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PREFACE

Agriculture is the backbone of our nation and the economic growth of a country depends on the development of villages. Agriculture is the key to poverty alleviation and development of rural areas. Agriculture is sacrosanct to 40% of the population mainly less endowed rural people of Tamilnadu and it is deeply rooted to the cultural diversity of the people.

Agriculture which played a pivotal role in the overall development and economy of the state over the eons, has its share declining in the economy whilst the secondary and tertiary sectors share is on upward trend. Nevertheless, the importance of agriculture cannot be overlooked as it serves as a main plank for food and nutritional security of the state besides playing a supportive role to the secondary and tertiary sectors. However, the advancement of agriculture has been stymied by various innate and extraneous factors which have become serious threats to food security.

Government of Tamilnadu which is according highest priority to agriculture sector has brought in various path breaking initiatives such as **farm level interventions** through computer based Farm Crop Management System (FCMS), Integrated Farming System, Crop Diversification, Technologies such as System of Rice Intensification, Improved Pulses Production Technologies at farm level as a whole village concept, Sustainable Sugarcane Initiatives, Precision Farming, Micro Irrigation, etc., to usher in **Second Green Revolution** besides planning and implementing multitude of schemes for doubling the production and productivity of agricultural crops and tripling the income of the farmers.

Government which is always very much concerned about the welfare of the farming community has brought out a compendium on the welfare schemes implemented by the Agriculture Department as "CITIZEN CHARTER" to enlighten the farmers about the assistance extended under various schemes. I request the farmers and other stakeholders to best utilize this Citizen Charter and avail all benefits.


