ORDER:

In the Government Order first, second and third read above, block administrative sanction were accorded for implementation of Model Village programme to villages in phase-I & II sub basins of Tamil Nadu Irrigated Agriculture Modernisation Project (TNIAMP) through the line Departments respectively, as detailed below:-

2. In the letter fourth read above, the Engineer-in-Chief and Chief Engineer (General), Water Resources Department, Chennai has stated that implementation of model village program in phase – I sub basins is completed. For the Phase-II & III Sub Basins, the implementation of model village program are under progress. For the Phase IV the Sub Basins nodal officers has conducted the Sub Committee meeting with the line departments officials and 154 villages has been identified and finalized by the line Departments for model villages programme, which will be implemented by the line departments at a cost of Rs.308.00 lakh. The line Department wise identified and finalized model village allocation for Phase-IV Sub Basins is tabulated below:-

3. The Key activities to be carried out under the Model Village programme are,

- 1) Model Village Entry level activity and base line survey
- 2) Conducting convergence meeting with following indicative activities
 - i .Initial convergence Meeting.
 - ii. Awareness meetings at habitation level
 - iii. Community Transect water walk
 - iv. Meeting for Particularly Rural Appraisal (PRA) Exercise
 - v. Meeting for Water Budget and Decision support systems
 - vi. Meeting for eco - friendly activities

- 3) Conducting capacity Building training on Community Collaborative Water Management (CCWM) to Community Change Management group (CCMG) of village. (25 participants per batch)
- 4) Establishment of Single Window Information and Knowledge Centers (SWIKC)
- 5) Wall Painting of water budgeting and village vision

Each Model Village will be funded Rs.2.00 lakhs for effective functioning and beyond the Project it is the responsibility of the WUAs in each village to take over. Each Model Village will be led by different Department personnel as captains of Model Village. The Engineer-in-Chief, Water Resources Department / Commissioner/ Director (at the HOD level), Executive Engineer/ District level officer are the nodal officers for implementing, monitoring, coordinating this programme for their respective line department activities.

The HODs will also monitor the programme through their department functionaries and keep the Government informed on a monthly basis.

The District Collectors will review the programme in the District Level Co-ordination Committee (DLCC) meetings on alternate Mondays of every month and submit periodical monthly reports to the Project and to the Government.

The Executive Engineer, Water Resources Department will function as the District Member Secretary to this programme and the captains of the line department for their respective model villages will mutually co-ordinate in development of Model Villages.

Synchronizing of TNIAM Project Model Village program with Kalaigharin Anaithu Grama Orunginaintha Velaan Valarchi Thittam (KAGVVT) and Anaithu Grama Anna Marumalarchi Thittam-II (AGAMT-II) Schemes,

- If any of the selected 154 Phase-IV Model Villages of TNIAM Project comes under the Kalaigharin Anaithu Grama Orunginaintha Velaan Valarchi Thittam (KAGVVT) and Anaithu Grama Anna Marumalarchi Thittam - II (AGAMT- II) Villages, the awareness about the KAGVVT and AGAMT- II schemes will be showcased to the community by the line department officials through the Single Window Information Knowledge Centre (SWIKC) established in the selected Model Villages under TNIAM Project.
- The SWIKC Centers will be a common platform for line department officials and villagers to meet and discuss issues related to all Departmental interventions including the KAGVVT and AGAMT- II schemes.
- Wherever feasible, the HODs of Line Departments of TNIAM Project will be advised to implement the community awareness programs by dovetailing/ synchronizing with the KAGVVT and AGAMT- II schemes along with Model Village program under TNIAM Project.

4. The Engineer-in-Chief and Chief Engineer (General), Water Resources Department, Chennai has stated that the estimate of "Implementation of Model Village Programme to 154 numbers of Villages in Phase-IV Sub Basins of TN IAM Project through the line Departments" for an amount of Rs.308.00 lakh has been approved by the Empowered Committee in its meeting held on 08.04.2024 with the suggestion to carry out impact assessment study for Model villages through third party agency and ensure the integrated approach of line Departments in the implementation of Model villages program. He has also stated that as per the suggestion of the Empowered Committee, the impact assessment study for model villages will be carried out and also the integrated approach of line Departments will be ensured while implementing the Model village program.

5. The Engineer-in-Chief and Chief Engineer (General), Water Resources Department, Chennai has therefore requested the Government.

- i. to accord Block Administrative Sanction for Implementation of Model Village Programme to 154 villages in Phase-IV sub basins of World Bank funded TN IAMP through line Departments at an estimated cost of Rs.308.00 lakhs;
- ii. to accord financial sanction of Rs.80.00 lakh to Water Resources Department to implement the model village programme to 40 villages in phase-IV sub basins of TNIAMP; and
- iii. to accord permission to request the line departments to send a separate proposal to the concerned administrative Department in the Government for financial sanction for the funds allotted to each department to settle the liabilities.

6. Based on the approval of the Empowered Committee, the Government have decided to accept the proposal of the Engineer-in- Chief and Chief Engineer (General), Water Resources Department, Chennai and hereby accord,

- i. Block Administrative Sanction for Implementation of Model Villages Programme to 154 villages in Phase-IV sub basins of World Bank funded TN IAMP through line Departments at an estimated cost of Rs.3,08,00,000/- (Rupees Three crore and eight lakh only);
- ii. Financial sanction for an amount of Rs.80,00,000/- (Rupees Eighty lakh only) to Water Resources Department to implement the model village programme to 40 villages in phase-IV sub basins of TNIAMP ; and
- iii. Permission to request the line departments to send a separate proposal to the concerned administrative Department in the Government for financial sanction for the funds allotted to each department to settle the liabilities.

7. The expenditure sanctioned at para 6 (ii) above shall be debited to the following head of account:-

“2701 Medium Irrigation – 80 General – 800 Other Expenditure – Externally Aided project – PB Farmers Organisation under TNIAM Project-II – 372 - Training – 01 – Training.”

8. Necessary Additional Funds of Rs.80,00,000/- will be provided in RE/FMA 2024-2025. However, this expenditure shall be brought to the notice of the legislature by way of Specific Inclusion in the Supplementary Estimate 2024-2025. Pending provision of such funds, the Engineer-in-Chief and Chief Engineer (General), Water Resources Department, Chennai is authorized to incur the expenditure sanctioned in para 6 (ii) above. The Engineer-in-Chief and Chief Engineer (General), Water Resources Department, Chennai is directed to include the above item of expenditure while sending the budget proposal for RE/FMA 2024-25 and also send necessary draft Explanatory note for inclusion of the expenditure in the Supplementary Estimate 2024-2025 to Finance (Infra-II/BG-I) Department at an appropriate time without fail.
