The Economic Times dated 2.2.2016, carried an article entitled "TN Response to Flood Was Slow, Says Central Report". This report has been picked up by other media subsequently without verifying the veracity of the claims made by the reporter of the Economic Times. The article in the Economic Times claims that an analysis by the Union Ministry of Earth Sciences has revealed that floods in the city were because of "poor drainage systems and overflow of dam water, not only because of excessive rains". The article also states that the study of the floods by a group of scientists and officials has said that the flood could have been avoided if the disaster response of Tamil Nadu had been as quick as Odisha or Gujarat. The article quotes a senior official of the Ministry of Earth Sciences stating "We gather flooding in Chennai was because an overflowing water body had been let open and the drainage system of the city was not equipped to handle the water flow" etc.

The Ministry of Earth Sciences vide its letter D.O.No. MoES/ATMOS-OBS/XII-IMD/2012, dated 3.2.2016 has categorically clarified that no such report exists as claimed to have been prepared by the Ministry on recent Tamil Nadu floods as mentioned in the Economic Times article published on 2.2.2016. The letter states that the Ministry fully

is appended.
