G20 Mega Beach Clean-up organised in Tamil Nadu Press Release

G20 nations are actively engaged in beach cleaning activities through standardized protocols, awareness campaigns, and international cooperation to prevent and reduce beach litter. To emphasize the urgency of preventing and

managing marine litter, several G20 countries have joined the mega beach cleaning drive on the same day, attracting global attention to this crucial issue. The Group of Twenty (G20) comprises 19 countries and the European Union. According to the 'G20 Action Plan on Marine Litter,' G20 nations are committed to waste reduction, reuse, and recycling.

In Tamil Nadu, the event is being organized by the Tamil Nadu Pollution Control Board, in coordination with the Department of Environment and Climate Change, Government of Tamil Nadu, the District Administration, and the National Centre for Sustainable Coastal Management (NCSCM). The event will see the enthusiastic participation of students from schools and colleges, NGOs, volunteers, and the local public.

The Hon'ble Minister for Health & Family Welfare Thiru Ma.Subramanian, Hon'ble Minister for Environment and Climate Change Thiru Siva. V. Meyyanathan, Volunteers and Officials will participate in the clean-up drive tomorrow. A pledge on "Clean Beaches and Coastal Protection" will be taken to underscore the commitment towards preserving the coastline.

Additionally, the event will showcase captivating Sand Art, Posters on Marine Biodiversity of Tamil Nadu, and the artwork of winners from a drawing competition held at the school level.

Participants will collect waste along the designated stretches of beaches, which will be subsequently deposited in collection

bins provided at the locations. The collected beach litter will be segregated and handed over to the respective Local Bodies for proper disposal.
