolescents girls to be trained under Tamil Nadu Skill
Development Mission which is one of the components of National Skill Development
Programme and Rs. 30000, per block is available as per Government of India
quidelines which can be used for Vocational trade, transportation, training kit.

- ➤ The training would be conducted at the project level for the age group of 16 to 18 years non -school going girls as per Government of India guidelines.
- The training cost allocated for the project is Rs. 30,000/ -.
- > 30 girls per batch would be trained. The training cost per girl is Rs.1,000/ -.
- ➤ The NGOs registered under National Skill Development Programme (Regd. as VTP) will give Vocational Training.

Total allotment = 139 Projects x Rs.30000/ -= Rs 41,70,000/ - (Rupees Forty One Lakh and Seventy Thousand only)

The District Programme Officers would implement the Vocational Training in coordination with the District Employment and Training under National Skill Development Programme the institution of the Modular Employable Skills (MES) under Skill Development Initiative Scheme (SDIS). Under this component, each Adolescent Girl undergoing training would be supported with Rs.1000/ - stipend to meet their travel expenses food, or to utilize it for adjustment of tuition fees if they undergo training under private VTP which insist for tuition Fees.

V. Kishori Diwas (AG Day - gJ i ka® Âd «) at AW C

Once in three months to make all health intervention including weighing, IFA supplementation, health check -up, referral services.

Follow up work is going on with Directorate of Public Health and Preventive
Medicine and Tamil Nadu State Aids Control Society to organize Kishori Diwas. Under
this programme Anganwadi W orker, Village Health Nurse, Supervisors, Medical
Officers, Primary Health Centre staff, Counsellors of Integrated Counselling and Testing
Centres has been involved. Following activities would be carried out.

- Registration of Kishori Card
- Weight Monitoring of Adolescent Girls
- > IFA distribution
- Deworming tablets distribution
- ➤ Health Education session
- Family Counselling
- > Demonstration of low cost receipies

Mode of implementation for Kishori Diwas

- > Each project would be divided into five sectors.
- Kishori Diwas would be conducted four times in a year at 5 fixed places in a Project (viz. one in April to June, July to September, October to December, January to March)

- > Total allotment for this intervention is Rs.30,000/
- For each session Rs.1,500/ would be spent (for 20 sessions x 1500 = Rs.30,000).
- But due to non -availability of funds, a sum of Rs.15000/ have been taken for this intervention. Kishori Diwas would be conducted two times in a year at 5 fixed places in a Project (viz. October to December, January to March) (Rs.1500/ x 10 sessions = Rs.15000/ -).

Total allotment = 139 Projects x Rs.15000/ - = Rs 20,85,000/ - (Rupees Twenty Lakh and Eighty Five Thousand only)

vi. Others (Printing health cards / Registers, Utensils) : Rs.25,000/ - per project

All the 16607 Anganwadi Centre s are to be provided Registers, Health Cards for Adolescent Girls. Monitoring formats are also to be printed and supplied. For this purpose, a lump sum amount of Rs.25000/ - may be allotted to each Project.

Total allotment = 139 Projects x Rs.25000/ -= Rs 34,75,000/ - (Rupees Thirty Four Lakh and Seventy Five Thousand only)

- 6. The Government examined the proposal of the Principal Secretary/Special Commissioner, Integrated Child Development Services Scheme carefully and accordingly issue orders as follows:
 - 1) Sanction is accorded for a sum of Rs.264.10 lakh (Rupees Two Sixty Four Lakh and ten thousand only) Rs.1.90 lakh x 139 Projects for Non -Nutrition SNP Component of SABLA as per the details given in para 5 above.
 - 2) The Principal Secretary/Special Commissioner, ICDS is authorized to carry out Head -wise readjustment of financial limits, wherever required within the total approved cost of Non -Nutrition Component under SABLA programme. The Principal Secretary / Special Commissioner is allowed to utilize the savings, if any, in any one of the activities/components, to incur expenditure at State level/ District level District Programme Officers as per Government of India guidelines of 'SABLA' scheme.
 - 3) The Government authorize the Principal Secretary/Special Commissioner, Integrated Child Development Services Scheme to incur the expenditure and also permitted to authorize the District Programme Officers / Child Development Project Officers concerned to draw the amount under Article 99 of Tamil Nadu Financial Code Volume I and for conducting the above programme and adjust the same at the Pay and Accounts Office / Treasury Office as per the schematic norms
 - 4) The Pay and Accounts Officer/Treasury Officer concerned is instructed to honour the bill as and when presented by the Principal Secretary/Special Commissioner of Integrated Child Development Services Scheme/ District Programme Officers/ Child Development Project officers, if it is otherwise found to be in order
- 7. The expenditure sanctioned in para 6 (i) above shall be debited under the following head of account: -
