## **INTRODUCTION**

The Information and Public Relations Department functions effectively and efficiently with the sole aim of keeping the welfare and prosperity of the people of Tamil Nadu in mind by propagating among the public, the welfare schemes being implemented by the Government of Tamil Nadu which treads the path of former Chief Minister Puratchi Thalaivi Amma.

The Hon'ble Puratchi Thalaivi Amma pioneered innovative schemes which were not implemented in any of the states in India, prompting foreign governments to send their representatives to Tamil Nadu to study the schemes. After the demise of Puratchi Thalaivi Amma, The Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu Thiru. Edappadi K.Palaniswami, with ability and acumen, apart from continuing to implement such schemes, also

gives shape to ideas and implements new schemes in all departments required for Tamil Nadu.

The Information and Public Relations Department works with dedication and devotion in word and deed, in propagating to the people, the welfare schemes and achievements emanating from such schemes.

The Information and Public Relations Department executes this exemplary work through the Press Release Section, Photo Section, Reference Section, Memorial Section, Functions Section, Field Publicity Section, Advertisement Section, Exhibition Section, Tamil Nadu Films Division, Cine Workers Welfare Board, M.G.R. Government Film and Television Institute, Tamilarasu, State Information Centres and Information and Public Relations Offices in the Districts with efficiency.

#### PRESS RELEASE SECTION

The Press Release Section under the Information and Public Relations Department functions 24/7 from the Secretariat. This section is considered as the heart of the Information Department.

Press Notes of Hon'ble Chief Minister, Hon'ble Deputy Chief Minister and Hon'ble Ministers; Press Releases, Announcements pertaining to all Government Departments, Welfare Schemes, Developmental works; details of achievements, news relating to government functions participated by Hon'ble Chief Minister and Hon'ble Ministers, all news on the events relating to Government, video recordings and related photos are sent to dailies, news agencies, periodicals, internet news agencies, television channels numbering more than 325 through e-mail every day.

News about important events taking place at the Secretariat, video conferencing, their video clips and photos are uploaded in a modern way at high speed on the website of the Information and Public Relations department – www.tndipr.gov.in - for the use of media.

Important government functions and government related events in districts are immediately conveyed to the media through modern technology and steps are taken to telecast those coverages immediately. Important press releases and announcements made at Headquarters are also sent through e-mail, then and there to the district PROs in all districts and steps are taken to get them published at the district level.

Besides arranging publication of news and photos of important government functions and events held in districts participated by Hon'ble Chief Minister, Hon'ble Deputy Chief Minister and Hon'ble Ministers in the districts concerned, they are also obtained at the headquarters from the district PROs; and this Section distributes them to all newspapers and TV channels in Chennai.

This Section also extends all help and co-ordinates with media personnel to attend press conferences held by Hon'ble Chief Minister, Hon'ble Deputy Chief Minister and Hon'ble Ministers and help them in gathering news on government functions participated by Hon'ble Ministers,

Department Secretaries and District Collectors as well as the arrivals of VVIPs.

# JOURNALISTS WELFARE PENSION FOR JOURNALISTS

The Information and Public Relations Department plays an important role in safeguarding the welfare of journalists. Monthly pension is given to indigent journalists who have retired after putting in 20 years of service.

The pension which was Rs.5,000/-was hiked thrice to Rs.8,000/- after Hon'ble Puratchi Thalaivi Amma's Government took over the reins of administration in 2011. Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu Thiru. Edappadi K.Palaniswami who treads the path of Amma increased the pension for a fourth time on 21.09.2017 and presently Rs.10,000/- is paid as pension per month. A total of 196 journalists are getting monthly pension now.

The gratuity ceiling for eligibility to the pension scheme was increased from Rs.2 lakh to Rs.3 lakh from 2018 and the ceiling of annual income of journalists increased from Rs.2 lakh to Rs.3 lakh, so that more number of journalists benefit from this pension scheme.

#### **FAMILY PENSION**

The family pension is given to the family of the deceased journalist who was availing pension. **Hon'ble former chief minister Puratchi Thalaivi Amma** raised the family pension of Rs.2,500/-thrice after 2011 and distributed Rs.4,750/-. This Government that follows the footsteps of Amma hiked the family pension further and is giving Rs.5,000/- from 21.09.2017. Families of 38 journalists are presently getting this monthly family pension.

#### **FAMILY BENEFIT FUND**

Orders were issued on 30.07.2018 to distribute enhanced family assistance to the journalists from the Chief Minister's Public Relief Fund in the event of death of journalists while in service as editor, sub-editor, reporter, photographer and proof reader.

#### **WELFARE FUND**

Another gem of a scheme to safeguard the welfare of journalists is Journalists' Welfare Fund. For this, a permanent fund of Rs.one crore has been placed in fixed deposit with the Tamil Nadu Power Finance and Infrastructure Development Corporation and interest proceeds from it, is distributed towards medical expenses of journalists affected by severe illness while in service. The maximum amount so disbursed was Rs.50,000/-. The Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu Thiru. Edappadi K.Palaniswami have issued orders to increase this amount to Rs.1 lakh from 01.08.2018.

#### **GOVERNMENT RENTAL HOUSING**

Under government's discretionary quota, Tamil Nadu Housing Board flats in Chennai and other districts are allotted to journalists at low rent.

# **HOUSE SITES**

House site pattas are given through Revenue and Disaster Management Department to journalists working in newspapers and television channels in districts who do not own a house or house site, at concessional rates at the behest of District Collector.

#### **ACCREDITATION CARDS**

Accreditation cards are issued to journalists and photographers working in dailies and Television channels to facilitate them to cover government functions participated by Hon'ble Chief Minister and events participated by important VIPs.

#### **PRESS PASS**

ID cards are issued to journalists in periodicals so as to help them visit important places and publish articles, historical details and background information on news events in true perspective. In the current year, 865 journalists have been issued with ID cards.

### **BUS PASSES AT NO COST**

Bus passes at no cost are issued to all accredited journalists in the Headquarters every year to travel in the buses of Chennai and Villupuram Transport Corporations. Likewise, on the recommendation of the District Collector, bus passes at no cost are given to journalists in districts. During the Financial Year 2017-2018, bus passes at no cost have been

given to 3,916 journalists at an expenditure of Rs.1.81 crore.

#### **NEWS AGENCIES**

The news released by Press Trust of India (PTI) and United News of India (UNI) is being received 24 hours through computer in Raj Bhavan, Chennai and Press Release Section, Secretariat throughout the year. Important news items thus received from all over the country are brought to the notice of the Heads of Departments then and there for necessary action.

# INFORMATION AND PUBLIC RELATIONS DEPARTMENT WEBSITE

A website has been created by the Information and Public Relations Department www.tndipr.gov.in exclusively for the use of media and updated every minute. Government news, photos and video clippings are uploaded quickly facilitating the media to download the needed material instantly. It is not an exaggeration to mention that this website is very useful to Tamils all over the world, as well as to members of the public to know about the day-to-day happenings in the State.

#### **MEDIA CENTRE**

Media Centre, another component of this department is functioning all through the day. This Media Centre was created by the **Hon'ble former Chief Minister Puratchi Thalaivi Amma**. It has the facility to record Hon'ble Chief Minister's announcements and government related news as telecasted by 16 television channels. Also, it distributes press releases, press notes and photos released from the Secretariat to all the media houses in Chennai and also to the district I & PR officials for publication in district editions.

This Centre also gets feedback on daily basis from the I & PR officials in the districts on the publication of news in the district editions through e-mail and WhatsApp. The Centre also monitors continuously whether press releases related to Hon'ble Chief Minister, press notes and photos are published properly in district dailies.

### PHOTO SECTION

The Photo section is functioning from the Secretariat, Chennai. Photographs taken in the government functions / important events are sent to newspapers and media then and there through laptops with internet facility. Photographs of important events are displayed at the main building of the Secretariat and at the Tamil Nadu Illam in New Delhi.

Photographs and videos taken by this Section are preserved in CDs and in Hard Disks for future reference.

A photo exhibition set up at the valedictory function of the centenary celebration of Bharat Ratna Puratchi Thalaivar Dr.M.G.R. held at Chennai on 30.9.2018, received encomiums of the general public.

In tune with the developing technology, these photographs are taken in digital format with modern cameras. Also, this section has taken up the important task of preserving all these digitized photographs as historic documents.

## REFERENCE SECTION

The Reference Section is functioning from the Secretariat, Chennai. It brings to the attention of the government, important news published in dailies, periodicals and in dailies from other states, department-wise and under different heads.

Important news published in morning and evening newspapers, periodicals and in dailies from other states, are compiled as news clippings and sent to the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu and Hon'ble Deputy Chief Minister for their perusal. Every day these works start early in the morning and are carried out without any holiday.

Likewise, clippings on important news published in dailies and periodicals are also sent to Hon'ble Ministers, Chief Secretary to Government and Secretaries of the different departments every day.

Important news about the departments, published in dailies, are scanned and mailed to the secretaries concerned every morning and are also informed through SMS to their mobile phones. These SMS messages are also sent through Whatsapp.

For the sake of future needs, this section preserves compiled bound volumes of important news papers (Tamil and English). These are made available to the office of the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Hon'ble Deputy Chief Minister, department secretaries and officials on request during the Assembly sessions and as per the needs.

Old news papers are digitized using modern electronic equipment. Important news items published in news papers that are preserved by the Reference Section includes announcements of the Hon'ble Chief Minister, speeches, press meet, government's achievements and the welfare assistance distributed as also the editorials of dailies, articles and comments and the views of different political leaders are compiled under different heads and preserved.

## **MEMORIALS**

The Information and Public Relations Department on behalf of Tamil Nadu Government, has taken several steps to honour and commemorate, great personages who brought glory to Tamil Nadu, Tamil Savants who dedicated their entire life for the development of Tamil Language and Freedom Fighters who made innumerable sacrifices for our country.

The Department has set up 69 Memorials, 4 Arangams, 5 Commemoration Pillars and one Monument and maintains and preserves them in an exceptional way so that the younger generation can know about these great leaders and get benefitted.

Work is in progress to identify a place to set up a Manimandapam for Rettaimalai Seenivasan with statue and a library at Kozhiyalam village near Madurantakam, Kancheepuram district at an estimate of Rs.1 crore.

Work is in progress to identify a place to set up a Manimandapam for Thiru. V.K. Palaniswami Goundar with statue and a library at Vettaikaran Pudur, Coimbatore District at an estimate of Rs.1 crore.

Work is in progress to identify a place to set up a Manimandapam for Sir. A.T.Panneerselvam with statue in Tiruchirapalli District at an estimate of Rs.50 lakh.

Work is in progress to identify a place to set up a statue for Allala Ilaya Nayagar with dome at Jedarpalayam, Namakkal District at an estimate of Rs.30 lakh. The plan and estimate has been requested from Public Works Department for the renovation of Ondi Veeran Manimandapam in Tirunelveli District and also for setting up a library in the complex, at an estimate of Rs. 75 lakh.

#### SPECIAL FUNCTIONS ORGANIZED BY GOVERNMENT

Thiruvalluvar Day and Tamil Nadu Government's Award Distribution function is celebrated in a grand manner every year, jointly by the departments of Tamil Development and Information on the birth anniversary of Thiruvalluvar. In this function, Tamil scholars who brought glory to Tamil language are honoured with `Thiruvalluvar Award', `Thanthai Periyar Award', `Perarignar Anna Award', `Annal Ambedkar Award', `Perunthalaivar Kamarajar Award', `Mahakavi Bharathiar Award', `Paavendar Bharathidasan Award', `Thamizh Thendral Thiru.Vi.Ka Award', `Ki.Aa.Pe. Viswanatham Award'.

The function -"Achievements of Two Years"of Amma's Government headed by Hon'ble Chief Minister was celebrated at the Secretariat on 15.02.2019 in a grand manner.

#### FIELD PUBLICITY

With a view to enable people in remote villages to know about various schemes of the Government so that they can make use of them and also to document the Government's achievements in terms of benefits received by the people, for the first time, a new section known as the Field Publicity Section was started in the year 2013 by the then Chief Minister Hon'ble Puratchi Thalaivi Amma.

#### LED SCREEN VIDEO VAN

To improve the functioning of the Section further, 32 new LED Screen fitted vans with the state of the art technology have been given to all Districts. These new vans, with modern facilities, publicize Government schemes and achievements day and night at places where people gather in large numbers and also at the venues of Government functions.

The day-to-day movements of these LED Vans and the places, including the hamlets and village panchayats, Town panchayats, Municipalities and Corporations where the publicity work is undertaken, are monitored by the Field Publicity wing, through the GPS installed in the vans.

#### **LED TV SCREENS**

Field publicity is being carried out by installing LED Screens in all 32 District Collectorates where people visit in large numbers, in 10 Amma Canteens and in 3 Taluk offices in Chennai and at the Tamil Nadu House in New Delhi, through which News Magazines on government achievements produced by Information and Public Relations Department and short films on various Government schemes are continuously screened.

#### **EVALUATION OF THE PERFORMANCE OF OFFICERS**

Functions of District Public Relations Officers, such as organizing regular press meets, arranging tours for media personnel, publishing success stories in various dailies and magazines, screening video films, inspecting cinema theatres to ensure screening of Government 'News Magazines' and publishing special publications, are reviewed on a monthly basis.

Separate marks are awarded for each and every work by a committee comprising High level Officials from the Headquarters. This evaluation has helped in the removal of tardiness in work among the PROs, improved the functioning of the department, helped to compare the working of a

district PRO with other district PROs and in the promotion of a healthy competition among PROs, thus providing a new impetus in achieving the goals.

#### REFRESHER TRAINING COURSE

Refresher training is being offered to all District Information and Public Relations Officers and Assistant Public Relations Officers (Information and Publicity) every year. This year, the Refresher Training was conducted at Kalaivanar Arangam in Chennai on 20.02.2019 and 21.02.2019.

The training was provided by experienced officers, experts in ethics & psychology and experts in stress management. They covered the areas of innovative procedures in Government work and new tactics to improve efficiency and good governance.

Under the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act, 2012, to protect the children, a committee has been formed, consisting of Judges of Madras High Court. The committee has been taking various steps to protect the children. As a part of it, an awareness programme is being done by the Information and Public Relations Department through stickers, pamphlets, short films, jingles and wall posters.

## PUBLICIZING THE UNITED NATIONS SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS (SDG)

The United Nations General Assembly set a collection of 17 Goals in 2015 as Sustainable Development Goals for the year 2030.

They are, No Poverty; Zero Hunger; Good Health and Wellbeing; Quality Education; Gender Equality; Clean Water and Sanitation; Affordable and Clean Energy; Decent Work and Economic Growth; Industry, Innovation and Infrastructure; Reduced inequalities, etc.

The Information and Public Relations Department takes necessary action to propagate the above Sustainable Development Goals among the masses by way of Press Releases, Government Exhibitions, Photo Exhibitions, Tamilarasu Monthly Magazine and in coordination with other Government Departmens.

#### **ADVERTISEMENT**

To enable people to know fully about Tamil Nadu Government's achievements, schemes, policies and welfare measures, advertisements are released in dailies, journals and electronic media. Advertisements on tenders for development and other works are also published by this Department.

The advertisement wing of the Information and Public Relations Department functions as the nodal agency for the release of all the advertisements of the Government Departments, Boards, Universities and Government undertakings in the dailies and journals.

Advertisements are released based on the content of the advertisement, the region it is intended for and to whom it is addressed.

#### **TENDER ADVERTISEMENTS**

Tender advertisements are also released in the Government website in **www.tenders.tn.gov. in** through the National Informatics Centre. If required, tender forms can be downloaded free of cost. The tender advertisements are released in newspapers and also uploaded in the Government website which can be downloaded free of cost, ensuring transparency in Government administration. This facilitates the participation of all the eligible persons in Government tenders without any partiality.

#### **TENDER BULLETINS**

Based on the policy that the general public should be aware of all the Government activities in a transparent manner, the Districts/State Tender Bulletins are released every week under the provisions of the Tamil Nadu Transparency in Tenders Act, 1998 and the Tamil Nadu Transparency in Tender Rules 2000 framed there under.

Rs.10 lakh to Rs.25 lakh Procurement Estimates and Rs.25 lakh to Rs.50 lakh Works Estimates are released in Districts Tender Bulletins. Procurement estimates above Rs.25 lakh and works estimates above Rs.50 lakh are released in State Tender Bulletin.

Decisions taken on the tenders are also published in these bulletins.

# FILM AWARDS, SUBSIDY & SMALL SCREEN AWARDS

#### **FILM AWARDS**

Tamil Cinema is a powerful medium that reflects Tamil culture and its manifold wonders. To encourage the Tamil film industry to produce films that reflect social thought and human values, the Government of Tamil Nadu presents Film Awards to the best Tamil feature films, best actors, best actresses and technicians.

A committee to select these best feature films, best artists and technicians has been constituted by the Government.

The best films selected by this committee are given a cash prize of Rs.2 lakh for the first prize, Rs.1 lakh for the second prize,Rs.75,000/- for the third prize and Rs.75,000/- for the special prize. Along with cash prizes, mementos and certificates are also given.

Another special prize comprising a cash award of Rs.1.25 lakh along with a memento and a certificate is awarded to a Tamil film which portrays women in eminently positive roles.

A five sovereign gold medal, a memento and a certificate are given to the best actor, best actress, best actor (special prize), best actress (special prize), best villain actor, best comedy actor, best comedy actress, best character actor, best character actress, best director, best screen play writer, best dialogue writer, best music director, best lyricist, best play back singer (Male), best play back singer (Female), best cinematographer, best sound recordist, best film editor, best art director, best stunt master, best dance master, best make-up artiste, best costume designer, best child artiste, best dubbing artiste (male) and best dubbing artiste (female).

A Government Order has been issued for the presentation of awards to the best feature film, actor, actress and technicians for the years 2009 to 2014. These awards will be presented at a function in the presence of the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu to be held shortly.

The committee headed by retired Judge Justice
Thiru P.Kalaiarasan after viewing the films

received for the year 2015 have submitted their recommendations.

#### **VETERAN AWARDS**

Veteran Awards are presented by Tamil Nadu Government in the name of Arignar Anna, who left his unique imprint on Tamil culture through his writing, stage acting and film scripts; Kalaivanar N.S.Krishnan, who made people think through his humour; 'Ezhisai Mannar' Thyagaraja Bhagavathar, who attracted the masses with his hypnotic voice; Raja Sandow who was dynamic and multifaceted; Makkal Thilagam M.G.R. who won people's heart; Nadigar Thilagam Sivaji Ganesan who attained the peak in acting; Kaviarasu Kannadasan who penned immortal songs and Thanga Tharagai Amma J Jayalalithaa, who toiled for the welfare of the poor. Each of the award winner is presented with a 5 sovereign gold medal and a memento.

#### **GOVERNMENT FILM SUBSIDY**

To encourage producers of low budget, quality films with social commitment, the Tamil Nadu Government is implementing a scheme to provide subsidy to such films. A selection committee has been set up by the Government to select such films and every selected film is granted a subsidy of Rs.7 lakh.

Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu Thiru. Edappadi K.Palaniswami gave away cheques amounting to Rs.10.43 crore as subsidy to 149 Tamil film producers at Rs.7 lakh each to such quality films produced and released between 2007 and 2014 at a function held at the Secretariat on 20.06.2018.

#### **SMALL SCREEN AWARDS**

The Tamil Nadu Government is presenting small screen awards to television serials viz. best mega serials, short serials, actors, actresses and technicians of small screen which have a mega impact in entertaining housewives.

For the best mega serial, a cash prize of Rs.2 lakh for the first prize and a cash prize of Rs.1 lakh for the second prize are given along with a memento and a certificate. Besides, 3 sovereign gold medal, a memento and a certificate are

presented every year to the best story writer, best screen play writer, best dialogue writer, best director, best cinematographer, best editor, best hero, best heroine, best character actor, best character actress, best villain actor, best villain actress, best child artiste, best music director, best dubbing artist (male and female separately) and best special effects technician.

Cash award of Rs.1 lakh, a memento and a certificate are given to the best achiever of the year and best lifetime achiever.

To select the best serials, best artistes, and to give cash prize, mementos and certificates for serials telecast between the years 2009 and 2013, a Government Order has been issued. These awards will be presented by the Hon'ble Chief Minister, at a function to be held shortly.

### SUBSIDY FOR INDIAN CINEMA CENTENARY FUNCTION AND INTERNATIONAL FILM FESTIVAL

To bring laurels to the film industry, Hon'ble Puratchi Thalaivi Amma, on behalf of Tamil Nadu Government, for the first time in India, granted Rs.10 crore as subsidy to the South Indian Film Chamber of Commerce for organizing a function to celebrate the centenary of Indian cinema. The function was held from 21.09.2013 to 24.09.2013.

The Tamil Nadu Government gave Rs.4 crore as subsidy for International Film Festivals held in Chennai on various occasions.

Financial Assistance of Rs.10 lakh was given on behalf of the Government for conducting 12th India International Film Festival organised by National Film Development Corporation in Goa.

#### **CINE WORKERS WELFARE BOARD**

For the welfare of workers, technicians and their family members of Tamil Nadu Film and Television Industries, the Tamil Nadu Government has created Cine Workers Welfare Board to provide various assistance to them. Several welfare assistance are provided to the beneficiaries on behalf of the Cine Workers Welfare Board.

Workers and Technicians of 39 associations of the Tamil Nadu Film and Television Industries are eligible for membership of the Tamil Nadu Cine Workers Welfare Board. Till date 21,611 members have enrolled.

Members of film and television industries are provided with financial assistance under various categories viz., educational assistance, marriage assistance, maternity assistance, abortion assistance, spectacles assistance, assistance for death due to accident, assistance for natural death, funeral assistance, etc. The details are as follows:

#### **NEWS COVERAGE**

All functions participated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Hon'ble Deputy Chief Minister, Hon'ble Ministers and VIPs and other government functions are covered, videographed, edited and converted into news magazines. These news magazines are produced by the Tamil Nadu Films Division and screened in public places for the benefit of the public as a part of the field publicity.

## NEWS MAGAZINES / DOCUMENTARIES / SHORT FILMS AND JINGLES

From the year 2016 onwards, Tamil Nadu Films Division has produced 59 video news magazines, documentaries, short films and 32 jingles on the government schemes and released them in all digital theatres of Tamil Nadu. Moreover, programmes of the Hon'ble Chief Minister have been compiled and sent as video clippings to government and private TV channels through the Media Centre in the Secretariat.

#### **WEEKLY NEWS BULLETINS**

All the functions of Hon'ble Chief Minister are covered by this Division and are compiled every week as news bulletins. These weekly news bulletins are sent to all the 32 District Public Relations Offices, Tamil Nadu Arasu Cable TV Corporation, all the Collectorates in the state to be telecast through LED TVs to create awareness among people as a part of field publicity work.

#### **VIDEO NEWS MAGAZINES**

The major function of the Tamil Nadu Films Division is to prepare news magazines on various welfare schemes of the Government, its announcements and developmental works and release them through the Digital Cinema theatres. The Division also uploads the development works of the Government in Compact Discs and sends them to all District Public Relations Offices to be telecast through LED vans in places, where people gather in large numbers as a part of the field work.

Utilizing the latest state of the art technology, the news magazines are also uploaded in LED Screens and telecast in all government offices, Amma Canteens, thereby creating public awareness about various welfare schemes of the Government.

# M.G.R. GOVERNMENT FILM AND TELEVISION INSTITUTE

M.G.R. Government Film and Television Institute is an advanced Technical Training Institute imparting Film technology and techniques of Film Production and aesthetics of Art. The objective of this institute is to teach students the technical aspects of producing films and television programmes and also to teach allied subjects of film making.

This institute functions on an area of 15.25 acres. MGR Government Film and Television Institute functioning under the Department of Information and Public Relations is one among the three major institutes in India. The other two are Film and Television Institute of India, Pune, and Satyajit Ray Film and Television Institute, Kolkatta.

#### **DEGREE COURSES**

As ordered by the former Hon'ble Chief Minister Amma, the Diploma Courses offered by this Institute with the approval of the All India Council for Technical Education (AICTE), New Delhi were upgraded as four years Degree Course from the Academic Year 2016-2017 as Bachelor of Visual Arts, with affiliation to Tamil Nadu Music and Fine Arts University.

The Diploma in Film Technology provided by this institute till April, 2018 will hereafter provide Bachelor of Visual Arts. The following are the 6 degree courses taught in the institute.

- Bachelor of Visual Arts (Cinematography)
- Bachelor of Visual Arts (Digital Intermediate)
- Bachelor of Visual Arts (Audiography)
- Bachelor of Visual Arts (Direction and Screenplay Writing)
- Bachelor of Visual Arts (Film Editing)
- Bachelor of Visual Arts (Animation and Visual Effects)

14 students are admitted in each of these courses. Tuition fees of Rs.15,000/-, Special fees of Rs.2,000/- and Development fees of Rs.1,000/- are collected from the students. SC/ST students are exempted from tuition fees.

### ANNUAL BUDGET ALLOTMENT

The Government has allocated Rs.7.91 crore for the Financial Year 2019-2020 to meet out the expenses of the institution.

# FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR FILMS PRODUCED BY STUDENTS

The Government have raised the amount for the production of Students Documentary Films from Rs.15,000/- to Rs.50,000 from the financial year 2017-2018. Final year students from different branches form 14 units and each unit is trained to produce one short film.

### **SHORT FILM AWARD**

The students of MGR Government Film and Television Institute are presented with MGR Government Film and Television Institute students award" which consists of One Sovereign Gold Medal, Cash Award of Rs.5,000/- and a Memento to the Best Director, Best Cinematographer, Best Editor, Best Sound Recordist and Best Film Processor for their short films.

### **BRICS FILM AWARD**

In the Brics film festival that took place at New Delhi in 2016, short films of students of the Institute, "Raani", "Kanaa", "The last leaf", "Sheeps vanished in the herd", were screened.

### **AMMA AWARD**

"Amma Award" (Citation and Cash Prize of Rs.10,000/-) is being awarded for the best Short Film of MGR Government Film and Television Institute Students in the Chennai International Film Festival. In the 15th International Film Festival in 2017-2018, the short film "Daisy" and in the 16th International Film Festival, the short film "Angelina" won the Amma Award.

# TRAINING ON PAR WITH PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS

Training is imparted with the latest equipment and accessories of film industry at an annual allocation of Rs.150 Lakh by hiring the latest equipment in order to keep pace with the changing technology in the film industry.

# CINEMA, VIDEO AND CABLE TELEVISION NETWORKS

Cinema is one among the popular entertainments, easily accessible to all classes of General public. The Government have been providing encouragement for the overall growth of the film industry. In Tamil Nadu 977 Cinema Theatres are functioning under the following categories:-

To regulate the cinema Industry, the Government of Tamil Nadu had enacted the Tamil Nadu Cinemas (Regulation) Act, 1955. As per the provisions made in the Act, all the District Collectors except Chennai and in respect of Chennai, the Commissioner of Police are designated as competent authority for granting No Objection Certificate to construct

cinema theatres and to issue licence for screening of movies in cinema houses. The Joint Commissioner, Commissionarate of Land Administration and the Government in Home Department are the appellate and revisional authorities respectively as per the Act. In order to streamline the cinema Industry and also to ensure the availability of basic amenities, safety and comfort of the public visiting the cinema houses and also to provide hygienic environment in cinema houses, the Government have framed stringent guidelines in the Tamil Nadu Cinema (Regulation) Rules, 1957. The Government fixes the rate of admission under these Rules.

Accordingly, by considering the request of Tamil Film Producers' Council and the Tamil Nadu Cinema Theatre Owners' Federation, the Government, in their Order (Ms.) No.762, Home (Cinema) Department, dated 16.10.2017, have revised the maximum and minimum rates of admission to the theatres in A.C. and Non-A.C. category for Multiplexes and Theatres in Municipal Corporations/Municipalities/Town Panchayats and Village Panchayats.

### **CABLE TELEVISION NETWORK SYSTEM**

The Cable Television Network (Regulation) Act, 1995 (7 of 1995), regulates the Cable Television Network all over India. Under the above said Act. District Magistrates, Sub-Divisional Magistrates and Commissioner of Police are designated as Authorised Officers to take action against offending Cable Operators for contravening sections 3, 4A, 5, 6, 8 & 9 (or) 10 of the Act. Accordingly, the Government of Tamil Nadu notified the Commissioners of Police in respect of Chennai, Trichy, Tirunelveli, Madurai, Salem and Coimbatore Cities, the Collectors of the District concerned in respect of other areas and the Sub-Divisional Officers in their respective local limits of Police jurisdiction as Authorised Officers to take action against violators of the provisions of the Cable Television Networks (Regulation) Act, 1995. Further, the Government have issued instructions to all the District Collectors, Commissioners of Police and Superintendents of Police to take stringent action against the violators of the provisions of the Act.

### **VIDEO ACT AND RULES**

The Tamil Nadu Exhibition of Films on Television Screen through Video Cassette Recorders and Cable Television Network (Regulation) Act, 1984, regulates the exhibition of films on television screen through Video Cassette Recorder (VCR) in the State. This Act provides for the grant of licence to the individuals for exhibition of films on television screen through Video Cassette Recorder (VCR) and for running Video Libraries. The respective District Collectors/Commissioner of Police, Chennai are the Licensing Authorities.

# THE INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHT ENFORCEMENT CELL

The Intellectual Property Right Enforcement Cell, Crime Branch, C.I.D., Tamil Nadu is functioning under the direct control of the Additional Director General of Police (Crime), Chennai. He is assisted by 1 Superintendent of Police and 1 Deputy Superintendent of Police at the State level. There

are twelve units functioning in the State namely, Chennai (2), St. Thomas Mount (1), Vellore (1), Salem (1), Coimbatore (1), Trichy (1), Cuddalore (1), Madurai (1), Dindigul (1), Virudhunagar (1) and Tirunelveli (1). Each Unit consists of 1 Inspector of Police, 1 Sub-Inspector of Police and 6 Grade-I Police Constables. In respect of Chennai Units (2 Units), Unit-1 consists of 1 Inspector of Police, 2 Sub-Inspectors of Police, 8 Grade-I Police Constables, 2 Grade-II Police Constables and Unit-2 consists of 1 Inspector of Police, 2 Sub-Inspectors of Police, 8 Grade-I Police Constables. The service of this cell is also being utilized to check the violations relating to the Copy Right Act, 1957 and Information Technology Act, 2000. The details of cases registered, number of accused arrested and the value of properties seized etc., by the Intellectual Property Right Enforcement Cell from the year 2004 to 2019 are as follows:-

Apart from this, the offenders are also booked under the Goondas Act (Tamil Nadu Act 14/1982). During 2018-2019, 1 person was detained under the Goondas Act for offences relating to Video Piracy.

### **TAMILARASU**

Tamilarasu is a monthly magazine being published on behalf of the Department of Information Public Relations both in English and Tamil. Tamilarasu magazine, as a print medium, publishes the policies, activities, schemes and people's welfare schemes being implemented for the welfare of the poor.

Speeches of Hon'ble Tamil Nadu Governor, speeches and announcements of the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Hon'ble Deputy Chief Minister and Ministers, Achievements of the Government of Tamil Nadu, welfare schemes and their implementation, Government welfare assistance, detailed write ups on development schemes in the Districts and success stories of the beneficiaries are published in Tamilarasu magazine.

Articles on women's welfare, healthcare, medicine, blood donation, AIDS awareness, Government schemes, Tamil literature, short stories and poems are also published every month in Tamilarasu. Every month more than 36,000 copies of Tamilarasu (Tamil) and more than 2,500 copies of Tamilarasu (English) are printed.

The cost of single copy of the Tamil / English issue is Rs.20/-. The Annual subscriptions are Rs.240/-. The life subscriptions (10 years) for Tamil and English editions are Rs.2,000/- and Rs.2,400/-respectively.

### **ONLINE SUBSCRIPTION**

People from various walks of life like Government employees, politicians and readers visiting government libraries read Tamilarasu. Students preparing for Tamil Nadu Public Service Commission's competitive examinations visit the Tamilarasu office to buy copies. As the number of subscribers are increasing, and to facilitate easy renewal of subscription, a website was launched in April 2018 **www.tamilarasu.org** and provisions have been made for easy enrolment for subscription and renewal of old subscriptions.

### **SPECIAL PUBLICATIONS**

Special Publications containing speeches of Hon'ble Chief Minister, both in Tamil and English, are published and sent to the Information Public Relations Officers in the Districts for distribution to the public free of cost. Apart from this, biographies of leaders, thiyagis and other great personalities, posters, pamphlets, Mini Telephone directory, invitation cards for Government functions and brochures on the developmental activities are also printed in Tamilarasu Press. Further, applications and forms relating to other sections of this Department are also printed here.

### **BOUQUET OF ACHIEVEMENTS**

Department-wise Achievements of the Government under the leadership of Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu Thiru. Edappadi K.Palaniswami in 100 days were compiled and printed under the caption "Maanbumigu Puratchi Thalaivi Amma Avargalathu Vazhiyil Nilaiyana Aatchi - Niranthara Valarchi", and one year achievements and two years achievements were printed as special publications.

Ten Government exhibitions are organised in Tamil Nadu every year. They are organised in the district headquarters of Madurai, Coimbatore, Salem, Vellore, Tirunelveli and Tiruchirappalli and in four other districts on rotation basis.

From February 2011 to March 2019, 71 Government exhibitions have been conducted and a revenue of Rs.13,98,83,000/- has been earned.

### **PRIVATE EXHIBITIONS**

Private exhibitions conducted by private individuals solely for commercial purposes were streamlined by framing rules and regulations for the benefit of visiting public. Permission for conducting private exhibitions in the districts is given by the Information and Public Relations Department based on the recommendations from the District Collector.

# ANNUAL FLOWER FESTIVAL IN NEW DELHI (PHOOL WALON KI SAIRE)

Every year this Department represents Government of Tamil Nadu in the Annual Flower Festival (Phool Walon – ki – Saire) organized in New Delhi for the promotion of National Integration and Religious Harmony. It is noteworthy that Tamil Nadu bagged the first prize in the flower festivals held during the past eight years continuously.

### REPUBLIC DAY PAGEANTRY PROCESSION

One of the tasks of the Information and Public Relations Department is to participate in the pageantry of floats at the Republic Day Celebrations in Chennai and New Delhi every year, and also to co-ordinate the procession of the pageantry of floats in the Republic Day celebrations in Chennai.

During the Republic Day celebrations in Chennai, the float of Information Public Relations Department bagged the first prize in 2012 and 2019, second prize in the years 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016 and third prize in 2017 and 2018.

In the current year 2019, during the Republic Day celebrations, the float of Tamil Nadu depicted the radical change of attire by Mahatma Gandhi which happened in 1921 at Madurai. The team accompanying the float performing the dance form of "Karagattam" received tremendous appreciation from the viewers and bagged the first prize bringing laurels to Tamil Nadu State.

# ALL INDIA TOURIST AND INDUSTRIAL TRADE FAIR, CHENNAI

This Department participates in the All India Tourist and Industrial Trade Fair (Island Ground) at Chennai every year and puts up a separate stall showcasing the policies, activities and achievements of the Government with photographs and models to educate and create awareness among the visiting public.

# INDIA INTERNATIONAL TRADE FAIR, NEW DELHI

This Department also participates every year in India International Trade Fair, New Delhi displaying the policies, activities and achievements of the State Government.

It also creates a marketing opportunity to the products by the women Self Help Groups. It gives scope for employment opportunities to public.

During the year 2018, it is noteworthy to mention that Tamil Nadu Pavilion was awarded the best pavilion certificate.

# MINI EXHIBITIONS AT PANCHAYAT UNION LEVEL

A sum of Rs.38.50 lakh has been sanctioned to conduct mini exhibitions in 385 Panchayat Unions (with Rs.10,000/- per Panchayat Union) in 31 districts of Tamil Nadu except Chennai so as to create awareness on welfare schemes, achievements and activities of the Government among the people. Mini exhibitions are being conducted continuously from the Financial Year 2011-2012.

### **PHOTO EXHIBITIONS**

Photo Exhibitions are being conducted in all Districts during festivals and Government functions to create awareness on Government Welfare schemes to the public.

As ordered by the Government, Photo Exhibitions are being conducted in all 32 districts in Tamil Nadu, from the Financial Year 2011-2012.

# DISTRICT INFORMATION AND PUBLIC RELATIONS OFFICES

The District Information and Public Relations Offices in all the District Head Quarters of Tamil Nadu form a vital part of the Information and Public Relations Department. The District Information and Public Relations Offices functioning in the collectorates in all the district headquarters take the Government's schemes and developmental works to all parts of the district.

Creating awarness about the welfare schemes, achievements of the Government, new announcements to the people are promptly carried out by all District PROs, APRO (I) and APRO (P). They also carry out works relating to field publicity through newspapers, media, LED van shows and photo exhibitions.

The offices of the Public Relations Officers in Districts make arrangements for the functions of the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Hon'ble Deputy Chief Minister and Ministers. They also arrange press meets, press tour for covering Government functions and publicise Government schemes through

Tamil Nadu Arasu Cable TV. They also organize multi-media exhibitions and maintenance of memorials of leaders and work to create awareness about people welfare schemes and achievements of the Government.

### **INFORMATION CENTRES**

Information Centres are functioning efficiently in Chennai, Madurai, Tiruchirappalli, Thanjavur, Coimbatore and New Delhi under the Information and Public Relations Department.

Books on language and literature, history and science etc., along with newspapers and periodicals are made available in these Information Centres for the use of the public. These Information centres are used on a large scale by research scholars, teachers and students of schools and colleges.

### **CHENNAI - STATE INFORMATION CENTRE**

The State Information Centre which was functioning in Kalaivanar Arangam in the Omanthurar Government Estate, Chennai was shifted due to the construction of new building for Kalaivanar Arangam to Mahakavi Bharathiar Illam in Triplicane, Chennai in the year 2009 and started functioning from 14.12.2009. Having understood the importance of the State Information Centre, the Hon'ble former Chief Minister Puratchi Thalaivi Amma ordered the construction of a new building at a cost of Rs.2.58 crore near the new Kalaivanar Arangam in the Omandurar Government Estate and declared it open on 14.02.2016.

The Information Centre has a library and functions from 10 am to 5.45 pm. About 60,200 books on various subjects such as Tamil language and literature, history, biographies of leaders, children's books, science, political science, spiritual books etc., are available here. In the reading room of the State Information Centre, Tamil and English daily newspapers and periodicals are kept for the

benefit of the public. Publications of Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly, publications of Stationery and Printing department are also compiled and given for reference to the Government.

Students in large numbers visit the Information Centre to take notes for participating in Essay writing competitions and oratorical competitions. This Centre also provides books for reference to the students who are preparing for competitive examinations.

Two years of back publications like magazines and periodicals are preserved for the use of Government and research scholars.

### **MODERNISATION OF LIBRARY**

To benefit the large number of college students and public, modernisation of the library has been carried out with an allocation of Rs.3.60 lakh during 2018-2019 by installation of Photo Copier, Book racks, latest computer with internet and with the required software for easy retrieval of books.

### **REGISTRATION OF BOOKS**

The Director of Information and Public Relations is the Registrar of Books as per the Newspapers and Books Registration Act, 1867. Two copies of all the books published every year are received from publishers and registered in this office.

### **CONCLUSION**

The Hon'ble former Chief Minister Puratchi Thalaivi Amma following her massive victory in 2011 General Elections for Legislative Assembly Constituencies also won the 2016 Elections with people's support and formed the Government.

Though the Hon'ble former Chief Minister Puratchi Thalaivi Amma had departed, she has left behind her blessings for continuance of good Government for several hundred years.
