Introductiion

Out of the total population of Tamil Nadu Adi Dravidar is 20.01% and Scheduled Tribe is 1.17%. The majority of the Adi Dravidar and Scheduled Tribes population are economically backward and socially marginalized. Most of them lack resources and access to education, employment and other income-earning opportunities.

According to 2011 Population Census the Literacy percentage of Adi Dravidar and Scheduled Tribes are as follows: -

2. Welfare Programmes

This Department implements several welfare programmes for the socio-economic development of the Adi Dravidar and Scheduled Tribes in the State. Apart from formulating programmes so as to end the social seclusion and economic deprivation of Adi dravidars and Scheduled Tribes through educational development, the objectives of these programmes are also to speed up the process of integrating them with the national main stream.

21 sectoral departments comprising of 48 HOD's for Scheduled Castes Sub Plan and 49 HOD's for Tribal Sub Plan earmark specific allocations for the benefit of the Adi Dravidar and Scheduled Tribes from their regular planned programmes allocations.

Among various social sector programmes implemented by the Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Department, education occupies the prime place as it reforms the society at greater level. Besides this, various other welfare programmes like distribution of house site pattas and construction of houses and provision of basic amenities like laying of roads, street lights, supply of drinking water, burial ground and pathway to burial ground etc. are also taken up as part of the social development programmes.

In order to ensure livelihood for the Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups where habitations are at hilly areas special programmes are framed such as construction of traditional houses, distribution of milch animals, provision of drinking water facilities and street lights

Necessary funds are provided under **Article 275 (1) of Constitution of India** to provide infrastructure facilities in Tribal areas.

For the benefit to the Adi Dravidar and Scheduled Tribes, economic development programmes are implemented by various sectoral depertments by fixing particular targets.

(Tamil Nadu Adi Dravidar Housing Development Corporation (TAHDCO) The economic development programmes implemented through TAHDCO are primarily of three categories namely 1) Micro enterprises development for the poor families 2) Vocational job-oriented skill training programmes and 3) Individual entrepreneur schemes which are supported by appropriate training and subsidy programmes. To create employment opportunities and to strengthen the skill needs specific trades among the

youth, suitable skill development training programmes are organized through well known and recognized institutions.

3. Administrative Machinery:

The Directorate of Adi Dravidar Welfare and Directorate of Tribal Welfare TAHDCO, are functioning under the control of the Secretary to Government, Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Department. At the State level, the Directorate of Adi Dravidar Welfare is headed by an I.A.S., officer. Similarly the Directorate of Tribal Welfare is headed by an C.L.S., Officer. At the district level, District Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Officers and Project Officer (Tribal Welfare) are working with their supporting staff for the Welfare of Adi Dravidars the the and Scheduled Tribes. TAHDCO as a Corporation is responsible for implementing all the economic development programmes for the benefit of the Adi Dravidar and Scheduled It is headed by the Managing Director in the cadre of an I.A.S., Tribes. field level, TAHDCO officer. In the has district offices headed by District Managers.

At the district level District collectors are the main co-ordinating officers for monitoring all welfare programmes for the benefit of the Adi Dravidar and Scheduled Tribes with the support of the officers of this department such as Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Officers. Project (Tribal Welfare), District Managers, TAHDCO and the heads of the sectoral Rural Development and Panchayat Raj, Agriculture, departments like Health and Family Welfare, Higher Education, Animal Husbandry, Dairying & Fisheries, Municipal Administration & Water Supply, Revenue, School Education and Social Welfare & Women empowerment Departments etc., are functioning as main coordinating officers.

4. Schools and Hostels

Various welfare programes are implemented for the Adi Dravidar and Scheduled Tribe students studying in Adi Dravidar welfare and Government Tribal Residential Schools.

5. Educational Scholarship

Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Department is implementing various educational scholarship Schemes from 1st Std to P.G & Ph.D degree with the prime objective of providing quality education to Socially and Economically backward communities such as Adi Dravidar, Scheduled Tribes and Adi Dravidar converts to Christianity to ensure socio-economic, educational development, social dignity and self sustainability.

Some schemes are implemented without insisting caste and income ceiling of the target beneficiaries/students. Many schemes are implemented with the objective of uplifting the poorest by taking into account of the target beneficiaries' community, income and category of the institutions (Government/Government Aided/Private) in which the students are pursuing their education etc.,

5.4	Overseas Scholarship In order to encourage Adi Dravidar, Scheduled Tribes, Christian Adi Dravidar students to pursue postgraduate and doctoral research studies in educational institutions abroad, the scheme is implemented. To avail scholarship under this scheme, the annual income limit of the parent /Guardian should not exceed Rs.8.00 lakh. 10 students are selected and given scholarship upto Rs.36.00 lakh per annum depending on the country and course of study. The scholarship is awarded to students who are admitted to the top 1000 institutions ranked by Quacquarelli Symonds (QS) in the Global Ranking of Institutions. Further, only one person from a family can avail scholarship under this scheme. Moreover, students are given coaching through TAHDCO, for clearing the qualifying exams such as TOEFL / IELTS/ GRE / GMAT a prerequisite for getting admission in most of the educational institutions abroad. 7. Provision of basic amenities

Free house site pattas are issued to the poor houseless Adi Dravidar families. Supply of protected drinking water is one of the scheme of priority among provision of basic amenities. Under infrastructure development, wells Bore wells are being provided. Further, Government is allocating funds for providing burial grounds and pathways to burial grounds. To cater to the need for conducting weddings, social gatherings, meetings etc., community halls are also constructed.

8. Pradhan Mantri Anusuchit Jati Abhyuday Yojana (PM-AJAY)

From the year 2021-2022, the Pradhan Mantri – Anusuchit Jaati Abhyuday Yojana (PM-AJAY) has been introduced by Government of India by merging three existing schemes viz., Pradhan Mantri Adarsh Gram Yojana (PMAGY), Special Central Assistance to Scheduled Castes Sub Plan (SCA to SCSP) and Babu Jagjivan Ram Chhatrawas Yojana (BJRCY).

(a) Pradhan Mandri Adarsh Gram Yojana - (PMAGY)

Objective of the Scheme

The main objective of this scheme is to ensure integrated development of the selected villages with more than 40% of scheduled caste population so Funds are allocated by the Government of India so that there is adequate infrastructure and improvement in socio -economic indicators as part of various sectors / Domains. These domains include Drinking water and Sanitation, Education, Health and Nutrition, Social security, Rural Roads and Housing, Electricity and Clean Fuel, Agricultural Practices, Financial inclusion, Digitization, Livelihood and Skill Development. The scheme is implemented by the Rural development and Panchayat raj Department

- ➤ Eligibility The scheme is implemented in villages who where living more than 40% of Adi Dravidar.
- Accessible Officers District Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Officer, Project Director, Rural Development Agency.

(b) Special Central Assistance to Scheduled Castes Sub Plan (SCA to SCSP)

Objective

The Government of India is providing Special Central Assistance, as a supplementary grant to the Scheduled Castes Sub Plan of the State to enhance infrastructural facilities, facilitate family income generating schemes, encourage economic development and provide skill development schemes and also to enhance the productivity and income of the Scheduled Caste families.

(c) <u>Babu Jagjivan Ram Chhatrawas Yojana Scheme (BJRCY)</u>

The Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment is allocating funds for the construction of a new Hostel building at Adi Dravidar Welfare Department under the Babu Jegajivanram Chatravas Yojana. The project is being implemented with 100 per cent contribution for the construction of Girls hostel buildings and 50 per cent contribution for construction of Boys hostel buildings.

New buildings have been constructed for 208 hostels under this scheme from 2003-2004 to 2021-2022. Now the works are under progress in 13 Hostel Building for the years 2019-2020, 2021-2022, out of with works are completed in to hostel

➤ Eligibility - The scheme is implemented in Adi Dravidar Welfare Hostels only.

9. Removal Of Untouchability

This Departments is taking various steps to abolish Untouchability to prevent activities against Adi Dravidar and Scheduled Tribes. For this protection of civil Rights Act 1955 and the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act 1989 and rules have been enacted by the Government of India and implemented by the State Government effectively, now the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (PoA) Act 1989 and the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (PoA) rules 1995 have been amended getting concurrence of India after by Government from State Governments as Scheduled castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) (Amendments) Act 2015 and Scheduled castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Amendment Rules 2016-2018. The above said Act and Rules have been notified in the Gazette of India (Extraordinary) and came into force on 01.01.2016, 14.04.2016 and 27.06.2018 respectively.

A sum of Rs.10.00 lakh is given to one village in each district (except Chennai) where untouchability is not practiced in any form and the people live in harmony.

TRIBAL WELFARE

Introduction

The Directorate of Tribal Welfare was bifurcated from the Directorate of Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Department with full financial and administrative control from 01.04.2018. The Government of Tamil Nadu is paying special attention for the development of tribal people in 23 Districts where Scheduled Tribes population is more. The prime objective of the Government is overall improvement of Education, Health and Socio Economic status of tribes and also to reduce the gap between tribes and non tribes. Basic needs like provision of drinking water, link roads to the tribal villages, construction of houses and other infrastructural requirements are given special focus.

According to 2011 census, the Scheduled Tribes constitute 1.17% of the total population of Tamil Nadu. In Tamilnadu, **Tribal Sub Plan** has been implemented since **1976-1977**. It is a part of State's annual plan and constitutes about 1.1% of the annual plan in proportion with the population of scheduled tribes in the State. Under Tribal Sub Plan, all departments allocate funds to implement schemes for tribal welfare, infrastructure improvement of tribal areas, and to create livelihood opportunity for tribals. Tribal Sub Plan ensures that resources spent for the benefit of scheduled tribes is atleast in proportion to their population.

The Government have identified 10 Integrated Tribal Development Programme(I.T.D.P) areas covering 7 Districts Viz., Salem (Yercaud, Pachamalai, Aranuthumalai and Kalrayan Hills), (Kolli Hills), Villupuram (Kalrayan Hills), Tiruvannamalai (Jawadhu Hills), Tiruchirapalli (Pachamalai Hills), Dharmapuri (Sittheri Hills) and Thirupattur (Jawadhu and Yelagiri hills) where Tribal population is 50% or more than the total population to implement all the tribal welfare Schemes.

Out of the 37 Tribal communities in Tamilnadu, 6 Tribal Communities i.e. Toda, Kota, Kurumbas, Irular, Paniyan and Kattunayakan are classified as

Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs). Centrally sponsored schemes such as Pradhan Mantri Aadi Adrash Gram Yojana, Assistance under Article 275 (1) of the Constitution of India, Development of PVTG's, Vandhan Vikas Kendra and Minimum Support Price for Minor Forest Produce scheme (MSP to MFP).

Further State scheme such as Comprehensive Tribal Development Programme, Basic infrastructure facilities, Construction of Houses, Fast Track Power supply, Road works, improvement of infrastructure in Government Tribal Residential Schools, provision of drinking water facilities, economic development schemes and training skills are implemented.

Tribal Research Centre(TRC) was established in the year 1985 with the assistance of Government of India at Muthorai Palada, Udhagamandalam in the Nilgiris District, for data collection about the Tribes and to conduct necessary research about their life style, culture, language and socio economic and educational status. A Director, who is specialized in Anthropology is heading TRC. A Library and a Tribal Museum have been setup in which the tribal and photographs artifacts on the life style of the tribes are displayed.

Students enrollment in GTR Schools and Hostels are in the following proportion of 85% for SC/ST students, 10% for BC/MBC students, 5% for other category students.

Students has to submit their application forms to the respective district collector through Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Officers / Project Officers. Students who fulfill the criteria of residing 5 Km away from the schools are admitted to the Hostels. The above rule is not applicable to the girl students.

The Tamil Nadu Adi Dravidar Housing and Development Corporation (TAHDCO) was started in 1974 as a Government agency to build houses for the homeless Adi Dravidar people. It has now grown into an organization that implements the following entrepreneurship and skill development programmes of the Government for the economic upliftment of the Adi Dravidar and Scheduled tribe people, at the base of the society.

- (i) Implementing entrepreneur development programmes for Adi Dravidar / Scheduled Tribes under loan with subsidy.
- (ii) To Ensure livelihood of bellow poverty line people through employment and training programmes.
- (iii) Providing buildings, drinking water and sanitation facilities for Adi Dravidar &Tribal welfare schools and hostels
- (iv) Improving the livelihood opportunities of the poor through self-employment and skill training with special focus on bonded labour and sanitary worker families living below poverty line.

The Scavengers Workers Welfare Board has been constituted during the year 2007 as per G.O(MS) No. 71, Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Department Dt. 11.06.2007 under the Chairpersonship of Hon'ble Minister for Adi Dravidar Welfare. The Managing Director, Tamil Nadu Adi Dravidar Housing and Development Corporation Limited (TAHDCO) acts as the Member-Secretary to this board. VI. TAMIL NADU STATE COMMISSION FOR ADI DRAVIDAR AND SCHEDULED TRIBES

"The Tamil Nadu State Commission for Adi Dravidar and Scheduled Tribes" has been established as an autonomous body to protect the legal rights of Adi Dravidar and Scheduled Tribes at the State Level and to address their issues and functioning from 13.10.2021.

The Commission functions under the Chairmanship of retired Justice. A Vice Chairman and four members have also been nominated to this commission. The managing Director, TAHDCO acts as the Member-Secretary to the commission. The term of office of the Chairman, Vice Chairman and members is three years.

So far, 987 cases have been closed out of the 1826 petitions received by the commission and action is being pursued on the remaining 839 cases.
