Tamilnadu Pollution Control Board is continuously monitoring all the Health care Facilities

(HCFs) and the Common Biomedical Waste Treatment and Disposal Facilities (CBMWTFs)

for effective implementation of the Biomedical Waste Management Rules, 2016 as amended

in 2018.

TNPCB is also initiating action against the HCFs and the CBMWTFs such as issue of

Directions for closure and stoppage of power supply and levy of Environmental

Compensation, if found violating the BMWM Rules, 2016 as amended.

However, recently, it is noticed that, frequent complaints are being received and news are

being published in the Newspapers regarding the dumping of the biomedical waste such as

the discarded and the expired medicines.

As per the BMWM Rules, 2016, the Bio-medical waste generated in households such as

expired medicines, broken mercury thermometers, used needles and syringes and

contaminated gauge, etc., during healthcare activities shall be segregated as per these rules

and handed over in separate bags or containers to municipal waste collectors.

Further, the distributors/ stockist of the medicines shall hand over the expired/ discarded

medicines to the manufacturers or shall dispose scientifically as per the BMWM Rules, 2016.

No waste shall go unauthorized or mixed with any other solid waste. In case of violation,

stringent action will be initiated by the local bodies against the violators.

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
