HON.SPEAKER THIRU.P. DHANAPAL SPEECH – VISIT OF HON. SPEAKER OF KANAGAWA PREFECTURAL ASSEMBLY,MR. HIDEAKI TAKEUCHI

Hon'ble Speaker and

Members, Kanagawa Prefectural Assembly,

Dear Officers from the Assembly and

Consulate - General of Japan at Chennai.

Secretary, Tamil Nadu Legislative Assembly.

On behalf of our Hon'ble Chief Minister Puratchi Thalaivi Amma, I welcome you all to the glorious and ancient land of the Tamils and I hope that your visit to our State and the capital city, Chennai has been enriching and interesting, offering you a hands-on experience on the dynamics of this State.

I have visited Japan during 1981 and it is indeed a pleasure having you all here. Human dignity, freedom, democracy, equality, the rule of law, respect for others, selflessness, discipline and respect for human rights are the core values of the Japan.

I read that Japan has a total of 7,000 islands and about 73 percent of Japan is forested, mountainous, unsuitable for agricultural, industrial, or residential use. I came to know that Japan consists of 47 prefectures. I am happy to note that the

Japan is the third largest national economy country in the world and India stands fourth place.

I wish to take this opportunity to provide you a bird's eye view of our State, its Legislature and the developmental measures announced by our Hon'ble Chief Minister.

The State of Tamil Nadu enjoys a tropical climate and is endowed with all kinds of natural wealth, talented manpower and is populated by warm and friendly people.

Tamil Nadu is the eleventh largest state in India by area and the seventh most populous state. The population as per the latest census is about 72 million with a literacy rate of 80%. It is the fourth largest contributor to India's GDP. Tamil Nadu is also the most urbanised state in India. The state has the highest number of business enterprises and stands second in total employment in India. Tamil Nadu is ranked first in the number of factories and industrial workers and ranked third in terms of investment and net value addition.

Tamil Nadu has several places of tourist interest and has eight UNESCO World Heritage Sites including Mammalapuram.

Tamil is one of the oldest classical languages and we have had several enlightened scholars like Thiruvalluvar, Avvaiyar and Kambar.

The State under the dynamic and able leadership of Hon'ble Chief Minister, very popularly and fondly referred by the people as Puratchi Thalaivi Amma, is haven of peace where people belonging to all religions, races and linguistic groups live in complete harmony and brotherhood.

The Tamil Nadu Legislature is situated within Fort. St. George which was established by the English East India Company in April 1640 due to efforts of Francis Day and Andrew Cogan. The Assembly Chamber was built in 1911 during the time of Sir Arthur Lawley, then Governor of Madras. It has a beautiful and stately appearance overlooking the sea,

with the portraits of important visionaries and leaders adorning the walls inside.

The St. Mary's Church within this Fort built in 1680 is the oldest Anglican Church in India. Sir Robert Clive and Yelihu Yale were married here.

After India's independence in 1947, the first elections under the new Constitution were held in 1952 and the first House was constituted on 1st March 1952. The present 14th Assembly was constituted on 14th May 2011. In the 2011 elections, the AIADMK-led alliance, headed by **Hon. Puratchi Thalaivi Amma**, had a landslide victory winning 203 Constituencies out of 234 and the Ruling AIADMK Party on its own had captured 150 seats and formed the Government. The House has 19 women members and 3 of them are in the Cabinet. Coming 30th we are going to celebrate the Diamond Jubilee Celebration of the Assembly.

The Hon'ble Chief Minister is a five-time Member of the Assembly serving since 1989. Our Hon'ble Chief Minister was the first woman to be a Leader of the Opposition in the Assembly in 1989 and was the first elected woman Chief Minister of the State and the first woman to serve as Chief Minister thrice. Hon'ble Chief Minister has also served as a Member of the Rajya Sabha from 1984 to 1989.

Right from the 1950s, the State had pioneered and shown the way in different ways, namely in education, health, nutrition, family welfare, social security and rural development. Traditionally our State is strong in the fields of engineering, automobiles, textiles, cotton, leather products etc...

I hope that you would have had a very good interaction with our **Hon'ble Minister for Industries** today. I, therefore, do not propose to take much of your time by explaining in detail. I will just outline a few welfare measures being implemented by our Hon'ble Chief Minister.

The supply of rice under Public Distribution System cost benefiting 1.83 crore families, enhancing the Social Security Pension to Rs. 1,000 benefiting 23.95 lakh elderly and destitute persons, distribution of mixies, grinders and fans to women without cost, provision of marriage assistance to poor girls, cash compensation to fishermen during the fishing ban period, construction of 60,000 solar powered green houses for the poor, provision of solar powered street lights, construction of one lakh concrete houses in cyclone ravaged districts, poverty reduction measures, continuance of agriculturists, implementation electricity for Comprehensive Health Insurance Scheme, issue of one lakh house site ownership documents, distribution of milch cows, goats and sheep to the rural poor without cost are some of the noteworthy schemes. A total sum of Rs.30,331 crores, nearly 30% of the total budget, has been allotted this year for social security net and welfare schemes.

Our Hon'ble Chief Minister Puratchi Thalaivi Amma had announced number of innovative schemes, such as, the Cradle baby scheme, Girl child protection scheme, All Women Police Stations, All Women Commando Force, which are first of its kind.

With a view to improving the green cover, the Government has launched a massive programme for planting 64 lakh tree saplings at a cost of Rs.29.44 crores.

Our Hon'ble Chief Minister had taken relief measures on war-footing when the people affected by natural calamities such as, Tsunami, Thane Cyclone and recent Nilam Cyclone.

Our beloved leader **Hon. Amma** has touched each and every facet of the people's lives through a number of innovative and far-sighted schemes and has displayed indomitable will to ensure strict implementation of whatever has been promised. Tamil Nadu will soon be the number one State in the country. I am running out of time, but still

there is an endless list of achievements that stand to Hon. Chief Minister's credit.

Last but not the least, the Hon'ble Chief Minister had released the "Tamil Nadu Vision 2023" Document, which envisages a total investment of Rs. 15 lakh crores and aspires for a six fold growth in per-capita income over the next 10 years and aims at inclusive growth, making the State poverty free. Tamil Nadu will have the best infrastructure facilities in all vital sectors as well as the highest Human Development Index ranking in India. The fruits of this vision will be there for you to see when you visit Tamil Nadu the next time. I again welcome you to Tamil Nadu.

I hope that your stay in Chennai is a pleasant one. I am sure that your visit to India and our State would help social ties between the Japan and India.

With these few words, I conclude my speech, looking forward for an interesting interaction with you.
