

PRESS RELEASE

The Election Commission of India has announced Special Summary Revision of Photo Electoral Rolls with reference to 01.01.2022 as the qualifying date as per the following schedule.

Sl. No.	Activity	Period
1.	Publication of Integrated draft Electoral Roll	01.11.2021 (Monday)
2.	Period for filing claims & objections	01.11.2021 (Monday) to 30.11.2021 (Tuesday)
3.	Disposal of claims and objections	20.12.2021 (Monday)
4.	Final publication of Electoral Roll	05.01.2022 (Wednesday)

2. During the claims and objection period i.e. from 01.11.2021 to 30.11.2021 of Special Summary Revision, 2022 an elector or an eligible citizen who wants to get enrolled or wants to make deletion/correction/transposition in existing entry may submit form 6,7,8 or 8A to:

- (i) Booth Level Officer or Electoral Registration Officer / Assistant Electoral Registration Officers office on any working day
- (ii) Booth Level Officers on Special Campaign Days at the respective Polling Stations (Dates of Special Campaign will be intimated later)
- (iii) The Designated Officer at the designated location on any working day during the Summary Revision claims and objections period.

3. For inclusion, proof of address and age should be submitted along with the Form. For proof of residence copy of any one of the following documents viz., Passport/Driving License/ Ration Card/ Latest Water/ Telephone/ Electricity/Gas connection bill/ Bank/ Kisan/Post Office current Pass Book may be submitted. Copy of Birth Certificate or School Leaving Certificate may be submitted as proof of age. Proof of age is compulsory for applicants below 25 years of age. **Online filing is also possible by going to the website www.nvsp.in and VOTER HELP LINE Mobile App.**

4. Persons who will be completing 18 years of age on 01.01.2022 and the persons whose names are not included in the Electoral Rolls can apply for inclusion. Applicants should compulsorily fill in the 'Declaration' column of Forms submitted by them.

5. If the name of the Elector is already in Roll, but he/she has lost/misplaced the EPIC, then he/she may apply any time in the Taluk Office/Zonal Office in Form 001.

6. For inclusion of Indian citizens living abroad, Form 6A should be submitted directly to the Electoral Registration Officer concerned or sent by post to the Electoral Registration Officer. If Form 6A is submitted in person before the Electoral Registration Officer, the application should be accompanied by a photo copy of the relevant pages of the passport containing the photograph and all other particulars of the applicant and the page containing the valid visa endorsement. The original passport will be verified by the Electoral Registration Officer and returned immediately after verification. If the Form 6A is sent by post, it should be accompanied by a photocopy of the passport duly self-attested.
