Nilekani (Cofounder and Chairman of Infosys Board), Erik Solheim (6<sup>th</sup> Executive Director, United Nations Environment Programme, Former Under Secretary General), Dr. Ramesh Ramachandran (Founder Director of National Centre for Sustainable Coastal Management), G. Sundarrajan (Co-ordinatorPoovulaginNanbargal) and Tmt. Nirmala Raja (Chairperson, RAMCO Community Services).

The Chief Secretary to the Government of Tamil Nadu, the Vice Chairman, Tamil Nadu State Planning Commission and Senior Secretaries of the Department of Industries, Municipal Administration, Finance, Energy, Rural Development, Housing, Animal Husbandry & Fisheries and Agriculture & Farmers Welfare are members of the Governing Council.
