Following Delimitation of Constituencies, the Electoral Rolls were re-aligned and published as draft rolls in the Special Summary Revision taken up as mid-year exercise. The draft publication was done from July 16 to July 24 and the (extended) time for filing of claims and objections (in the designated centres) is up to August 20.

- Separately, the Booth Level Officers are undertaking 100% Field Verification by visiting house to house to identify the surplus and missing names in the electoral roll so as to take action for deletion or inclusion of the names so identified, as the case may be.
- 3. The political parties may also be canvassing applications for enrolment in the case of missing names. They are requested to ensure that the work is carried out in a fair manner [so that there is no deletion of name of any eligible person who is 'ordinarily resident' in the area, and no inclusion of any person not eligible / not 'ordinarily resident' in the area.]
- 4. In order to facilitate the people to file their claims at the designated centres, 17th of August has been declared as a Special Campaign Day. [Earlier, 2nd and 3rd of August were declared as 'Special Campaign' Days but the response was not very encouraging.]
- The electoral rolls will be displayed in the Special Grama Sabha meetings on 15th August. The Grama Sabhas can prepare a list of missing names and furnish to the ERO/ AERO/ BLO.
