JOINT STATE-LEVEL PAINTING COMPETITION ON ENERGY & WATER CONSERVATION ORGANIZED BY POWERGRID AND CGWB

Among these entries, the 50 best paintings each were selected from the painting competitions by an Expert Committee, comprising renowned persons in the field of Arts/Drawing and Officials from Education Department, and were called for participating in the State Level Painting Competition on **Energy Conservation** at Chennai.

Further, more than **1.6 lakhs school students** participated in the Painting Competition on Water Conservation at School Level and nearly **6000 entries** were received from more than **3000** Schools from various parts of Tamil Nadu. Among these entries, the 50 best paintings each were selected from the painting competitions by an Expert Committee, comprising renowned persons in the field of Arts/Drawing and Officials from Education Department, and were called for participating in the State Level Painting Competition on **Water Conservation** at Chennai.

The Joint State Level Painting Competitions were conducted at "Vivekananda Auditorium", Anna University, Guindy Chennai in the forenoon on 14.11.2010. There was an exemplary response from the participants of both the competitions and their parents & guardians.

Hon'ble Minister for Information, Govt. of Tamil Nadu, Shri Parithi Ellamvazhuthi will preside over the Valedictory function and has kindly consented to give away the cash prize to the winners of this State Level Painting Competition on Energy Conservation.
