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#### Chapter - 1

#### INTRODUCTION

- **1.1** Government of Tamil Nadu is committed to provide quality health care to the people of the State through easily accessible healthcare facilities in Urban and Rural areas.
- 1.2 Various healthcare initiatives of the State such as Tamil Nadu Medical Service Corporation, Birth companion Programme have been adopted by various other States in India. The current Infant Mortality Rate of the State is 16 (Sample Registration System 2017), which is well below the 12<sup>th</sup> plan national target of 30 per 1,000 live births. The State ranks as the second lowest among the major States in the country for this indicator. Against the National target of 100 per lakh live births for the Maternal Mortality Ratio, the State had already achieved a Maternal Mortality Ratio of 66 as per Sample Registration System 2014-2016, which is further reduced to 60 as per HMIS data 2018. The achievements in the vital health indicators are due to the strenuous efforts taken by this Government. The State has also achieved replacement level and the current Total Fertility Rate is 1.6 which is one of the lowest in the country and is maintained for the last three years. The performance of Tamil Nadu on the health front has been appreciated by the Common Review Mission of the Government of India and other various Independent Review Missions.

#### Chapter – 2

#### **MEDICAL EDUCATION**

- **2.1** The Directorate of Medical Education is managing the Medical Colleges and Teaching Institutions and hospitals attached to them. The Department has a twin role of ensuring effective and accessible tertiary care for treatment of diseases and provision of health services and also creating adequate human resources for this sector. The Director of Medical Education is the head of department.

#### **CHAPTER -3**

#### **MEDICAL AND RURAL HEALTH SERVICES**

**3.1** It is a pride of this Directorate to have yet another step ahead with an experience of 95 years in provision of multifarious specility medical care to the public through secondary care in the State of Tamil Nadu @ the Geographical areas with 29 Headquarters Hospitals, 206 Taluk Hospitals, 67 Non-Taluk Hospitals, 7 Women & Children Hospitals – W&CH, 11 Dispensaries –DPY, 2 Tuberculosis Hospitals -TB HL,7 Leprosy Hospitals – Lep and 1 Rehabilitation Institute & Mental Health - RIMH and also strengthened the maternity and child welfare exclusively, by executing the services of Comprehensive Emergency Obstetrics and Newborn Care (CEmONC) units in 104 hospitals, including all District Headquarters Hospitals and Newborn Stabilization Units (NBSUs) in 114 hospitals and Sick Neo-Natal Care Units (SNCUs) in 42 hospitals under the Directorate of Medical and Rural Health Services.

Further the medical services like Medicine, Surgery, Obstetrics and Gynaecology, Ophthalmology, E.N.T, Venerologoy, Orthopaedics, Anaesthesiology, Child Health, Dental, Psychiatry, Ambulance Services, Laboratory Services, Leprosy, Tuberculosis, Diabetology, Cardiology and Non Communicable Disease (N.C.D) has also extended with high end techonlgies.

The following services are also being offered by this Directorate.

Accident and Emergency Services, Family Welfare and Maternity and Child Health, T.B. Control and Blindness Control Programmes, TamilNadu Illness Assistance Society activities and District Mental Health Programme.

Thus the Directorate of Medical and Rural Health Services is the trend setter in the field of Health Services.

To make a scheme successful and to get the maximum out reach, monitoring of the implementation of such scheme is aboulstely necessary. Keeping in mind, the Directorate of Medical and Rural Health Services has introduced unique monitoring system both in the Directorate as well as District level. Hospital management information system is being implemented at the Directorate level. Hospital management system is being at the secondary level. By utilizing, the information regarding the services offered like lab services, Nursing, and diet etc., are being shared by the Directorate digitaly with District level.

#### 3.7 Revised National TB Control Programme(RNTCP):

- Revised National TB Control Programme(RNTCP) Infrastructure:
  In TamilNadu at State level State TB Cell (STC) and State TB Training &
  Demonstration centre (STDC) is functioning with State TB Officer &
  Director for State TB Training & Demonstration Centre. At District level,
  District TB Officers (DTO) are posted in each district. In the districts 461
  TB units are functioning after decentralization at Block level. One TB Unit
  (TU) is formed for every 1.5 2.5 lakh population. Each TB Unit is
  manned by one of the Block Medical Officers in the Unit, who is
  designated as Medical Officer TB Control (MOTC) and assisted by one
  Senior Treatment Supervisor (STS) at block level. One Senior TB
  Laboratory Supervisor (STLS) is deployed for each five lakh population
  and one TB Health Visitor (TBHV) for 1 lakh Urban Population.
- Designated Microscopy Centres (DMCs) and Speciality Labs: In TamilNadu, there are currently 1984 Designated Microscopy Centres (DMC) in the State which include newly added 1147 Designated Microscopy Centres in the previous year for the purpose of increasing the access, detection as well as notification. One Designated Microscopy (DMC) has been formed for Centre every 1 lakh population. Each Microscopy Centre has one Laboratory Technician (LT) from General Health System and has been provided with Binocular Microscope. Presently 69 numbers of DMCs have been provided with fluorescent microscopes which has 10 to 20% higher double sensitivity in detecting MTB than ordinary microscope. Solid, liquid culture & Drug

Sensitivity Test (DST) is donate the Intermediate Reference Laboratory, Chetpet, Chennai and Madurai. Lab for Drug Resistant TB is functioning and assisted by National Reference Laboratory (NRL) at National Institute for Research in Tuberculosis (NIRT), Chennai. Solid culture is done at CMC Vellore under Private Public Mix (PPM) scheme.

- **3.9 District Mental Health Programme:** The District Mental Health Programme is a Community based Programme successfully implemented in the State. The aims of the District Mental Health Programme are as follows:
  - To create awareness regarding mental health in the community
  - To integrate and implement mental health services through all the wings of the Health Department
  - To facilitate the early detection and treatment of the patient within the community itself
  - To reduce the stigma attached towards mental illness through change in attitude and public education
  - To treat the rehabilitated mental patients discharged from mental hospitals within the community

The District Mental Health Programme was first implemented in Tiruchirapalli district during the year 1997. Now, this programme has been expanded to 32districts as follows:

# Chapter - 4

#### **PUBLIC HEALTH AND PREVENTIVE MEDICINE**

**4.1** The Department of Public Health and Preventive Medicine was established in the year 1923 in Tamil Nadu. Since inception, this Department has been engaged in protecting and promoting the health of the people in the State through immunization, health education, application of hygiene and sanitary measures, monitoring quality of drinking water and environmental hazards, thereby reducing the burden of morbidity, mortality and disability in the State. The main objectives of the department include prevention and control of communicable diseases and provision of community based Maternity and Child Health Services in rural and urban areas through universal primary health care.

# **Infant Mortality Rate (IMR)**

**4.2** The Government of Tamil Nadu is committed and dedicated to reduce the Infant Mortality Rate (Number of infant deaths per year for every 1000 live births) on par with the developed nations.



### Maternal Mortality Ratio (MMR)

**4.3** Tamil Nadu ranks second lowest in MMR among the major Indian States. In 2018-19, Tamil Nadu reported 556 maternal deaths (an MMR of **60** per 1,00,000 live births). The Government of Tamil Nadu is committed to reduce the Maternal Mortality Ratio of the State on par with the developed nations.

# **Civil Registration System**

**4.4** The registration of the birth and death is carried out uniformly throughout the country as per the Registration of the Birth and Death Act, 1969 and it is governed by Tamil Nadu Registration of Birth and Death Rules, 2000. The Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine is the Chief Registrar of Births and Deaths, Tamil Nadu.

The birth and death registration activity is carried out in the State, by the Primary Registrars of various departments viz., Health, Municipal Administration, Revenue Administration, Town Panchayats and Corporations.

The registered vital events were entered in different software by the line departments earlier. To have uniformity throughout the State the Hon'ble Minister for Health and Family Welfare has announced on the floor of assembly on 04.07.2017, that the provision of issue of online birth and death certificate to the public as being done in Chennai Corporation will be extended all over the State.

The Government have ordered in G.O.Ms.No.351 Health and Family Welfare Department dated 09.10.2017, to use the common CRS software developed by the Chief Registrar of Births and Deaths, Tamil Nadu for Civil Registration System as Common software throughout Tamil Nadu.

The Government have ordered in G.O.Ms.No. 443 Health and Family Welfare Department, dated: 26.09.2018 to appoint Multi Purpose Health Supervisor (Male) as Birth and Death Registrar for Government District Head Quarters Hospital, Medical College hospitals, ESI Hospitals, WCH, Taluk and Non-Taluk Hospitals for issue of Birth Certificates for the deliveries occurred in Government Hospitals prior to the discharge of the mother and issue death certificate to the relatives of deceased before they leave the hospital.

The CRS Web portal http://www.crstn.org was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister on 04.03.2019 and the web portal is successfully functioning in the State from 01.01.2018 onwards, a total of 9,13,331 Lakhs of births and a total of 5,45,203 deaths have been registered in the CRS Common software for the year 2018 and a total of 3,22,551 Lakhs of births and a total of 2,11,697 deaths have been registered for the year 2019 up to 31.05.2019.

# **Primary Health Centres**

**4.5** The administration of Primary Health Centres has been brought under the control of the Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine from the 1st March 1996. Presently there are 1806 Rural Primary Health Centres in the State details of which are furnished below:

# **Community Health Centres/Upgraded Primary Health Centres**

**4.6** The Government decided in 2001 to provide at least one 30 bedded Upgraded Primary Health Centre in each block where there is no such health facilities in a phased manner. Each upgraded Primary Health Centre has 5 Doctors, an operation theatre, modern equipments like Ultra Sonogram, ECG, Semi Auto Analyzer, X-ray and an ambulance. At present 422 Upgraded Primary Health Centres are functioning in 385 blocks.

# **Primary Health Centre Services**

# **Institutional Services Monitoring Report:**

**4.7** The Institutional services rendered by the Primary Health Centres are being monitored through ISMR at Primary Health Centres Level. Feedback reports are sent to Deputy Directors of Health Services. During the year 2018-19, **12,50,25,700** out patients at the Rate of **161** per Primary Health Centre/Day and **25,40,242** in patients at the Rate of **100** per Primary Health Centre/month were treated and **1,28,053** deliveries were conducted at the rate of **5** per Primary Health Centre/Month.

### **Deliveries conducted at Primary Health Centres**

**4.8** For the Year **2018-19**, **1,28,053 deliveries** have been conducted in the Primary Health Centres. Upgradation of all Primary Health Centres as 24x7 Primary Health Centres, introduction of birth companion scheme, provision of Ultra Sonogram machines, upgradation of 30 bedded Primary Health Centres with operation theatre, Dr.Muthulakshmi Reddy Maternity Benefit Scheme, provision of diet for antenatal mothers, maternity picnics to Primary Health Centres, provision of drop back facilities for delivered mothers and establishment of birth waiting homes are important contributory factors for the conduct of deliveries in Primary Health Centre deliveries.


# **Caesarean Section Delivery in PHCs**

**4.9** Presently, Caesarean services are provided in 124 Primary Health Centres. During the Year **2018-19**, **11,076** Caesarean Sections were performed in these Primary Health Centres. Sixth Common Review Mission of National Rural Health Mission has recorded its appreciation for the efforts taken by Tamil Nadu State to provide Caesarean Section deliveries.

# **Family Welfare Sterilization Performance by Primary Health Centres**

**4.10** Family Welfare sterilization services are provided in **390** Primary Health Centres of the State. During the year **2018-19**, **50,126** sterilizations have been performed in these Primary Health Centres, accounting for **19** percent of sterilizations performed in the entire State.

### **Establishment of Urban Primary Health Centres**

**4.11** The Government of India has launched National Urban Health Mission (NUHM) in May, 2013 as a Sub-Mission under the NHM to effectively address health concerns of the Urban poor especially in slums and vulnerable areas. An Urban PHC is established for every 50,000 population in towns having more than 50,000 population and in any town which has below 50,000 population under NRHM. Under NUHM 280 Urban PHCs are established which includes 37 New Urban PHCs and 243 existing Urban PHCs/Urban Health posts which are already available with Directorate of Public Health and Urban Local Bodies are strengthened. At present 320 Urban Primary Health Centres were functioning under the control of Director of Public Health and Preventive Medicine.

# **Menstrual Hygiene Programme**

**4.12** This programme was launched by the **Hon'ble Chief Minister** on 27.03.2012. Under this scheme, 18 packs of sanitary napkins (six pads per pack) in a year at the rate of three packs for two months are provided to each adolescent girl (10–19 years), both school going and non school going, in rural areas. Sanitary Napkins are also given to post natal mothers who deliver in Government institutions at the rate of seven packs each (six pads per pack). Besides adolescent girls and mothers who deliver in Government institutions, sanitary napkins are being given to each woman prison inmate and to female in-patients in the Institute of Mental Health, Chennai at the rate of 18 packs (six pads per pack) in a year. # Chapter - 5

#### **FAMILY WELFARE PROGRAMME**

**5.1** The National Family Welfare Programme is being implemented in Tamil Nadu since 1956. Initially, the Department of Family Welfare was functioning only as a wing of the Medical and Public Health Directorates. A separate Directorate of Family Welfare was formed during 1983. Subsequently, the Family Welfare Programme was implemented as a People's programme by involving all the other Departments. The main objective of the Family Welfare programme is to stabilize the population growth as well as to improve the Maternal and Child Health status there by reducing the vital indicators such as the Crude Birth Rate (CBR), Infant Mortality Rate (IMR) and Maternal Mortality Rate (MMR). Today Tamil Nadu is considered as a model State of all other States in the country in the implementation of the Family Welfare Programme. As the State has made commendable progress in reducing the Birth Rate, the focus has shifted from the target based approach to community need based approach, where the importance is given to meet the unmet need for Family Planning services and improving maternal and child health. The major factor behind the success of the programme in the State has been strong social and political commitment couple with a systematic administrative backup.

# **6.21 Production of quality drugs:**

Every effort is taken to secure genuine herbs and produce drugs as per the classical texts or standard Pharmacopoeia. The medicines are manufactured in the two Government Pharmacies, one situated in the campus of Arignar Anna Government Hospital of Indian Medicine, Chennai and another in the campus of Government Siddha Medical College, Palayamkottai. In the Pharmacy attached to Arignar Anna Government Hospital of Indian Medicine, Chennai, Siddha, Ayurveda and Unani medicines are prepared while in the Government Pharmacy at Palayamkottai, Siddha Medicines alone are prepared.

# 6.22 Yoga and Naturopathy M.D. Course:

Based on the important role of Yoga & Naturopathy in preventive, health promoting and curative aspect of lifestyle disorders/diseases and realizing the need of the availability of highly qualified practitioners in the State, the Government has started three year M.D. Course in Yoga & Naturopathy first time in three disciplines i.e. Naturopathy, Yoga and Acupuncture at Govt. Yoga and Naturopathy Medical College & Hospital, Chennai. The first batch of the post graduate students were admitted in the academic year 2014-2015 and now two batches of students have successfully passed out.

## 6.29 State Licensing Authority (Indian Medicine):

The office of the State Licensing Authority (Indian Medicine) has started its functioning from 29.11.2007 under the control of Directorate of Indian Medicine and Homoeopathy. The Ayurveda, Siddha and Unani (ASU) drugs are licensed by the State Licensing Authority (IM) as per the Drugs and Cosmetics Act 1940 and Rules 1945.

The State Licensing Authority is the licensing authority for the grant or renewal of a license to manufacture for the sale any Ayurveda, Siddha and Unani (ASU) drugs and is also the approving authority for approval of institutions for carrying out tests on Ayurveda, Siddha and Unani drugs and raw materials used in their manufacture on behalf of licensees for manufacture for sale of Ayurveda, Siddha and Unani drugs.

Drug Inspectors are authorized as Gazetted officers vide G.O.(D) No.93, dated 11.01.2018 for enforcements of provisions of the DMR ACT 1954 and Rules 1955.

All the Ayurveda, Siddha, Unani manufacturing units are GMP certified as per Schedule T of Drugs and Cosmetics Act 1940 and Rules 1945.

In the Year 2018, 288 copies of "A Manual on Guidelines for requirement of Ayurveda, Siddha and Unani(ASU) Industries" which has been compiled by the Office of the State Licensing Authority(IM) for easy reference to the people were sold.

About 25 drug licenses are suspended as per Rule 159 of Drugs and Cosmetics Act 1940 and Rules 1945 in the year 2018 -2019.

#### 6.30 Achievements:

- International Institute of Yoga & Naturopathy Medical Sciences to be established in Chengalpet, Kancheepuram District in 50 acres of land. Government had initially announced that the institute will be started at a cost of Rs.60 Crore. Now the cost has been enhanced and proposed for Rs.92 Crore.
- Siddha, Yoga & Naturopathy integrated AYUSH Hospital with 50 beds established at Theni and Thiruvannamalai. During 2018-19 sanction has been accorded for starting AYUSH Hospital at Pudukottai.
- Awareness programme and distribution of Nilavembu Kudineer and Dengue and Chikunkunniya prevention activities will continue to be carried out.
- A special treatment for weight reduction is conducted in the hospital attached to Government Yoga & Naturopathy Medical

College, Chennai – 106, by means of Natural foods, natural herbal treatment, mud bath therapy, hot steam bath therapy, acupuncture and plantain leaf bath etc.

- Rs.2.00 Crore has been sanctioned for the supply of Nilavembu Kudineer and for IEC activities under NAM 2018-19.
- Rs.2.00 Crore has been sanctioned for the supply of Amma Magaperu Sanjeevi Kit under NAM 2018-19.
- 21 co-located ISM wings will be upgraded under NAM 2018-19 sanctioned in supplementary SAAP.

## 6.31 National AYUSH Mission:

In the year 2014, Government of India have constituted National AYUSH Mission (NAM), comprising the components of;

- 1. AYUSH Services.
- 2. AYUSH Educational Institutions.
- 3. Quality Control of Ayurveda, Siddha, Unani and Homoeopathy Drugs.
- 4. Improving of Medicinal Plants.

"State AYUSH Society – Tamil Nadu" is formed to implement the Schemes sanctioned to the State under the National AYUSH Mission. The Schemes are implemented by the Society out of the funds received from the Government based on the sharing pattern in the ratio of 60:40. From the year 2015-16 to 2017-18, a total of Rs.80.92 Crore was received. For the year 2018-19 Schemes were approved for an amount of Rs. 38.76 Crore in the State Annual Action Plan and supplementary have been received.

## Chapter - 7

## FOOD SAFETY AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION DEPARTMENT

## **Food Safety Department**

## 7.1 Creation of New Department:

The Food Safety and Standard Act 2006 replaced multiple Act like Prevention of Food Adulteration Act Milk order, Meet order and oil order as a single Act to ensure Safety and Standard of food. This act was implemented from 05.08.2011 and Tamil Nadu Food Safety Department was created on 22.12.2011 as per the provisions of this Act.

#### 7.2 Infrastructure:

The department is headed by the Commissioner of Food Safety at State level who is assisted by the Additional Commissioner, other supportive Staff at State Level and 32 Designated Officers (at the rate of one per district) at Districts and 584 Food Safety Officers (in 385 Blocks and 199 Urban areas) to implement the new Act. Six Food Laboratories established at Chennai, Thanjavur, Madurai, Salem, Coimbatore and Palayamkottai have been notified under the Food Safety and Standards Act for testing food samples.

## 7.4 Activities:

- Periodical awareness meetings are conducted to Food Business Operators and Consumers and their defects are rectified. Food safety Act, 2006 is being implemented in co-operation with the Food Business Operators and Consumers.
- Periodical inspection by Designated Officers/Food Safety Officers in the Food Manufacturing units, storage chambers, Distribution places and selling places to prevent selling any adulterated food.
- Hotels and Canteens are being inspected for cleanliness and the workers are given training to handle food hygienically and to prepare safe food.
- Noon meal centres, Anganwadi Centres are inspected regularly and the workers are trained in providing safe and hygienic food to the children and keep the premises clean and tidy. Hostels are inspected regularly and given awareness to provide safe food to the students.
- Providing License and Registration of all Food Business Operators including Street Vendors.
- Follow up of samples reported as Unsafe / Misbranded / Substandard filing cases for both Civil and Criminal cases.
- Food products such as Milk, oil, Tea, water, fruits, vegetables, and masala products are monitored periodically and analysed for adulteration by lifting samples.
- Mosquito borne diseases are prevented by finded the mosquito breeding places in Food Manufacturing units and action being taken to destroy them.

- To ensure hygiene in slaughter houses periodical inspections are carried out.
- Selling the banned Panmasala, Gutkha and other food products containing tobacco or nicotine are monitored and destroyed.
- Complaint redressal system created for consumers to file complaints/ grievances.
- To detect adulteration in food items the students of Higher Secondary School in all Districts have been trained with "Detection of Adulteration with Rapid Tests (DART)".
- Safe and Nutrition food at school (SNF@School) is a nation-wide campaign to help school children inculcate the habit of eating safe and eating right (Student are the most susceptible to food-borne diseases and due to their lack of awareness, are open to experimenting with food and diet while at school). Tamil Nadu Food Safety Department has piloted this programme in Chennai Corporation, it has been extended to 10 Corporations. State level training and district level training for all corporation schools for the 10 Corporations has been completed. School level SNF@School programme is being conducted in the 10 corporations.

## 7.5 DRUGS CONTROL ADMINISTRATION - 2018-2019

**7.5.1 INTRODUCTION:** The Drugs Control Administration has the prime objective of ensuring the availability of quality drugs and cosmetics without any short supply to the consumers by enforcing the provisions of the Drugs and Cosmetics Act, 1940, Drugs and Cosmetics Rules, 1945, Medical Devices Rules 2017, Drugs Prices Control Order 2013 and Drugs & Magic Remedies (Objectionable Advertisements) Act, 1954 and Rules, 1955. The Director of Drugs Control is the controlling and Licensing Authority for Grant of licensing to manufacture of Allopathic Drugs and Cosmetics after the joint inspections of the State and Central Governments. He is also Licensing Authority for Blood Banks and the Drugs Controller General of India, New Delhi is the Central Licensing Approving Authority for the same. There are 14 Zonal offices, one Mobile squad and a Drugs Testing laboratory are functioning under the control of the Director of Drugs Control. The Zonal Assistant Directors of Drugs Control are the Licensing authority for sales concerns.

## 7.5.2 ACTIVITIES OF THE DRUGS CONTROL ADMINISTRATION:

This Directorate is enforcing the provisions of

- 1. Drugs and Cosmetics Act, 1940, Drugs and Cosmetics Rules 1945, Medical Devices Rules, 2017 and New Drugs and Clinical Trials Rules, 2019.
- 2. Drugs and Magic Remedies Act (OA) 1954 and Rules, 1955
- 3. Drugs Price Control Order 2013 by conducting inspections and investigations at the places where Drugs are Stocked/Manufactured for sale or for distribution.

If any non-compliances were observed, administrative action or launching of prosecutions against the offenders are being carried out.

- 55. During the month of Dec 2018, cosmetics worth of Rs.15,000/- have been seized at the premises of M/s. S.N. Laboratories, Chennai-57 for the contravention of section 18(c) of the Drugs and Cosmetic Act, 1940 for having stocked the cosmetics for sale without Licence.
- 56. During the month of Dec 2018, drugs worth of Rs. 12,400/- have been seized at the premises of M/s. Santhosh Marketing, Madurai for the contravention of section 18(c) for having stocked the drugs for the sale without licence under the provisions of the Drugs and Cosmetic Act, 1940.
- 57. During the month of Feb 2019, drugs worth of Rs. 1,91,850/- have been seized at the premises of M/s. J.S. Pharma, Coimbatore for the contravention of section 18(c) for having stocked the drugs for the sale without licence under the provisions of the Drugs and Cosmetic Act, 1940.
- 58. During the month of Feb 2019, drugs worth of Rs. 60,000/- have been seized at the premises of M/s. Evalifescience, Ramapuram, Chennai -89 for the contravention of section 18(c) for having stocked the drugs for the

- sale without licence under the provisions of the Drugs and Cosmetic Act, 1940.
- 59. During the month of Feb 19 Food Safety and Drugs Administration directorate has conducted surprise raids to check for the sale of abortion pills without valid prescription of the registered medical practitioner and 5 cases have been initiated.
- 60. During the month of March 2019, drugs worth of Rs. 2,58,000/- have been seized at the premises of M/s. Sunrise Biotech, Chennai-03 for the contravention of section 18(c) for having stocked the drugs for the sale without licence under the provisions of the Drugs and Cosmetic Act, 1940.
- 61. On 25.03.19 and 26.03.19 special Teams have been formed to conduct surprise raids at Coonoor, Ooty and Cosmetics worth of Rs. 4,00,000/-have been seized at certain premises for the contravention of section 18(c) for having manufactured for stocked and sold the cosmetics without licence under the provisions of the Drugs and Cosmetic Act, 1940.

This directorate has conducted surprise raids to check for the sale of abortion pills without valid prescription of the registered medical practitioner and 32 cases have been field for inquiry.

## Chapter - 8

## TAMIL NADU STATE HEALTH TRANSPORT DEPARTMENT

**8.1** Tamil Nadu State Health Transport Department is a service oriented Department entrusted with the maintenance of all the Health and Family Welfare Department vehicles spread over the state. The Department was made as a separate Directorate in the year 1981 and since then it has made several significant strides, as it passed through different phases of development.

## 8.2 Activities:

The primary activity of this Department is the maintenance of vehicles attached to the Health and Family Welfare Department in an effective and economical manner. It also acts as a repository for all data related to vehicles maintained by it. In co-ordination with the Vehicle Owning Officers, this Department identifies aged and obsolete model vehicles that are uneconomical for further retention and take steps for their condemnation and speedy disposal. Overall, it provides complete solutions to all issues encountered by Medical Officers and Drivers in the operation, maintenance, condemnation and disposal of vehicles.

## **8.6 Training Programmes:**

Apprenticeship training was imparted to eligible ITI Certificate holders, Diploma holders and Engineering graduates in the workshops attached to this

department. To acquire as well as to update the knowledge possessed by the department's technical staff in the repairs and maintenance of various type of vehicles, as part of Human Resources Development, training was given on a regular basis to several staff batches at the Vehicle Manufacturers' exclusive training centres at Pune, Chennai and Coimbatore.

## 8.7.1 Effective Periodical Servicing:

Periodical Servicing rendered on time to vehicles would avoid break down and would prolong the life of various assemblies in the vehicle. Effective monitoring of the periodical Servicing rendered to the vehicles by the 29 Mobile Workshops of this Department had yielded better results.

## 8.7.2 Jobs Undertaking:

The number of vehicles delivered after satisfactory completion of repairs by this Department had increased. All kind of repairs including major and second-line works were executed and the vehicles were delivered on time.

The Material requirements would include requests for Tyres and Batteries and the Service requirements would include requests for attending breakdowns, periodical

servicing and oil replacement. All the requests received through this facility were immediately fulfilled by this Department.

#### 8.7.5 Minimum detention Period:

All measures were taken to ensure that all the vehicles admitted in the Workshops were delivered at the earliest by giving special emphasis was given to the Maintenance of Hospital on Wheel vehicles. Hospital On Wheel vehicles and other vehicles admitted in the Workshops (irrespective of the magnitude of defects / damages) have been delivered within a maximum detention period of 20 and 30 days respectively.

This Department on request placed by a competent authority, appraises and evaluates the fabrication work executed in vehicles that includes Ambulances and Hearse vehicles.

  - 1,41,553 Post-natal mothers delivered in the PHCs and 47,267 have undergone sterilization of 1,21,858 have been provided with diet (Apr 2018 – March - 2019)

#### 9.4 National Urban Health Mission:

**10.1** The Tamil Nadu Urban Healthcare Project is being implemented by Government of Tamil Nadu with funding support from Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA), a unit of Government of Japan. The project period is from July 2016 to March 2023 for a period of 7 years. The total project cost is Rs.1,634 Crores, out of which Rs. 1,388 Crores will be borne by JICA as soft loan and Rs. 245.6 Crores will be borne by Government of Tamil Nadu. The project agreement was signed on 31.03.2016. The Administrative sanction for the project was provided by the Government on 08.09.2016. The Government orders for the establishment of Project Management Unit, establishment of Tamil Nadu Urban Healthcare Society, establishment of State Empowered Committee have been received and that the PMU and Tamil Nadu Urban Healthcare Society have been formed on 01.07.2017 and 24.07.2017 respectively. The Consultant firm to work out the drawings for the buildings has been hired and the concept drawings and rough cost estimate for the buildings to be constructed are getting ready. The construction of the buildings for the hospitals is expected to be started during the end of the year 2019. The Equipment survey for all the 21 hospitals have been completed. The Equipment for the 14 hospitals where buildings are not provided will be procured during the year 2019.

The project had spent an amount of Rs.9,78,97,609/- during the financial year 2018 - 19.

#### Chapter - 11

#### TAMIL NADU MEDICAL SERVICES CORPORATION LIMITED

#### 11.1 Organization:

Tamil Nadu Medical Services Corporation (TNMSC) Limited was incorporated as a Company under Companies Act, 1956, on 01.07.1994. Since then, it has grown in functional importance and stature and its activities have expanded from procurement and supply of drugs, high end medical equipment for providing diagnostic facilities to various medical institutions in the State and management of CT & MRI Scan Centres. It is now an ISO 9001:2015 Certified Organization.

#### 11.2 Purchase of Drugs and Medicines:

During 2018-19, Drugs and Medicines are procured to an extent of Rs.691.95 crores from the funds deposited by the Directorates. The value of procurement of Drugs and Medicines made in the last 7 years are given hereunder:

The availability of drugs for distribution to various Government medical institutions through the warehouses in the State is ensured by closely monitoring the stock position and the procurement process through computerized inventory management system. By effective communication system, availability of sufficient stocks at the warehouses are ensured and the stock position is made accessible to the Medical Institutions.

During 2018-19, a flagship programme "Amma Maternal and Child Health Nutrition Kit" has been launched by Hon'ble Chief Minister and funds to the tune of Rs.119.50 crores has been earmarked for effective implementation.

#### 11.3 Storage and Distribution:

The Government Medical Institutions are provided with pass books based on the allotment made by the respective Head of Departments to enable the institutions to draw their requirement of drugs and medicines from the warehouse to which they are attached. The Corporation maintains about four months' physical stock in the warehouses and two months' stock in pipeline for ensuring uninterrupted supply of medicines to hospitals.

#### 11.4 Quality Control:

The Corporation has established a Quality Control Section to ensure quality of drugs procured. Samples are drawn from each batch of supply and tested in empanelled analytical laboratories to ensure the quality of drugs. Only the drugs which pass quality tests are issued to hospitals. The quality control measures are being upgraded to further improve the quality and to meet the new challenges in the field.

#### 11.6 Advanced Diagnostic Facilities:

#### **CT Scanners:**

In the year 2017-18, 25 existing Single Slice/4 Slice CT Scanners which had served more than 10 years have been replaced with new 16 Slice CT scanners. At present, the Corporation is maintaining 73 CT Scanners (three 128 slice, one 64 slice, forty four 16 slices, twenty one 4 slices and four single slice CT scanners), at 58 Centres in Government Medical Institutions/Hospitals and all the CT scanners are also operated and maintained under user charges collection basis. The Corporation is collecting charges at the rate of Rs.500/-per scan for both in-patients and out-patients and an additional amount of Rs.300/- for contrast cases. For the 64 Slice and 128 Slice CT Scanners user charge is at Rs.3,000/- per scan.

During the year 2017-18, 18 new CT Scan Centres have been established by TNMSC with 18 CT Scanners in the following centres at an outlay of Rs.31.67 Crores.

The Corporation is also operating and maintaining 19 MRI Scanners at 17 centres in 16 Government Medical College Hospitals and one District Head Quarters Hospital and providing MRI scan facility to the public at a nominal charge of Rs.2500/- and an additional amount of Rs.1500/- for contrast cases.

Further 5 Nos. 1.5 Tesla MRI under Public Private Partnership (PPP) mode are established in the Government Medical College Hospitals at Kanyakumari, Thoothukudi, Theni, Sivagangai and Tiruvarur and one No. of 0.35 Tesla MRI Scanner at Government Hospital, Udhagamandalam [Under PPP mode].

In addition to the above, during the year 2017-18, 13 more 1.5 Tesla MRI Scanners have been established by TNMSC in the following centres at an

outlay of Rs.45.00 Crores. Out of 13 centres, 10 Scanners have been installed in the centres and in remaining 3 places, the works are in progress.

- iii. Pay ward (Maternity) at Kasturba Gandhi Hospital for Women and Children, Chennai, was established in May 2004.
- iv. Pay ward at Rajiv Gandhi Government General Hospital, Chennai, was established in Jan 2008.

#### 11.8 Consultancy Services:

TNMSC Ltd, is a well-known brand name in Drug Logistics and Warehousing for the whole country. Many States in the country are emulating the principles followed by this Corporation. TNMSC Ltd. has rendered consultancy services on the drug logistic system to Government of Andhra Pradesh, Madhya Pradesh and Rajasthan. TNMSC is procuring and supplying drugs to the Lakshadweep Administration (Department of Health Services). Delegates from various States are visiting TNMSC regularly on taking note of the best practices followed by the Corporation, appreciating the transparent, efficient, economical and rational drug logistic system followed by the Corporation and they are in the process of replicating the same in their respective States.

#### Chapter - 12

#### **TAMIL NADU STATE AIDS CONTROL SOCIETY (TANSACS)**

- **12.1** Tamil Nadu has been successful in reducing the HIV/AIDS prevalence rate to 0.27%, with an effective leadership, efficient administration with the help of civil society, NGOs and commitment of all the stake holders. The annual budget to Tamil Nadu for the year 2018-19 is Rs.7,297.78 lakh for the following programmes.
- 12.2 Targeted Intervention (TI): With an aim to create awareness among High risk & Vulnerable population and to prevent HIV/AIDS, Targeted Intervention (TI) projects are implemented through NGOs/CBOs among FSW (Female Sex Workers), MSM (Men having Sex with Men), IDU (Injecting Drug Users), Transgender (TG), Migrant and Truckers etc. As per the approved Annual Action Plan 2018-19, Existing 71 and newly approved 17 New TIs implemented through NGOs/CBOs, totally 88 are ongoing. The approved budget for TI programme is Rs.1,771.99 lakh, out of which an amount of Rs.927.24 lakh has been spent up to March 2019.
- 12.3 LINK WORKER SCHEME: Link Workers Scheme (LWS) is implemented in 15 districts to provide prevention, care continuum of services to rural based High Risk Groups, vulnerable population and bridge population (Truckers/Migrants). 100 villages based on the epidemiological profile are selected in each of these districts and HIV related services. As per the approved Annual Action Plan 2018-19, 15 LWS programme were sanctioned and are ongoing. The approved budget for TI programme is Rs.406.98 lakh, out of which an amount of Rs.288.47 lakh has been spent up to March 2019.

#### 12.4 Blood Safety:

Blood transfusion service is an integral part of health care system. It is committed to provide adequate, safe and quality blood and blood components to meet the needs of the general public in the State. It aims to achieve 100% collection of blood from voluntary non-remunerated donors and also enhance the rational usage of blood and blood components. TANSACS supports 89 blood banks which are functioning in Government Hospitals in the districts. The following institutions are functioning to adequate, safe and quality blood and blood components to the needy patients

**12.6 Sexually Transmitted Infection / Reproductive Tract Infection (STI/RTI) Services:** TANSACS supports 157 Designated STI/RTI Clinics (DSRCs) in Government Medical College Hospitals, Government Headquarters Hospitals and Government Hospitals. These clinics are branded as "SUGA VAZHVU MAIYAM" (SURAKSHA – Well being clinics). One trained STI Counselor is working at each of the Designated STI/RTI Clinic for counseling on STI/RTI and HIV-transmission & Prevention, treatment compliance, follow up, Partner Treatment and Condom Promotion. Medical Officers, Staff Nurse and Laboratory Technician from each hospital are trained on Syndromic Case Management. All STI/RTI outpatient attendees are screened for Syphilis and HIV along with other basic investigations. All HRGs are screened for STI, every three months and Syphilis and HIV, every six months.

Since 2018, there are 52 Health facilities to activate as Non-DSRCs in lieu of the closure of 46 TI NGO based STI Clinics. This initiative will not have any cost implication other than supply of colour coded kits and STI case cards to the Non - DSRCs. As a routine practice, the designated medical officers has been trained on Syndromic Case Management by TANSACS at regional levels. These clinics are submitted reports as usual by SIMs. At present, 216 DSRCs are functioning and reporting at SIMS.

The approved budget for the programme for the year 2018-19 is Rs.258.06 lakh, out of which, an amount of Rs.232.92 lakhs has been spent up to March 2019.

**12.7 Integrated Counseling and Testing Centres (ICTC):** A total numbers of 39,81,907 General Clients and 12,90,277 Nos. of Ante-Natal (AN) mothers have been counselled and tested for the period of April 2018 to March 2019 through the presently functioning 2618 Nos. of Integrated Counseling and Testing Centres (ICTC) "Nambikkai Maiyam", where providing HIV counselling and testing services in Tamil Nadu.

During the Financial Year- 2018-19, 244 numbers of HIV testing / screening facilities have been successfully established and functioning in additional PHC's, which includes of 80 Nos. in Targeted Intervention programme NGOs in the State.

- **12.8 Care, Support and Treatment (CST):** The key objective of this division is to provide base line investigations and CD4 count, screening for and treatment of opportunistic infections (OIs), counseling services and provision of Anti retroviral (ARV) drugs to all PLHIV. These services are currently rendered through 55 ART centres. In addition, 174 Link ART centres which are nearer to the houses of PLHIVs, act as drug dispensing units. At present, 1,17,700 PLHIVs are taking regular ART treatment in Tamil Nadu.
- 12.9 Tamil Nadu Trust for Children Affected by AIDS (TNTCAA): With a view to provide welfare measures to the children affected and orphaned by HIV/AIDS, Tamil Nadu Trust for Children Affected by AIDS was formed by the Government of Tamil Nadu and sanctioned Rs.5.00 crore in 2008-09, which has been deposited as Corpus Fund in Tamil Nadu Power Finance Corporation. In order to provide additional financial assistance, the Government of Tamil Nadu has sanctioned an amount of Rs.5.00 crore additionally in 2011-12 to TNTCAA to help 1,000 more children, who are infected and affected by HIV/AIDS. The interest accrued against the deposited amount is being utilized as financial assistance for education, medical treatment and nutritious supplement to children affected and infected by HIV/AIDS. In the year 2018-19, a sum of Rs.94.80 lakh have been disbursed to 3,736 children infected and affected by HIV/AIDS.
- 12.10 Information, Education and Communication (IEC): The Information, Education and Communication activities are an integral part of all activities of TANSACS. The activities tend to motivate behavioral changes in a cross-section of specific population, reduction of stigma and discrimination and demand generations for HIV/AIDS services. Dissemination of messages related to HIV awareness through Mass Media, outdoor activities like the campaigns, events, shows, outreach activities, branding of buses and trains, erecting temporary and permanent hoarding with relevant messages to the programme, exhibit panels/ standees and other publicity materials has an informed reach among the target group.
- **12.11 Mainstreaming:** Under mainstreaming HIV/AIDS response, front line workers and personnel from various departments, Civil Society Organizations

and corporate sector have been trained. The major initiatives with various departments during the current financial year are:

**12.12 Greater Involvement for the People Living with HIV/AIDS (GIPA):** Tamil Nadu State AIDS Control Society (TANSACS) has envisaged building of experience by strengthening the organizations of PLHIVs at the State and the District level by promoting GIPA through sensitizing the implementing agencies (Government, Public, Private Sectors and Civil Society) and created an enabling environment for enhanced involvement of PLHIVs in the State.

- Establishment of PLHIVs network in all the districts
- People living with HIV/AIDS as staff in ICTCs and ARTs as Community Counselors
- Established State level grievances redressal mechanism and free legal services through legal clinics
- Improving skills of PLHIVs as positive speakers at the district level by providing capacity building trainings
- Tamil Nadu is the fore-front State in providing social benefit schemes for the PLHIVs as follows:
  - 1. Monthly pension of Rs.1,000/- under Hon'ble Chief Minister's Uzhavazar Pathukappu Thittam is being provided to 10,348 PLHIVs.
  - 2. Free bus passes for 53,415 PLHIVs to take ARV medications

- 3. Top priority for the PLHIVs in Widow and OAP pension schemes
- 4. Anth Yodaya Anna Yojana (AAY) Scheme
- 5. Hon'ble Chief Minister's Solar Powered Green House Scheme
- **12.13 Hello+ Helpline 1800 419 1800:** The Hello Plus Toll Free Help Line-1800 419 1800 operates to inform the right information about HIV and AIDS, STI and also to clear the myths, misconception and doubts about HIV and AIDS by routing the callers to the service centres directly. This also helps to support PLHIVs and their family members, relieving self stigma of PLHIVs by supporting and helping them and their families. This toll free helpline works 24x7 attending calls soliciting information about the testing and positive prevention. So far 1,18,858 callers have been benefited through this service.
- **12.14 Red Ribbon Club:** Red Ribbon Club programme in 2,179 Colleges has been working on raising the youth risk perception, behavioral changes among them by awareness programmes. This programme covers Arts and Science, Polytechnic, Engineering, Medical, B.Ed Colleges and Teacher Training Institutions. Nearly, Rs.31.66 lakhs has been released to cover the program under Universities in the Financial Year 2018-19.
- **12.15** Life Skill Education Program in schools: Life Skill Education Programme (LSEP) in schools is being conducted through State Council of Educational Research and Training (SCERT) and covered 9,580 schools. Steps have been taken to cover nearly 10,000 Schools.
- **12.16 Strategic Information Management System (SIMS):** Strategic and Management (SIMS) is a web based integrated online monitoring and evaluation system, rolled out in Tamil Nadu, since 15-09-2011. 29 District AIDS Prevention and Control Units (DAPCU), 3 non DAPCU districts and the NGOs implementing targeted interventions have been connected over net to update the monthly data.

#### Chapter - 13

#### MEDICAL SERVICES RECRUITMENT BOARD

**13.1** Medical Services Recruitment Board has been constituted in January 2012 as per G.O. Ms. No. 1 Health and Family Welfare Department dated 02.01.2012 with an objective to centralize the direct recruitments in various directorates in order to fill –up the vacancies in a speedy manner to various categories of posts including Medical and Para-Medical categories in the Health and Family Welfare Department to ensure timely provision of health care services to the public. The Medical Services Recruitment Board is first of its kind in India, started functioning with effect from 06.02.2012.

#### 13.2 Annual Performance of Medical Services Recruitment Board:

The Medical Services Recruitment Board has so far recruited **26,777** (10,931 – Doctors, 9,533 – Nurses, 6,313 – Paramedical / Technical posts) candidates for the following categories of posts till **31.03.2019** since its inception in 2012.



#### Chapter - 14

#### CHIEF MINISTER'S COMPREHENSIVE HEALTH INSURANCE SCHEME

**14.1** In order to provide quality health care services to the families particularly below the poverty line, by extending health insurance coverage to them at the rate of Rupees one lakh per year, the Government launched the flagship scheme of Chief Minister's Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme at the annual total cost of around Rs.750 crore every year since 2012 and the scheme has been implemented at the annual cost of Rs.928 crore for 2016-17. So far 1.58 crore smart cards have been distributed to the families under poverty line. Currently 733 Private hospitals and 244 Government Hospitals have been empaneled under the scheme. From the inception of the scheme in 2012, till 10.01.2017, 17.30 lakh persons have been benefited under the scheme with an approved treatment value of Rs.3,400.26 crore. Out of them 6.94 lakh persons were treated in Government Hospitals with an approved treatment value of Rs.1,163.07 crore.

The Chief Minister's Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme being continued from 11.01.2017 for specialized procedures Insurance coverage has been raised from Rs.1.50 lakh to Rs.2.00 lakh. This scheme covers 1027 procedures which include 154 specialized procedures (Rs.2.00 lakh Insurance coverage), 38 important diagnostics procedures, 154 follow up procedures and 8 High End Procedures. Premium of Rs.1084.18 crores (inclusive of service tax) @Rs.699 per annum per family has been paid for the first policy year (11.01.2017 to 10.01.2018). From 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> years, 95% of the annual premium will be paid at the commencement of that year itself and the balance 5%will be paid at the end of the year on satisfactory implementation of the scheme. Premium of Rs.1,200.87 Crores for the Second policy year (11.01.2018 to 10.01.2019) and Rs.979.58 Crores (95% of annual premium) for the third policy year (11.01.2019 to 10.01.2020) has been paid to the Insurance company Government have sanctioned Rs.1,263.00 crores in the Budget Estimate for 2019 -2020 towards premium payment.

As on date (11.01.2017 to 31.03.2019) 10.68 lakhs persons have been benefited under the scheme for insurance coverage of Rs.1,818.13crores. Out of this 4.80 lakhs beneficiaries have been treated in Government Hospitals for Insurance coverage for Rs.662.06 crores.

Totally under CMCHIS so for 27.99 lakhs persons have been benefited for insurance coverage of Rs.5,218.40 crores.

With effect from 23.09.2018 CMCHISTN is integrated with Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana of Govt of India.

**14.2 Corpus Fund under Chief Minister's Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme:** The Government have sanctioned Rs.10 crores for creating corpus fund under the Chief Minister's Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme, since 2012 to enable the needy and poor people to undergo high cost surgical treatment like liver transplantation, renal transplantation, bone marrow transplantation, etc. as per the orders of the Hon'ble Chief Minister. As per G.O. (Ms) No.320 Health and Family Welfare Dept. dt:19.11.2012, 12.5% of claims amount in Government hospitals under CMCHIS was credited to corpus fund to mobilize funds. As per the G.O. (Ms) No.22 Health and Family Welfare Dept. dated:21.01.2016, an additional amount of Rs.25 Crores has been sanctioned and further to sustain the scheme, the revised sharing pattern for Government institution has been raised from 12.5% to 27%. Under this fund, the excess amount over the annual ceiling limit of Rs. 2/-lakh for specialized surgeries will be met.

High End Procedures viz.,. 1.Heart transplantation 2.Lung transplantation 3.Heart and Lung transplantation 4.Auditory Brain Stem Implantation are added in the new policy. As on 31.03.2019, 7,588 persons have been benefited and the total approved amount is Rs.563.03 crores.

**14.3 Integration of the Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (PMJAY)with the ongoing CMCHIS:** The Government of Tamil Nadu have issued orders for the integration of PMJAY along with CMCHIS in the State in GO (Ms) No.323 H & F W Dept. Dated 02.08.2018 and all the beneficiary families of CMCHIS will also get enhanced coverage of upto Rs.5.00 lakh per year / per family including all packages.

The MoU in this regard has been signed by GoI & GoTN on 11.09.2018. The inauguration of the scheme launched on 23.09.2018 by Hon'ble Prime Minister at National level and by Hon'ble Health Minister at State level. Under the scheme in Tamil Nadu around 77,70,928 poor and deprived rural families and identified occupational category of urban workers in the SECC data have been identified.

The hospitals empaneled under CMCHIS will provide coverage for PMJAY also including portability to treat other State PMJAY beneficiaries.

#### Chapter - 15

#### **Emergency Ambulance Services '108' and Free Hearse Service**

#### 15.1 108 Ambulance Service:

- 108 -Free Ambulance Service was launched on 15.09.2008 in Tamil Nadu.
- This service is being provided to the people of Tamil Nadu 24 x 7 by the Government of Tamil Nadu.
- May 18, 2017 Honorable Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu flagged off 25 new 108 Ambulances.
- November 2, 2017 Honorable Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu flagged of 22 new 108 ambulances
- Presently, 940 Ambulances are being operated covering all the Districts of Tamil Nadu.
- Based on the population, accident prone areas, hilly terrain and remote areas which are difficult to reach, the 108 ambulances are deployed across 32 Districts of Tamil Nadu.

#### 15.3 Neo Natal Ambulance Service:

The Neonatal ambulance service was launched on 29<sup>th</sup> June 2011.

This Ambulance is equipped with Transport Neonatal Ventilator, Transport Incubator with Oxygen Cylinder, Multi Para Monitor, Oxygen Cylinder, Glucometer, Syringe Infusion Pump and life saving medicines. At present 65 Neonatal ambulances are functioning in all the 32 Districts.

#### 15.4 Four wheel Drive:

The Honorable Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu launched the new 30 four wheel drive ambulance services on 25.06.2014, to reach the remote and hilly terrain areas, Particularly, Maternal and child health services for the tribal people. At present in Tamil Nadu 76 four wheel drive ambulances are functioning.

#### 15.5 Emergency Care Centre (ECC):

#### ECC - Tambaram , Padyanallur , Injambakkam and Mahabalipuram:

Emergency care centre have been established in Tambaram, Injambakkam, Mahabalipuram and Padiyanallur to stabilize the patients in case of long distance travel and functioning well. At this center, the Road traffic victims are being stabilized and referred to Medical College Hospital for expert management. This center has the facility with advance life saving equipments like Ventilator, Defibrillator, Multi Para Monitor essential life saving medicines, emergency care trained Medical Officers, emergency management trained staff nurses on shift basis.

Also under road safety activity it has been approved to establish similar ECC in 10 Government Hospitals situated in the National Highways. Apart from that 5 Mobile Trauma care Units has been approved. Action is in progress for the setting up of the above centers.

A separate mobile application has been launched for the use of public to identify the exact location of the accident scene ("Avasaram 108")

All the ambulances are fitted with GPS device and integrated with the 108 Emergency Response Centre. Presently, when someone in distress calls 108 Emergency Response Centre, details about the caller's District, Taluk, and Village and nearby landmark are collected verbally by the Emergency Response officer and the ambulance is dispatched. On a daily average 14,000 calls are being received by the 108 Emergency Response Centre. When the caller is new to the geography or in a panic State of mind, will find it a challenge to provide

details of the place of calling (District, Taluk etc.), Under these circumstance, the new mobile application for Android Mobile phone will enable the 108 Emergency Response Centre Officer to view in the computer caller's geographic location precisely, locate the ambulance through GPS and dispatch the nearest ambulance to the caller swiftly.

This would lead to further reduction in Response Time. Presently the average Response time for urban area is at 14 minutes, rural area is at 17 minutes and for Road Traffic accident it is less than 13.42 minutes. This new mobile application has been designed to work even without internet Connection (Data / GPRS). This application uses DTMF technology to determine the callers' location without internet connection. It is the first of its kind mobile application for 108 Emergency Response Services in the Country. This special feature is an initiative by the Government of Tamil Nadu to enable even the rural and tribal population with feeble mobile network coverage to have access to its 108 Emergency Response Service.

At present 70 Emergency Response Officers have DTMF (Dual Tone Multi Frequency) enabled system to receive calls from this mobile App without internet connection. This would be extended to all other systems gradually.

#### 15.6 Mobile Application for the use of 108 Ambulance Pilots (Drivers):

In order to enable the 108 ambulance Pilots (Driver) to reach the caller swiftly through the shortest route, a special Android Mobile Application has been designed. Details of the distress caller will be shared by the 108 Emergency Response Centre to the Pilot through this mobile Application. For this purpose, all 108 ambulances would be provided with Android mobile phones. Upon receiving the information of the Callers's location the 108 ambulance pilot can start navigating with the map shown in the mobile app. This will enable the Pilot to reach the caller with reduced response time through shortest route. This will be a great tool locating the caller in difficult geographical terrain, during nights, when the pilot is new to the geography, and when the caller is not able to clearly communicate his or her location.

All ambulance has been given Smart Phone with pilot app installed, which enabled 108 ambulance pilots to navigate swiftly to the scene location.

#### 15.7 Response Time Reduction:

Because of the innovative initiatives such as launch of **Avarasam 108 App**, **Pilot App**, **GPS** fitment in ambulance, by accident grid and cluster analysis, scientific deployment of ambulance, Response Time to emergency by

108 has been reduced drastically. Response Time of 108 ambulances in over all metro was reduced to 8 minutes and 12 seconds setting new benchmark with global standards and Road Traffic emergency across the state is responded on average in 8 minutes 04 seconds.

On 11<sup>th</sup> March 2018, 108 Emergency Response Service swiftly responded in the rescue and relief of victims of Kurangani forest fire accident and brought accolades from many quarters.

Presently 940 Ambulances are being operated across 32 districts of Tamil Nadu, which includes 76 Four Wheel Drive Ambulances, 60 Advanced Life Support Ambulances and 65 Neonatal ambulances. Adding to this fleet is the 41 First Responder bikes spread across major Towns and Cities of the State.

#### 15.8 First Responder Service by Bike Ambulances:

Hon'ble Chief Minister was launched Bike Ambulance Service on 08.02.2016. Initially the project was undertaken on a pilot basis in Chennai City. Now the metro cities to developed 41 First Responder Ambulance are functioning.

#### 15.9 Need for bike Ambulances as Pilot Project:

- Reduce Response time in City
- Gain access to areas inaccessible to Ambulance
- Enhance visibility for Emergency Management System
- Improve Public confidence on Emergency Management System
- Can be deployed at Mass Gathering events

#### 15.10 Primary Task of the Bike Ambulance:

The primary task of the bike Ambulance would be to

- Reach the scene of the emergency safely and timely
- Provide First aid as and when required
- ❖ Able to render medical care to those in need as early as possible till the 108 Ambulance reaches the site.

#### 15.11 Emergencies to be handled by the bike Ambulance:

The Bike ambulance is assigned for the following emergencies

- Trauma (Vehicular)
- Trauma (Non Vehicular)

- Fainting
- Cardiac Emergencies
- Fracture
- Animal attack
- Unconscious
- Diabetic

#### 15.12 Bike Ambulance and Mobile medical kit:

The Bikes have been procured and fabricated. First Aid Kit with emergency drugs and equipments with Comprehensive, portable, easy to handle at scene; stand for Portable O2 cylinder, blinkers, revolving lights and siren. Other accessories such as safety knee guards, helmets, Gloves, Mobile, GPS and Headsets etc are stocked.

#### 15.13 Personnel training:

TNEMRI has trained Emergency Management Technicians (EMT) those who are holding a valid driving license and having an aptitude for operating the Bike Ambulance are engaged in this service.

**15.14 Operations**: An integrated approach to the existing 108 Ambulance service would be adopted and the bike ambulances would be part of the existing 108 ambulance fleet Cases requiring regular ambulances would be assigned for shifting to hospitals. It is planned to extend this service to major metropolitan cities across the State.

So far 38,095 Persons have benefitted through this service.

#### 15.16 104 Health Help Line Service:

The Honorable Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu launched the 104 Health Help Line Services on 30.12.2013 at a cost of Rs.1.20 crores. This is a 24x7 service through which people can get information and counseling regarding health schemes and medical problems.

#### The Services provided by the 104 Health help Line

- Doctors and Health Professionals provide advice and information related to health problems
- It is a 24x7 service particularly; to pregnant mothers they provide the information regarding the medical facilities available in the hospitals near to them.
- Information regarding Government Schemes such as (CMCHIS)
   Chief Minister Comprehensive Health Insurance Schemes,
  - Dr. Muthulakshmi Reddy Maternity fund is provided through this service.
- Information regarding nutrition, HIV (AIDS), Family Welfare and counseling regarding suicidal tendency are being provided through the services.
- Doctors and Staff Nurses working in the remote areas are also provided by the information regarding, General Medicine, surgical procedures, Maternal and child health problems.
- Public can also make complaint / suggestions about functioning of any Government Health facility in the State.

#### 15.18 Free Hearse Service:

Free Hearse Service in Tamil Nadu is operational for the past 7 years on Public Private Partnership mode by signing an MOU with Indian Red Cross Society, Tamil Nadu Branch, and Chennai to transport the deceased from

Government Medical Institution to their house or cremation ground irrespective of the border line limitation within the state. This service can be utilized by calling centralized call center No.155377, So far 6,35,569 (up to Mar' 2019) number of cases have been transported since inception in 2011. At present 153 vehicles are in service.
