During this COVID-19 Pandemic period, this Government under the leadership of Hon'ble Chief Minister has taken austerity measures and the administrative costs were reduced considerably, but money on development schemes such as Special Area Development Programme has been given its full share. Hence, an amount of Rs.75 crores has been allocated for implementation of SADP for the year 2020-21.

For the year 2020-21, during XII (2nd Round) SLEC meeting, about **113 projects for a total cost of Rs.3065.179 Lakhs** were taken up for screening during the meeting. The Hon'ble Vice Chairman, SDPC mentioned that Hon'ble Chief Minister who is also the Chairman of SDPC has been giving more emphasis on health projects especially during COVID period and for the first time in SADP Health department has been included and for this year 16 projects for Rs. 13.6 crores has been sanctioned under SADP to address the health issues. The Hon'ble Vice Chairman, SDPC mentioned that it is the vision of the Hon'ble Chief

Minister that the poor and down trodden people should be benefitted at large and SADP projects should be accordingly sanctioned to benefit the community at large.

The major schemes recommended during the meeting are Health Infrastructure and equipment, Afforestation, Drinking Water & Drainage, Man Animal Conflict, Soil and Water Conservation works.

A 'Dashboard' exclusively for SADP is used for processing and appraisal of SADP proposals online. **Web Monitoring System** has also been established for the effective and quick monitoring of the projects for Special Area Development Programme.
